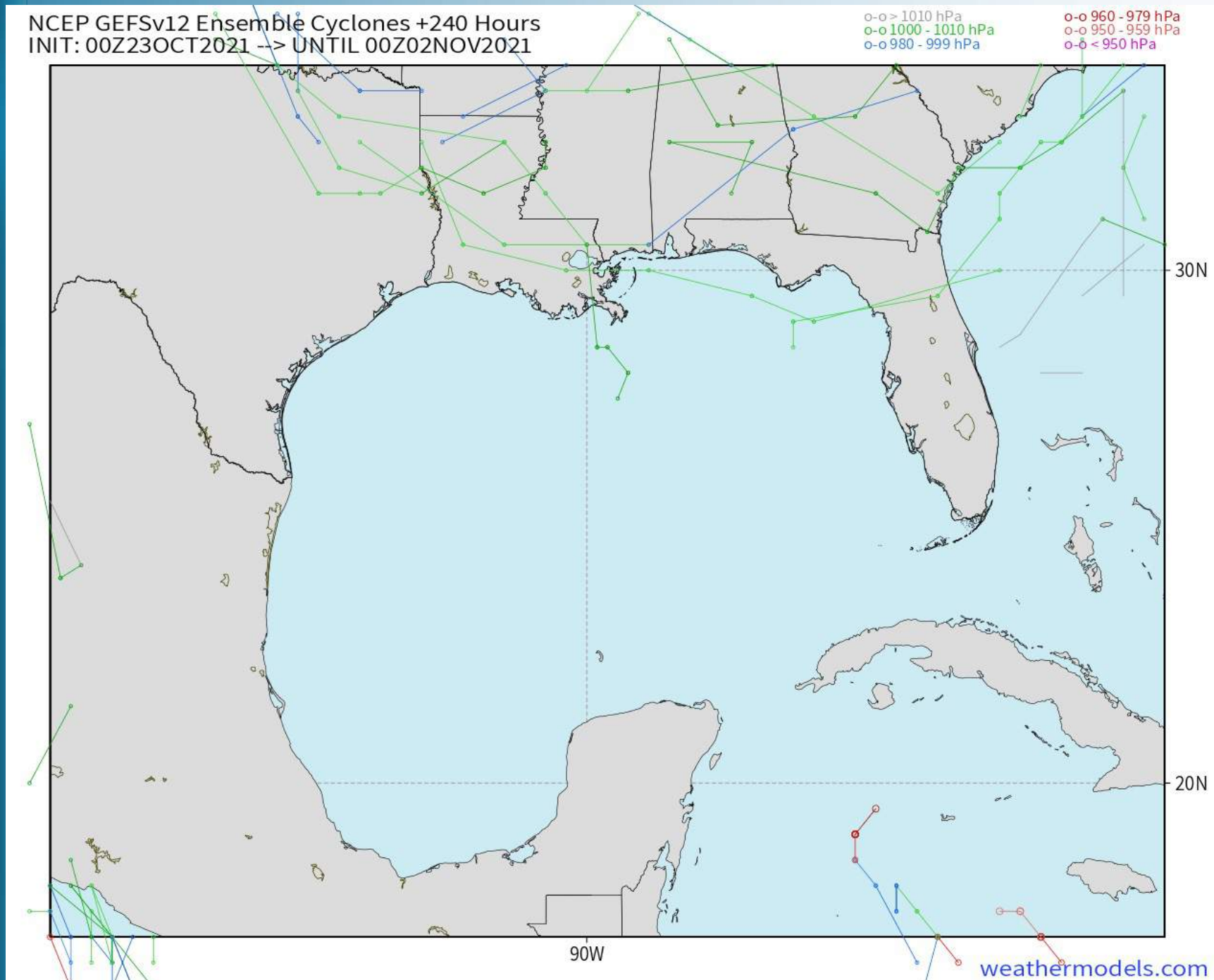

GEFS Ensemble 10-days Tracks

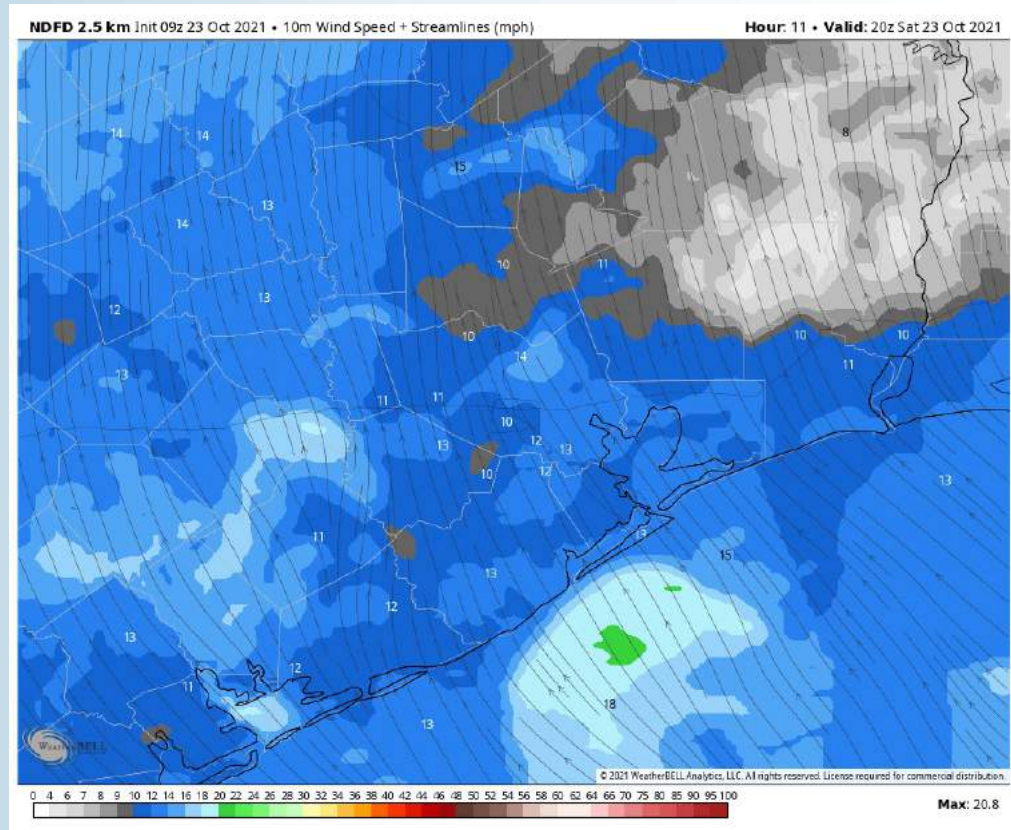


- We continue to favor the Gulf to remain quiet at least for the next 7-10 days.

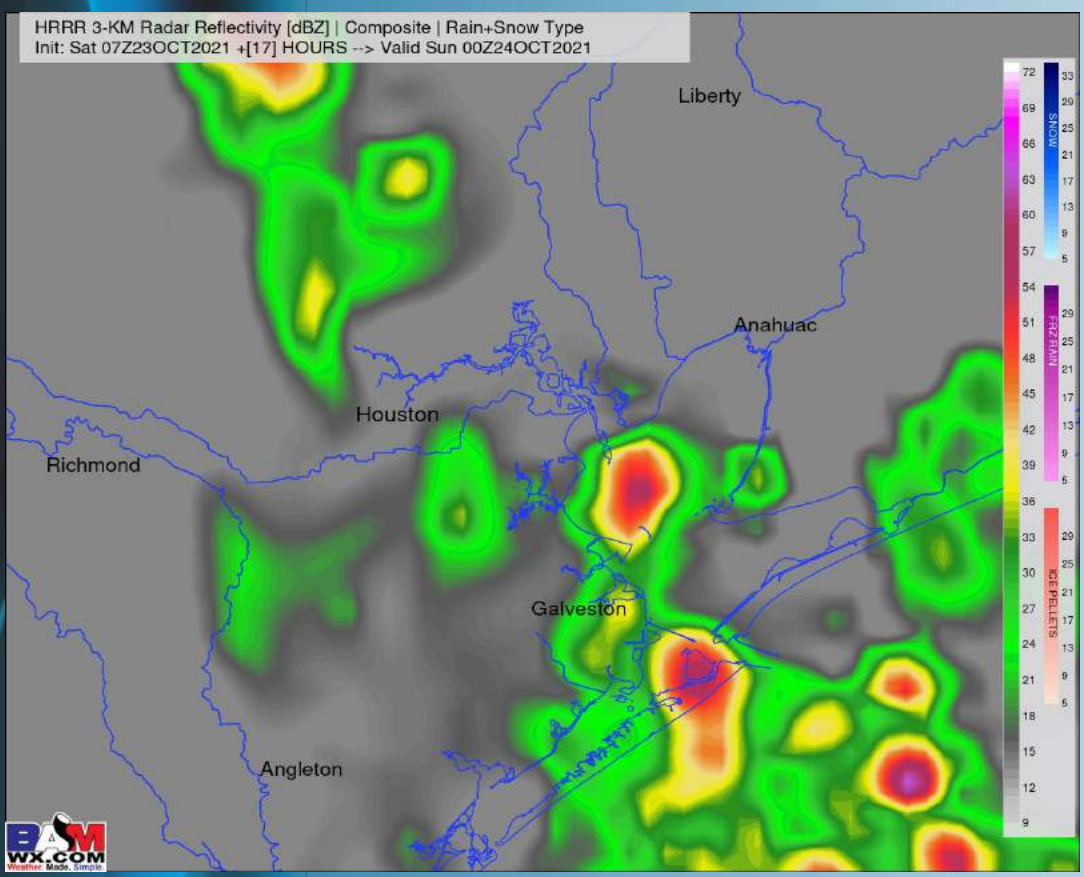
Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Scattered chances for showers and possible thunderstorms after noon through the 10PM timeframe (~30 - 40% chances). Best chances look to be in the 6 PM – 9 PM timeframe. Localized heavier downpours and lightning will be possible with any of these cells.
- Winds Saturday increase to 8 – 13 MPH sustained into the afternoon of today, picking up closer to 13-18 MPH at the boarding station after sundown into the early morning hours of SUN. Gusts around 20 – 25 MPH will be possible, especially after sundown (locally stronger gusts cant be ruled out under storms). Winds generally coming out of the SSE for Sat.
- Saturday is looking to be another day with highs in the low to mid 80s.
- **Fog anticipated to stay north of our stations this AM.**

