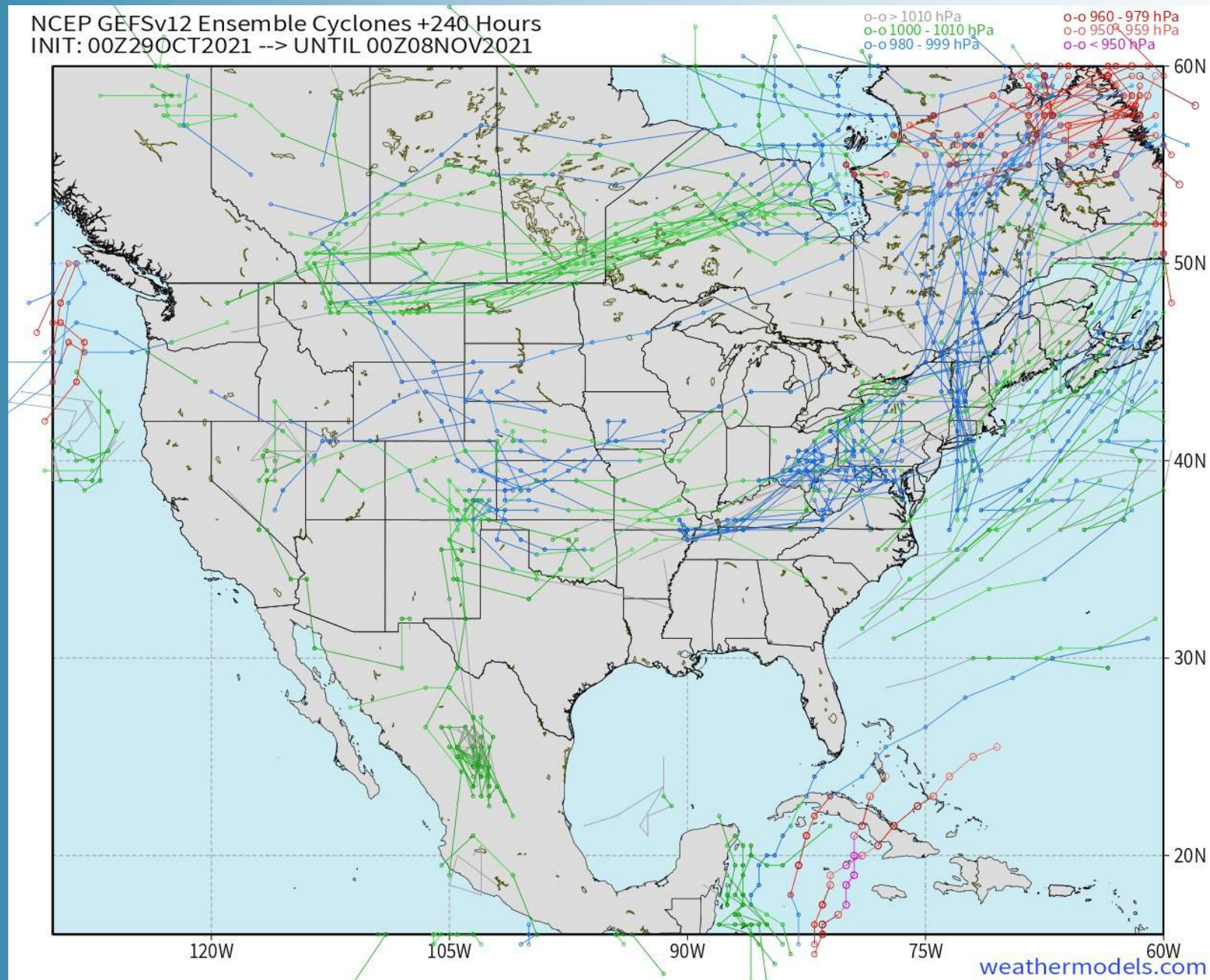

GEFS Ensemble 10-days Tracks

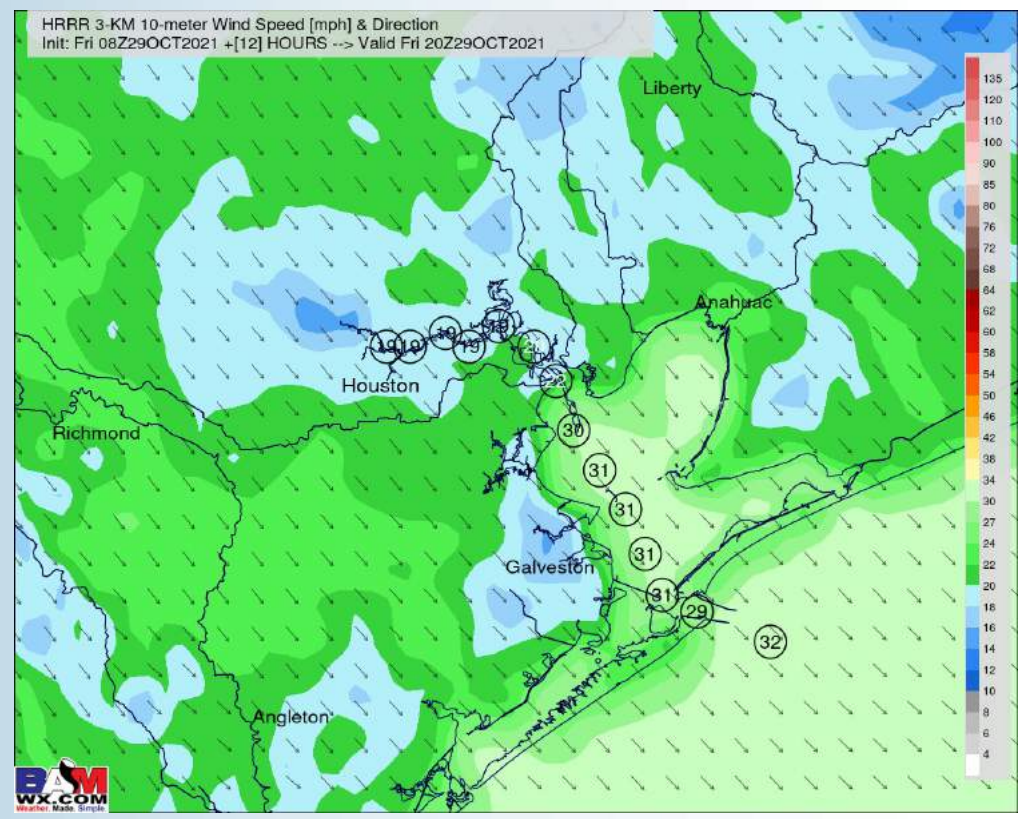


- We continue to favor the Gulf to remain quiet at least for the next 7-10 days. The GEFS tries to put in a disturbance in the Caribbean, but not posing any risk further into the Gulf of Mexico.

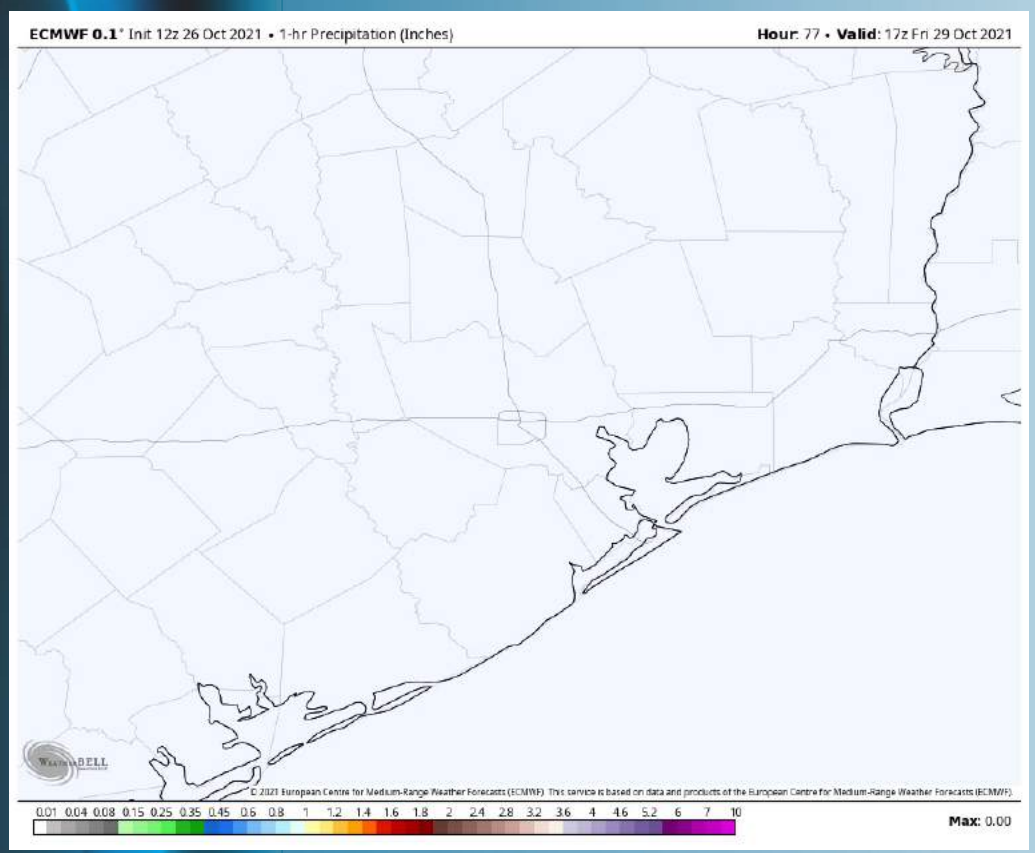
Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Anticipating a dry day for our stations on Friday.
- Winds today continue to be elevated today, remaining out of the NW. Winds look to be sustained around 20 – 30 MPH sustained. Gust of 35 – 40 MPH will be possible throughout the day, especially during the daylight hours. After sunset, winds weaken a bit sustained around 15 – 25 MPH with gust around 30 – 35 MPH.
- High temps look to be in the low 70s.
- **Fog is not expected for Friday.**

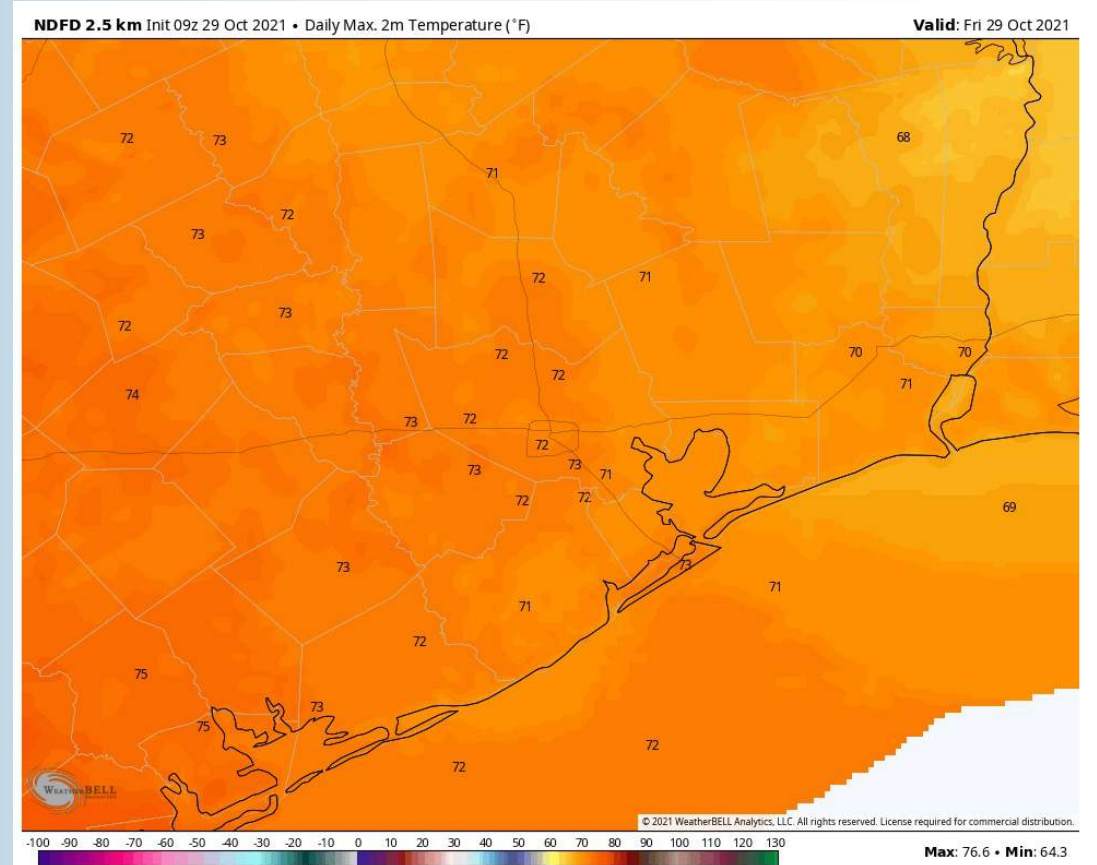
Sustained Winds (3 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (12 PM CT)



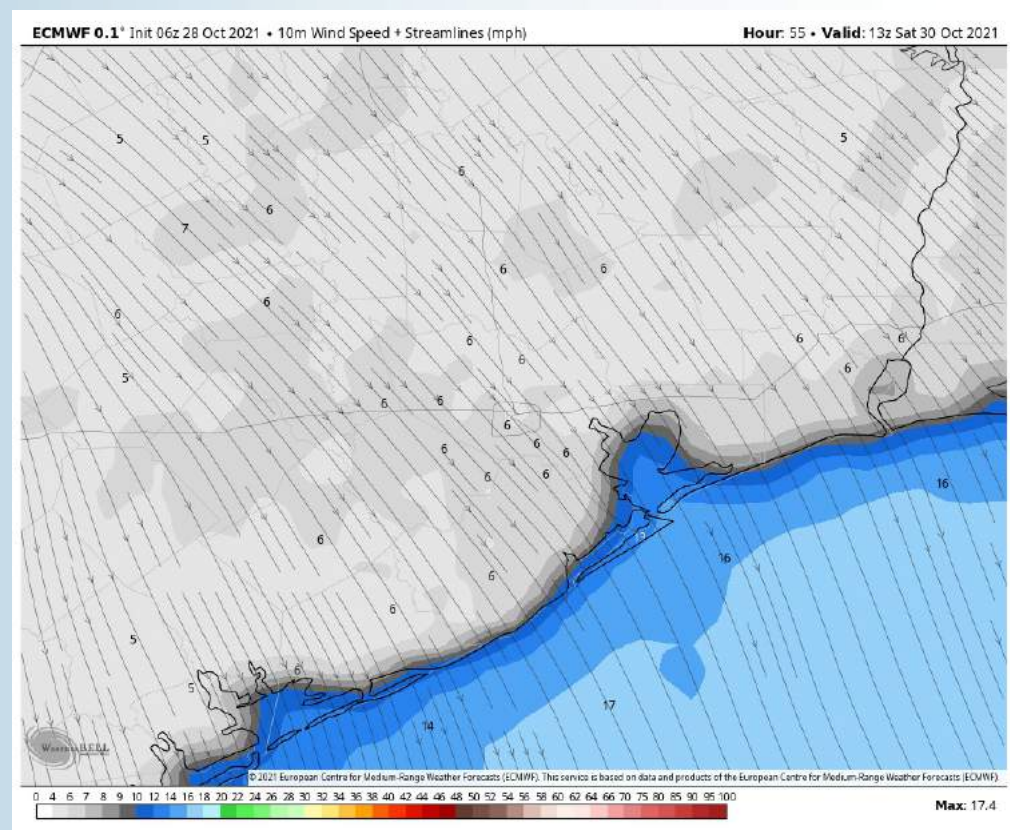
High Temps Friday



