

EPS Ensemble 10-days Tracks




- We continue to favor the Gulf to remain quiet at least for the next 7-10 days.


Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- A few isolated showers/thunderstorms around the area will continue to be possible early this AM (~20-30%), however, the bulk of the precip comes with the passing of the front in the 9-11 AM window (closer to ~9 AM for Northern stations, closer to ~11 for boarding station). Moderate to heavy rainfall can be anticipated as the front pushes through, as well as lightning and strong winds. Strong winds will be the main threat here.
- Currently sustained winds 18-23 MPH can be expected for the boarding station until the front pushes through. As the front moves through, sustained winds flip from SW to NW and will be closer to 20-30 MPH sustained with gusts 30-40 MPH possible. After the front passes, winds may lull for 1-2 hours, but elevated winds look to continue for the rest of the day at 15-25 MPH sustained, 25-35 MPH gusts possible at the boarding station through nighttime.
 - High temps sit in the low 80s.
- **Not expecting fog today, however, reduced visibility will be possible under heavier rainfall with the front.**


Sustained Winds (4 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (10 AM CT)




High Temps Wednesday




Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Dry conditions are anticipated Thursday for our stations.
- Winds look to be elevated again for Thu. Sustained winds 20-30 MPH for the boarding station in the AM, closer to 30-40 MPH for the PM hours. Gusts 30-40 MPH in the AM, 40-50 MPH gusts in the PM possible for the boarding station. Winds coming out of the NW for Thursday.
- High temps sit in the mid 70s for Thursday.
 - **No fog expected for our stations.**


Sustained Winds (5 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (12 PM CT)




High Temps Thursday




Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Anticipating a dry day for our stations on Friday.
- Winds will **slowly** die down Thursday night into Friday AM, but will still remain elevated. By daybreak, sustained winds 20-30 MPH for the boarding station for much of the day, gusts 30-40MPH. Sustained winds 18-23 MPH for our other stations and gusts 25-30 MPH closer to downtown Hou/610 bridge. Winds continue out of the NW for Fri and then will weaken once again Friday after sundown.
- High temps look to be in the low 70s.
- **Fog is not expected for Friday.**


Sustained Winds (12 PM CT)

High Temps Friday





Long-Range Forecast Discussion

- Temps look to average out normal to slightly above normal the next 7 days. After tomorrow's Wed front brings showers and thunderstorms, expecting an overall drier week.



- The week 2 timeframe is expected to have near normal to slightly above normal temps with slightly above average risks for precip. Not eyeing a specific threat for a tropical storm or hurricane at this distance.

- Right now, we have risks for about average temps and below average precip for the first half of November. Tropical risks are on the lower side, but not a threat that should be 100% eliminated.