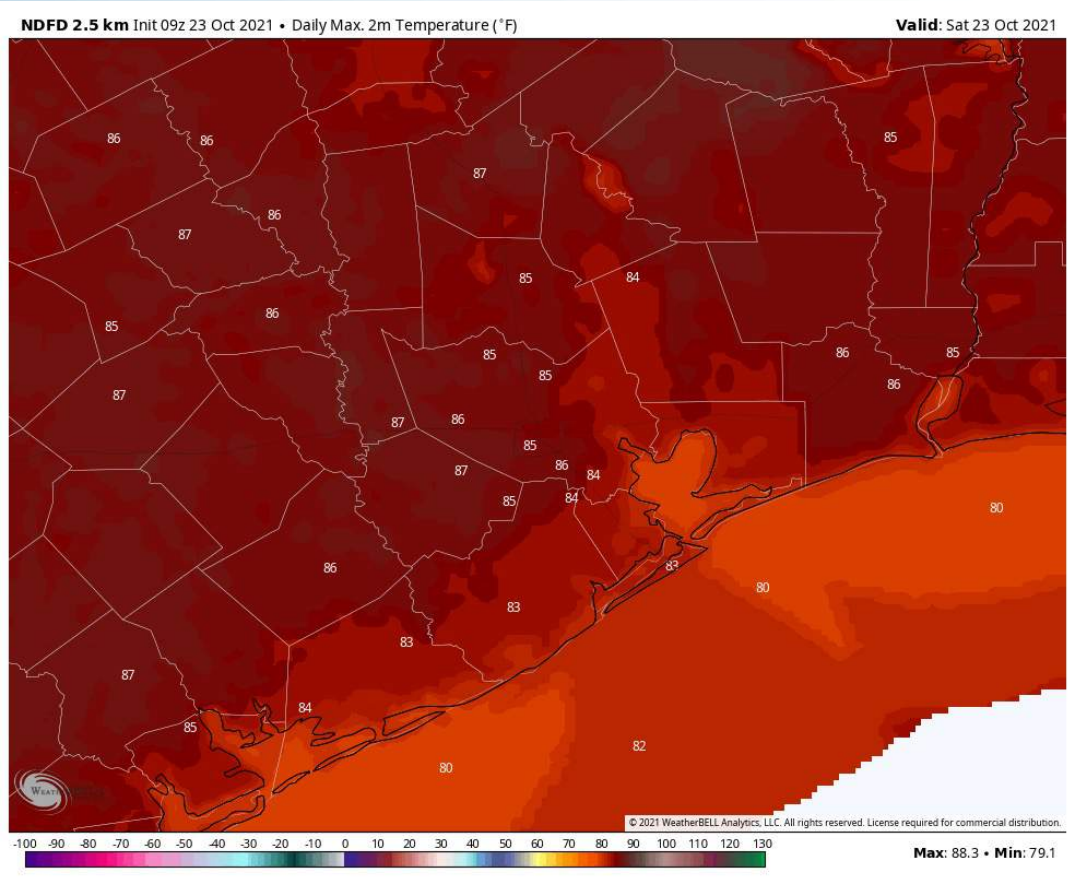
Sustained Winds (3 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (7 PM CT)



