

ECMWF EPS 10-days Tracks




- We continue to favor the Gulf to remain quiet at least for the next 7-10 days. Current tropical activity is expected to stay confined to the Atlantic.


Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- No precipitation is anticipated as dry air filters in.
- Winds look to be out of the N (slight fluctuations to NNW & NNE will be possible) for most of the day. Sustained winds 8-13 MPH expected for much of the day (closer to 5-10 MPH for the northerly half of our stations). Gusts 13-18 MPH possible ~10 AM – 6 PM at the boarding station.
- High temperatures look to get into the mid 80's F.
- *No fog favored for our stations today.*


Sustained Winds (2 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (1 PM CT)




High Temperatures Today




Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Tuesday looks to continue the dry conditions.
- Winds look to continue out of the NNW for Tuesday. Sustained 5-10 MPH with gusts up to 13 MPH possible in the AM.
- Highs on Tuesday also look to climb into the mid 80s, upper 80s around downtown HOU.
- *Fog is not anticipated for Tuesday.*


Sustained Winds (11 AM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (1 PM CT)




High Temps Tuesday




Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- **Quiet weather favored Wednesday.**
- **Winds will generally come out of the NE at 5-10 MPH, however there may be periods of variable winds with lighter winds speeds.**
- **Mid 80s will be the call on Wednesday.**
- **Fog is not expected for Wednesday.**


Sustained Winds (12 PM CT)

High Temps Wednesday





Long-Range Forecast Discussion

- Rain chances are on the low side with a rather inactive week. Temperatures look to generally be normal to slightly above normal for the week ahead.



- The week 2 timeframe is expected to have average to slightly below average temps with below normal precip risks. Not eyeing a specific threat for a tropical storm or hurricane at this distance but will need to continue to monitor for potential development.

- Right now, we have risks for slightly below normal temps and slightly below normal precip for the weeks 3/4 period. We will continue to monitor for tropical disturbances during this time. All it takes is for one system to produce above normal rainfall. The forecast may ultimately be “boom or bust” regarding precipitation potential.