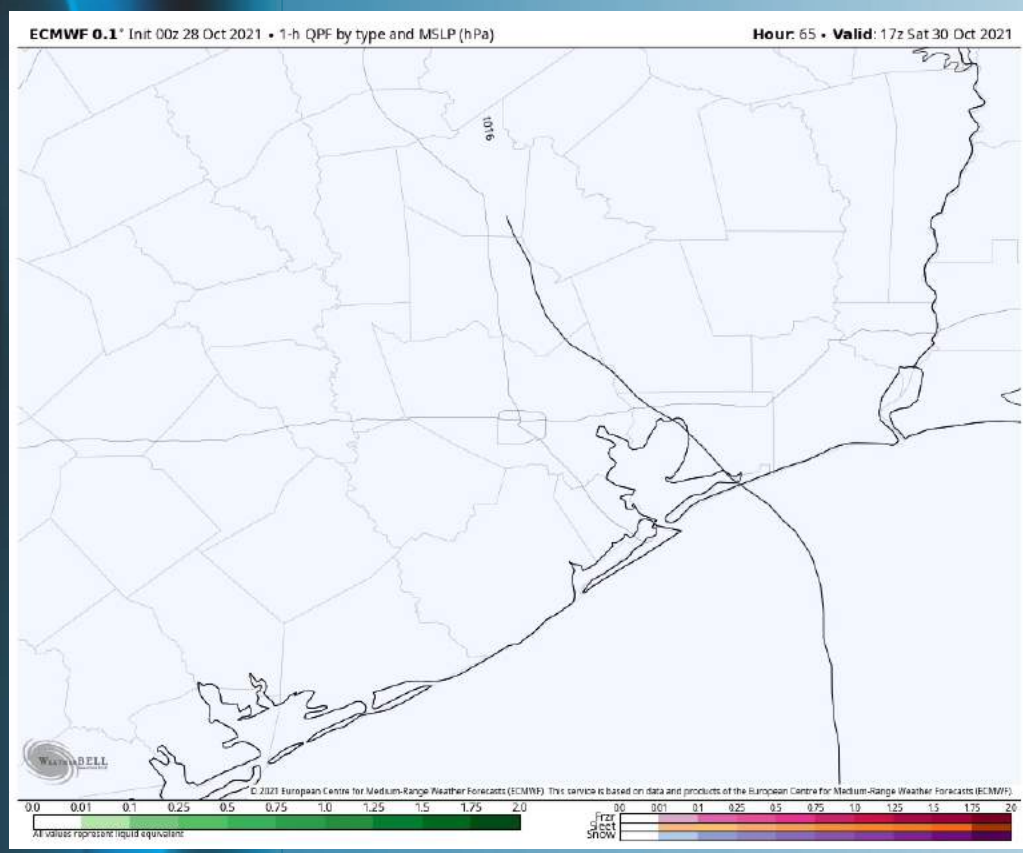
Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- No precip is expected for our Saturday.
- Winds will steadily be decreasing during the pre dawn hours through the morning. Winds in the AM will generally be sustained around 10 – 15 MPH with gust around 20 – 25 MPH. This will be the theme into the afternoon