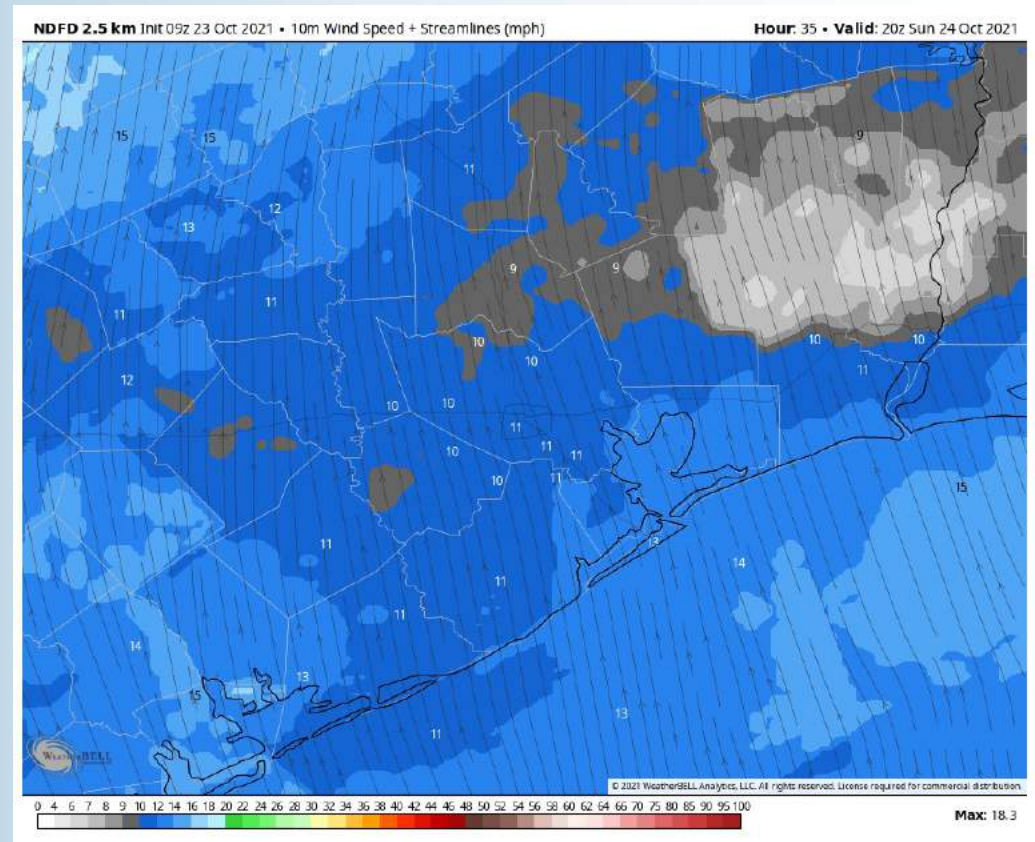
High Temps Saturday



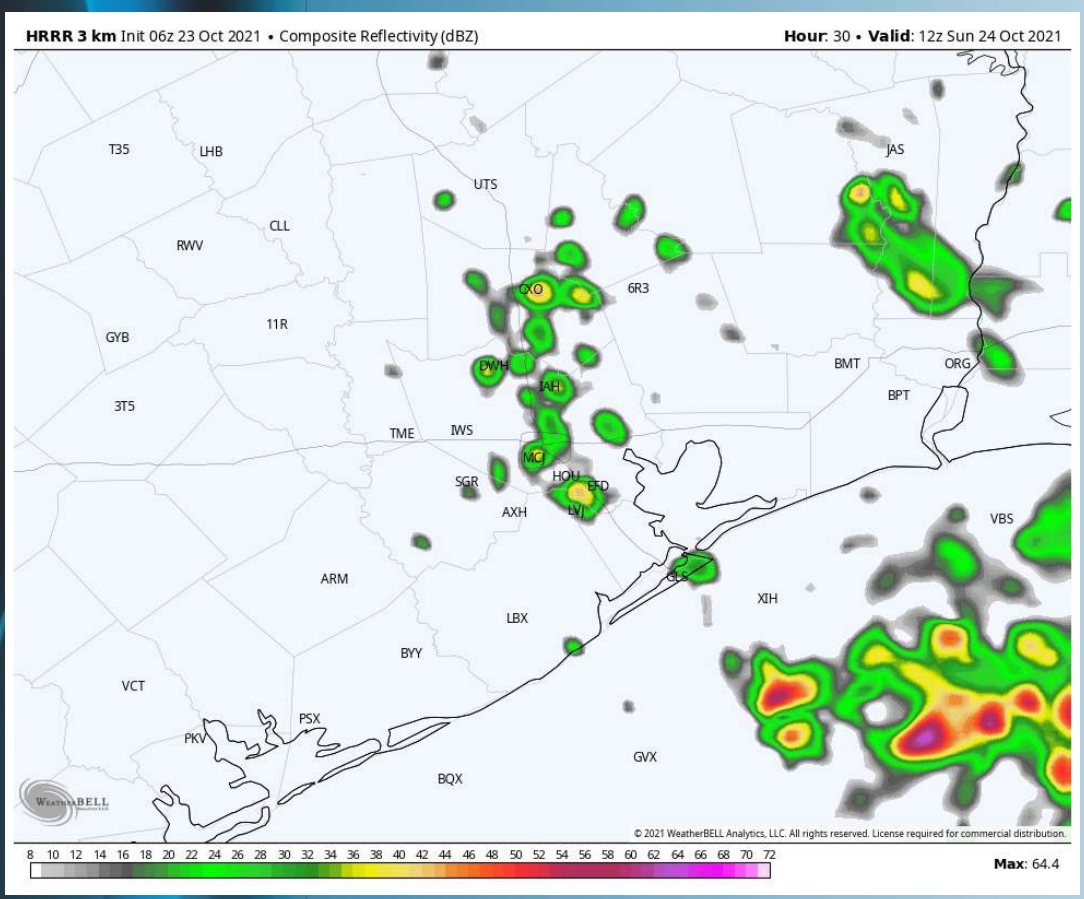
Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- A few scattered showers/ storms will be possible throughout the morning hours of tomorrow becoming more isolated into the afternoon. Plenty of drier hours are expected into Sunday afternoon.
- Winds will slowly start to calm down throughout the morning becoming sustained around 8 – 13 MPH in the afternoon with gusts around 20 MPH possible. Winds will from the SSE throughout the day.
- High Temps look to get into the low-to-mid 80's F.
- **Not expecting fog Sunday.**

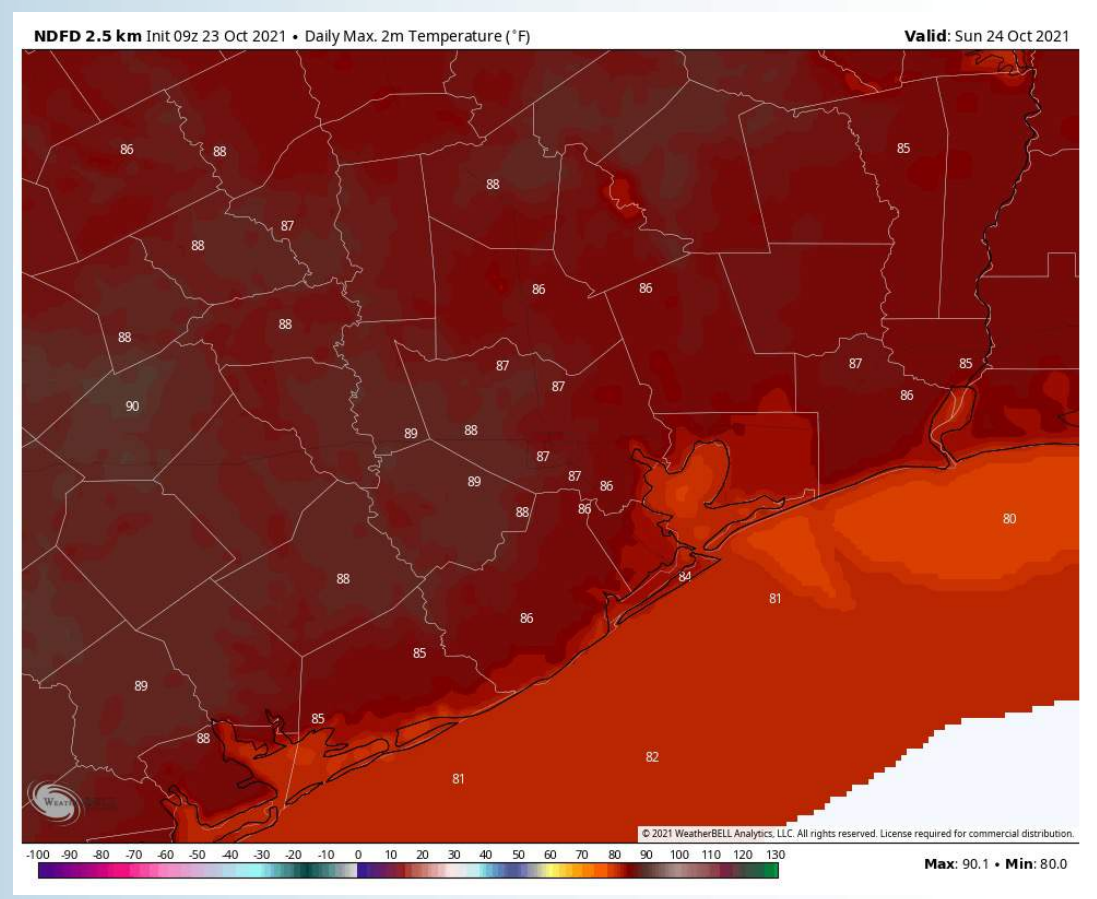
Sustained Winds (3 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (7 AM CT)