as well with gust only around the 20 MPH. Winds will be breeziest towards the boarding station and lesser so towards the HOU metro. Winds continue to be out of the NW throughout the day.
- Highs look to be in the low to mid 70s on the day Saturday.
 - **Not expecting fog for Saturday.**

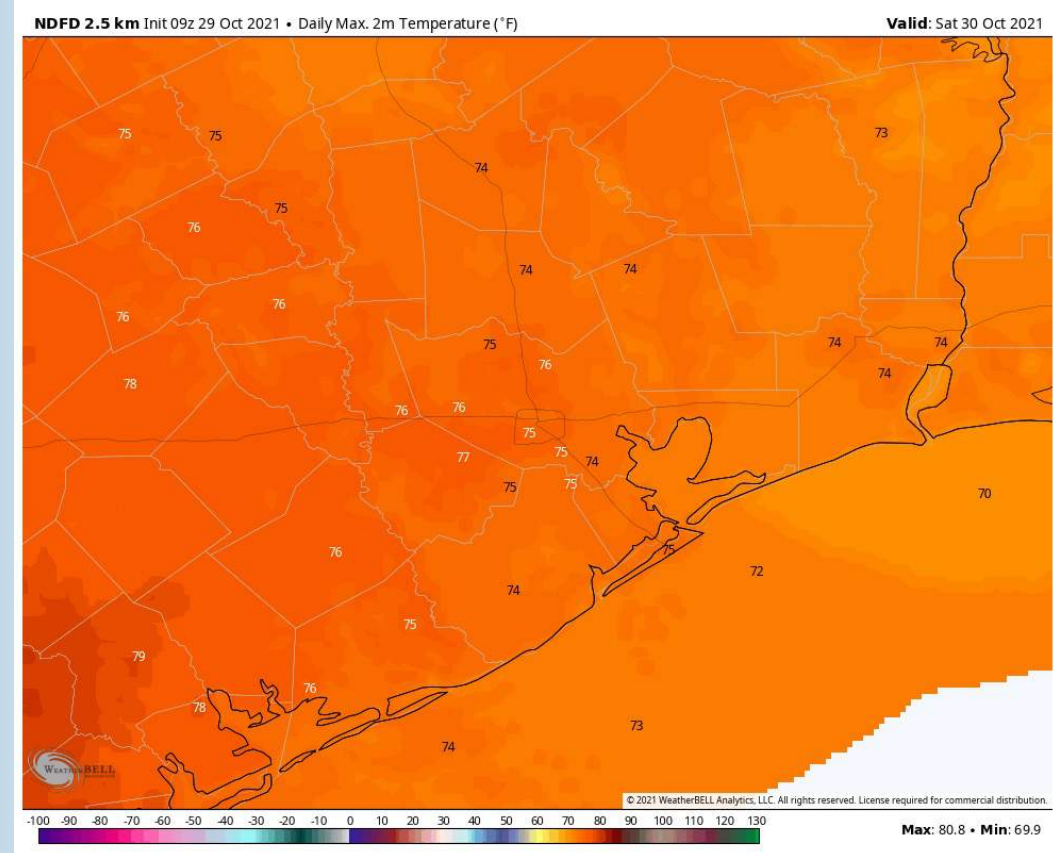