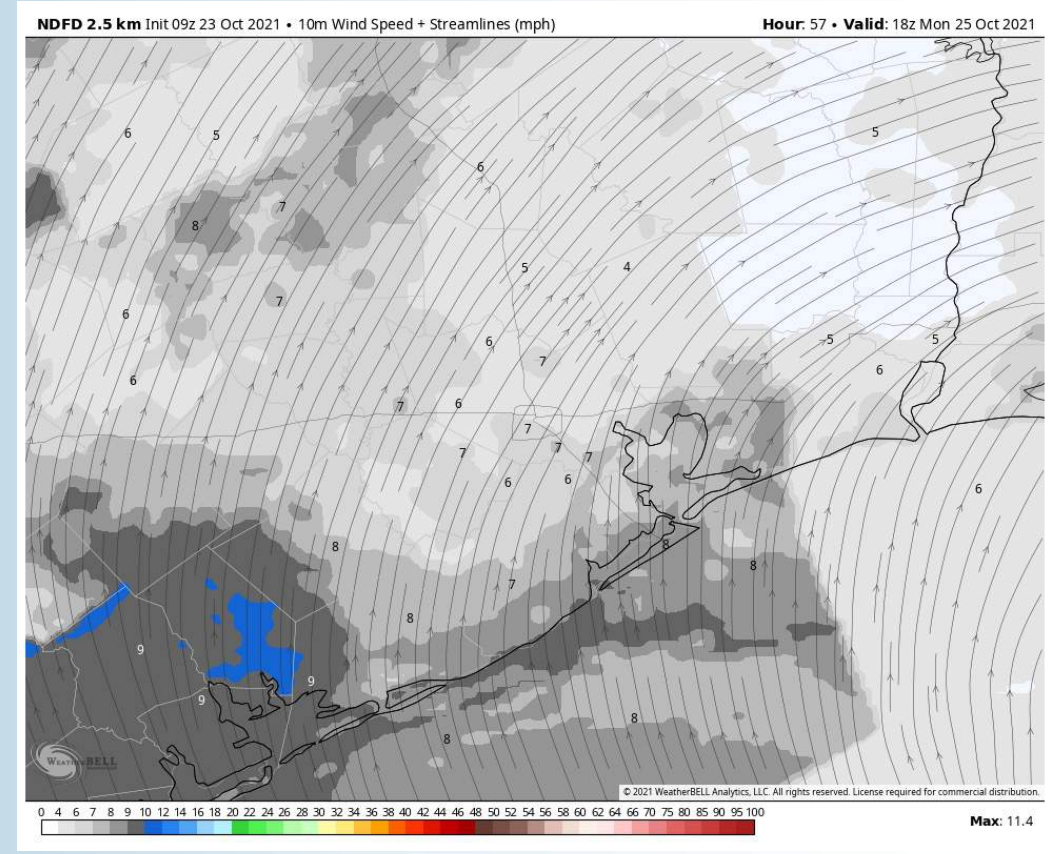
High Temps Sunday



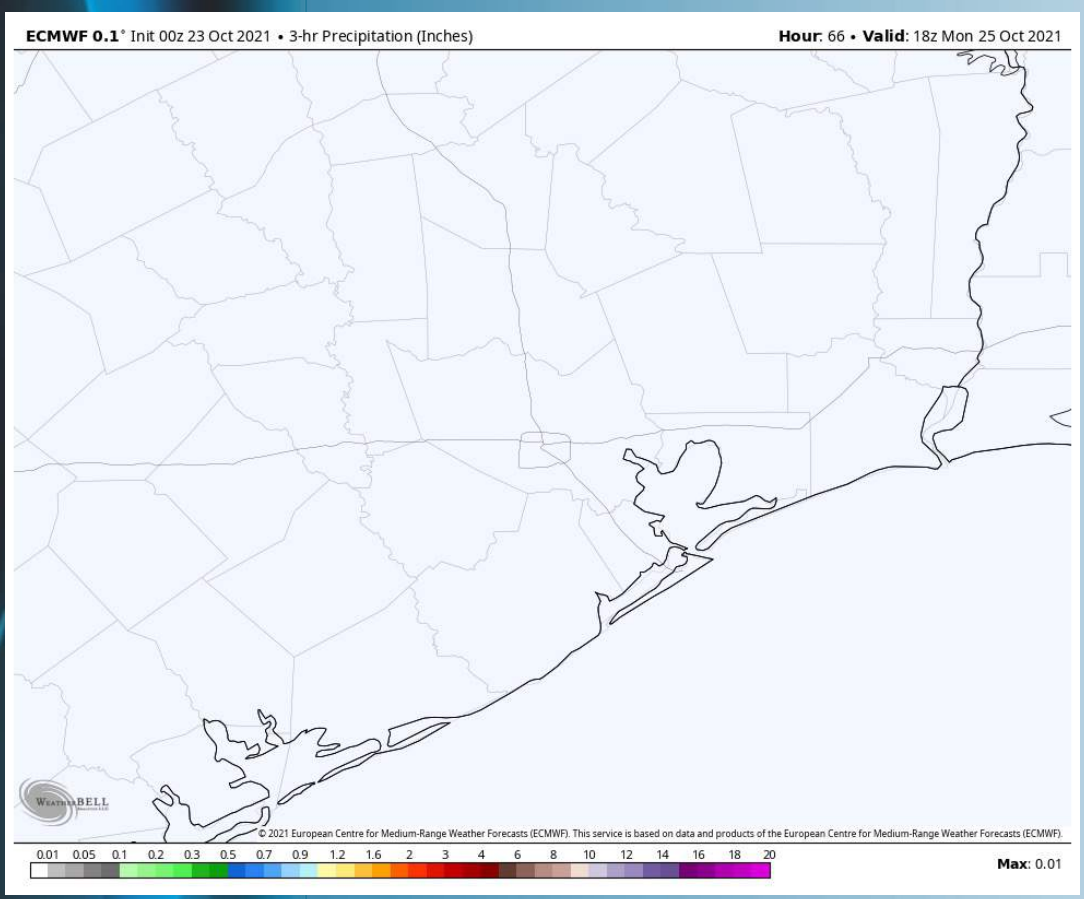
Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Dry day is anticipated for Monday.
- Winds may be a bit variable in direction on Monday with a general lean towards out of the south. Winds will be lighter Monday as well, sustained around 5 – 10 MPH
- High Temperatures look to get into the low-to-mid 80's F.
- **Its not impossible for potential fog formation on Monday morning but not enough signals to say with certainty. This will need fine tuned in later forecast updates.**

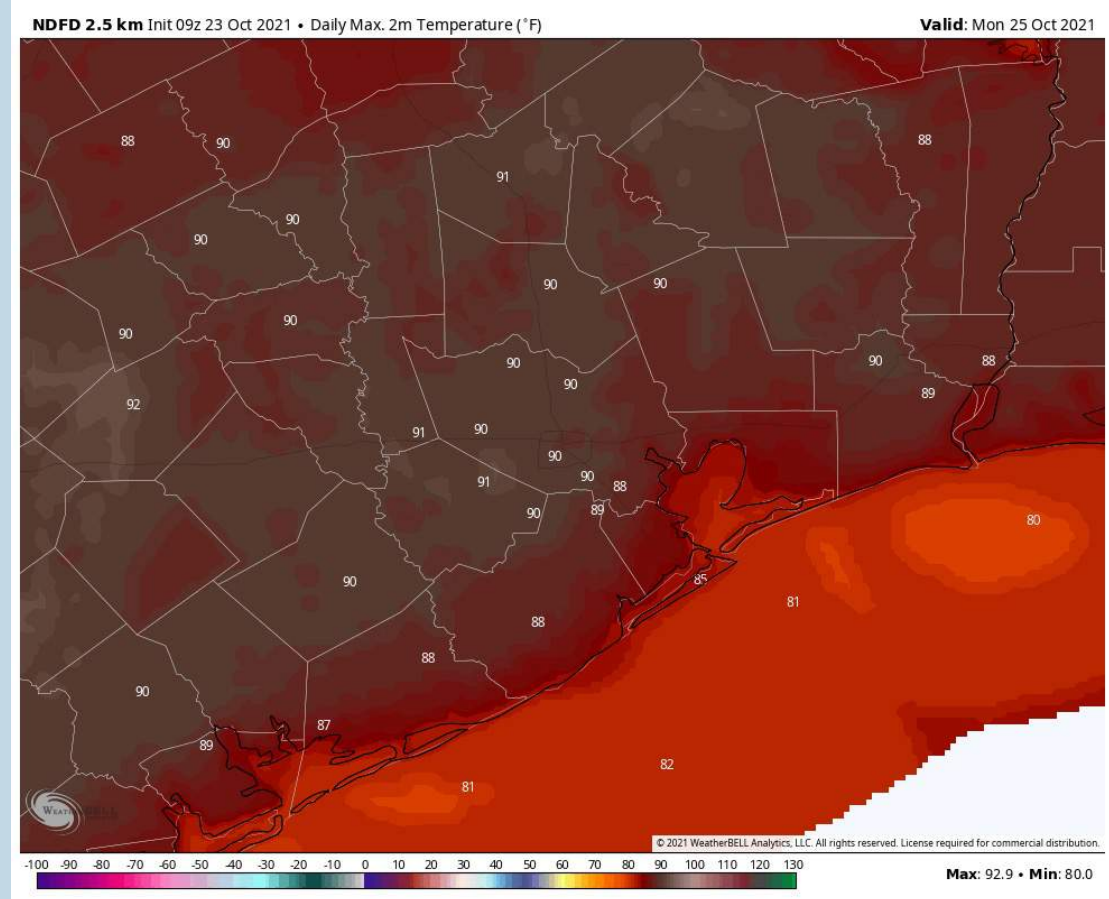
Sustained Winds (1 PM CT)

High Temps Monday

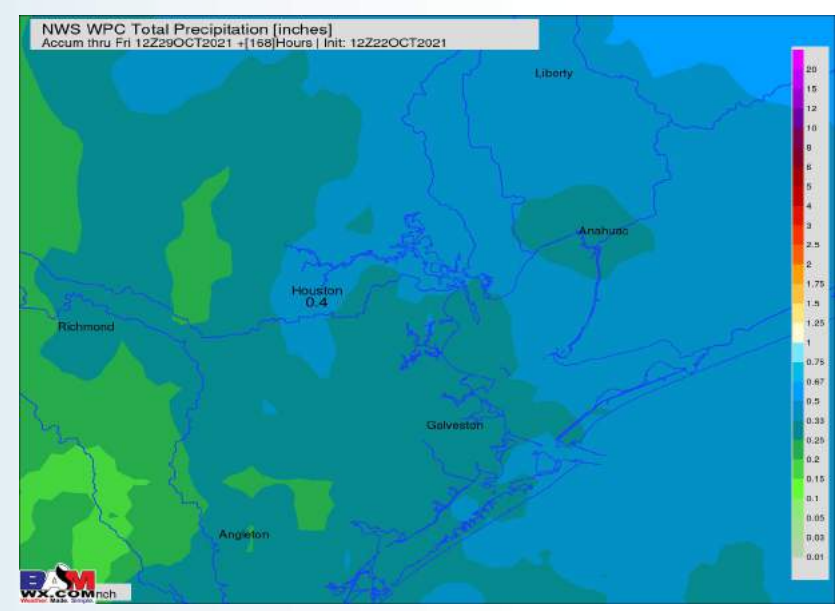
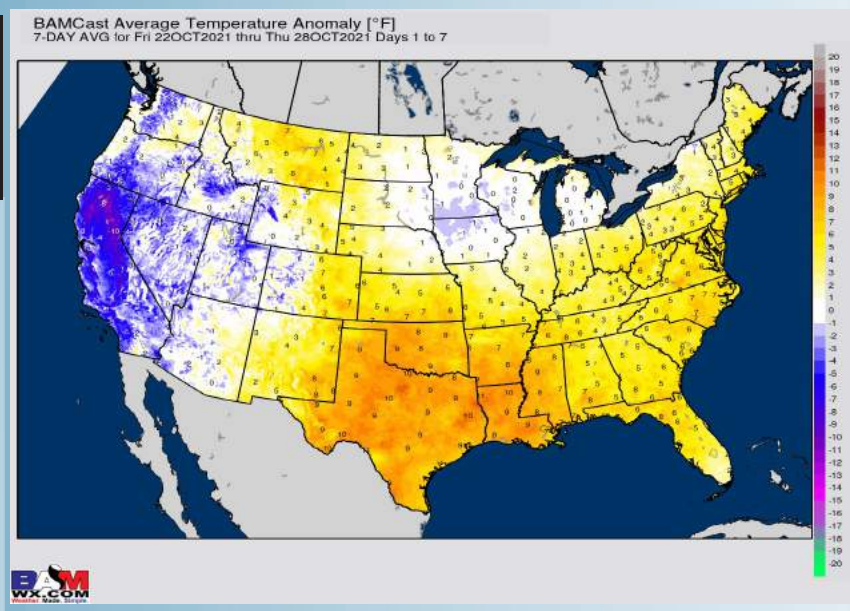


Long-Range Forecast Discussion

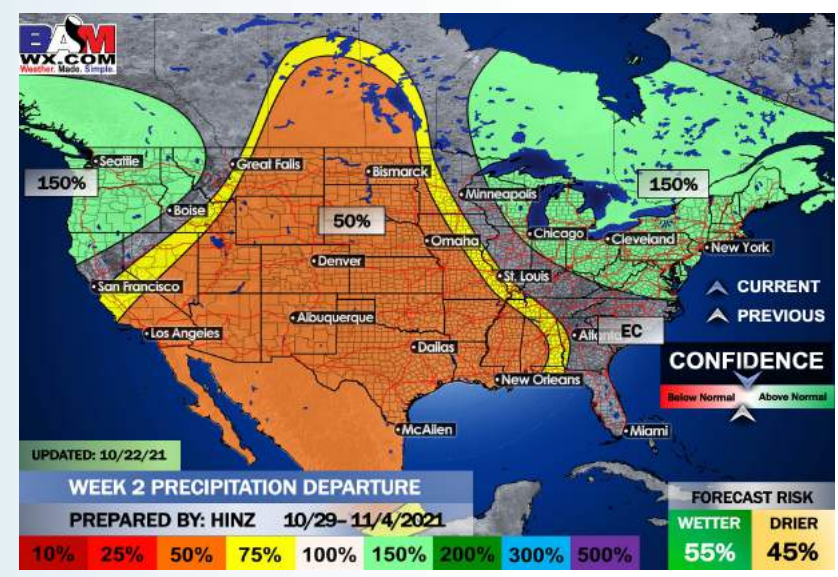
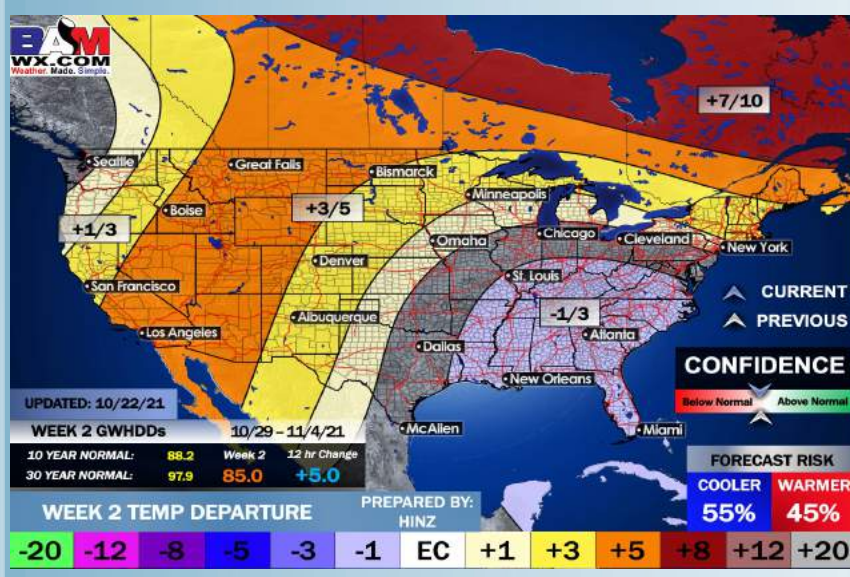
- Temps look to average out much above normal the next 7 days. A few chances for scattered showers/thunderstorms will be possible this weekend going into mid next week.
- The week 2 timeframe is expected to have near normal to slightly below average temps with below average risks for precip. Not eyeing a specific threat for a tropical storm or hurricane at this distance.

- Right now, we have risks for about average temps and below average precip for the first half of November. Tropical risks are on the lower side, but not a threat that should be 100% eliminated.