Sustained Winds (9 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (1 PM CT)



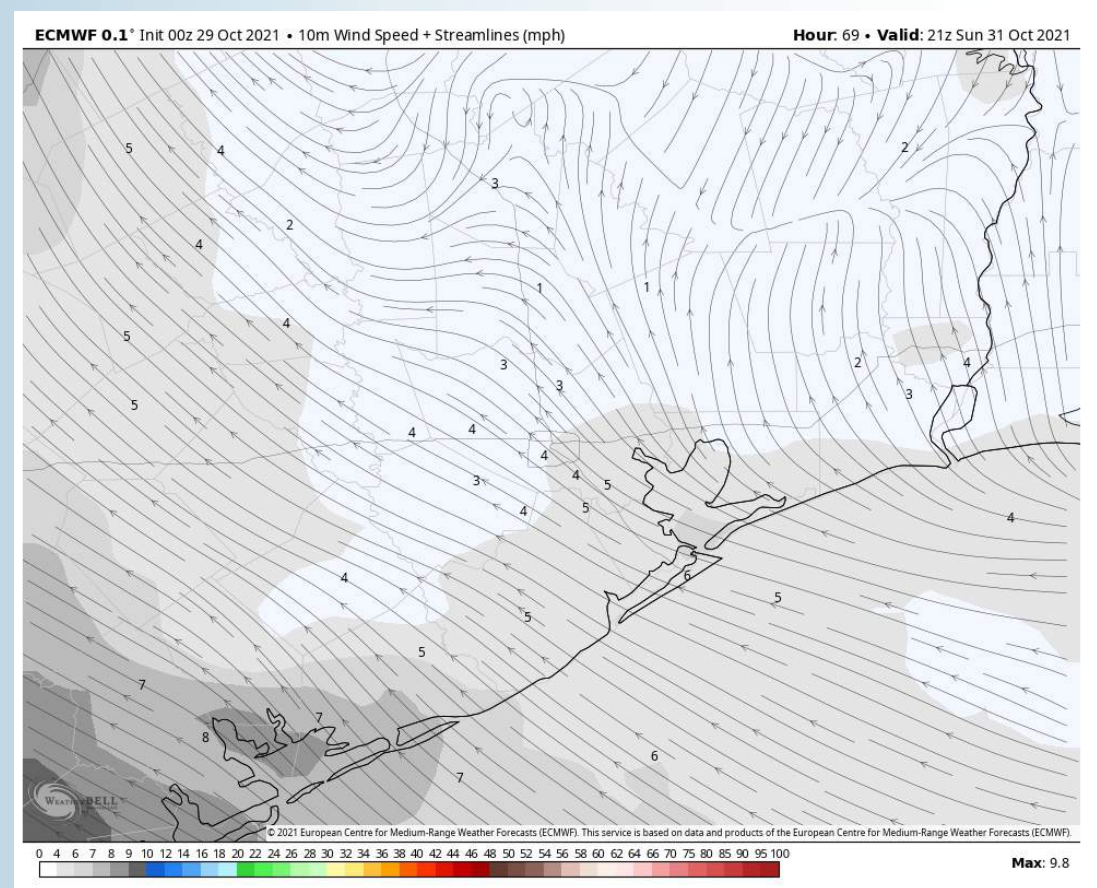
High Temps Saturday



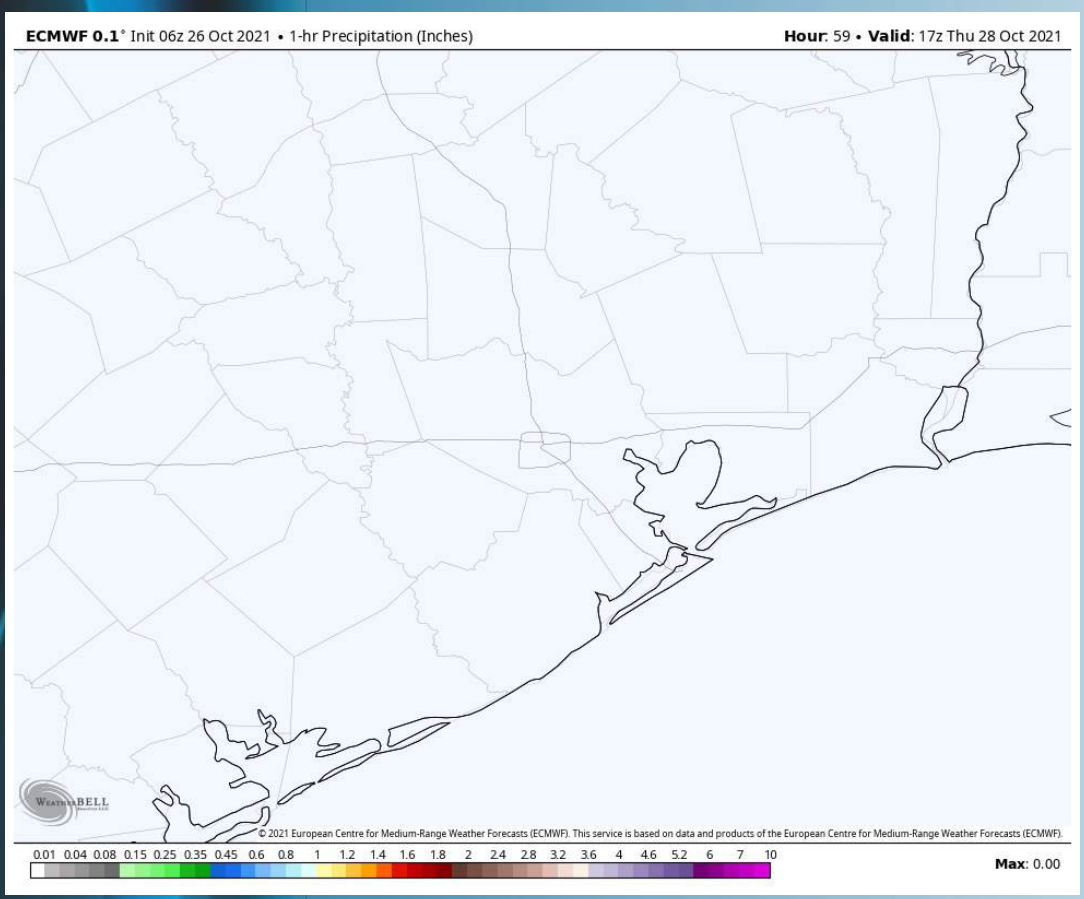
Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Another dry day is anticipated for Sunday.
- NW winds will shift to the SE throughout the morning hours of Sunday with SE winds in the afternoon. Winds are expected to be light, sustained around 5 – 10 MPH.
- High temperatures on Sunday look to be in the mid 70's F.
- **No fog is expected on Sunday at this time. However, the light winds will open up the door for the opportunity. This potential increases if the aforementioned wind shift can happen quicker.**

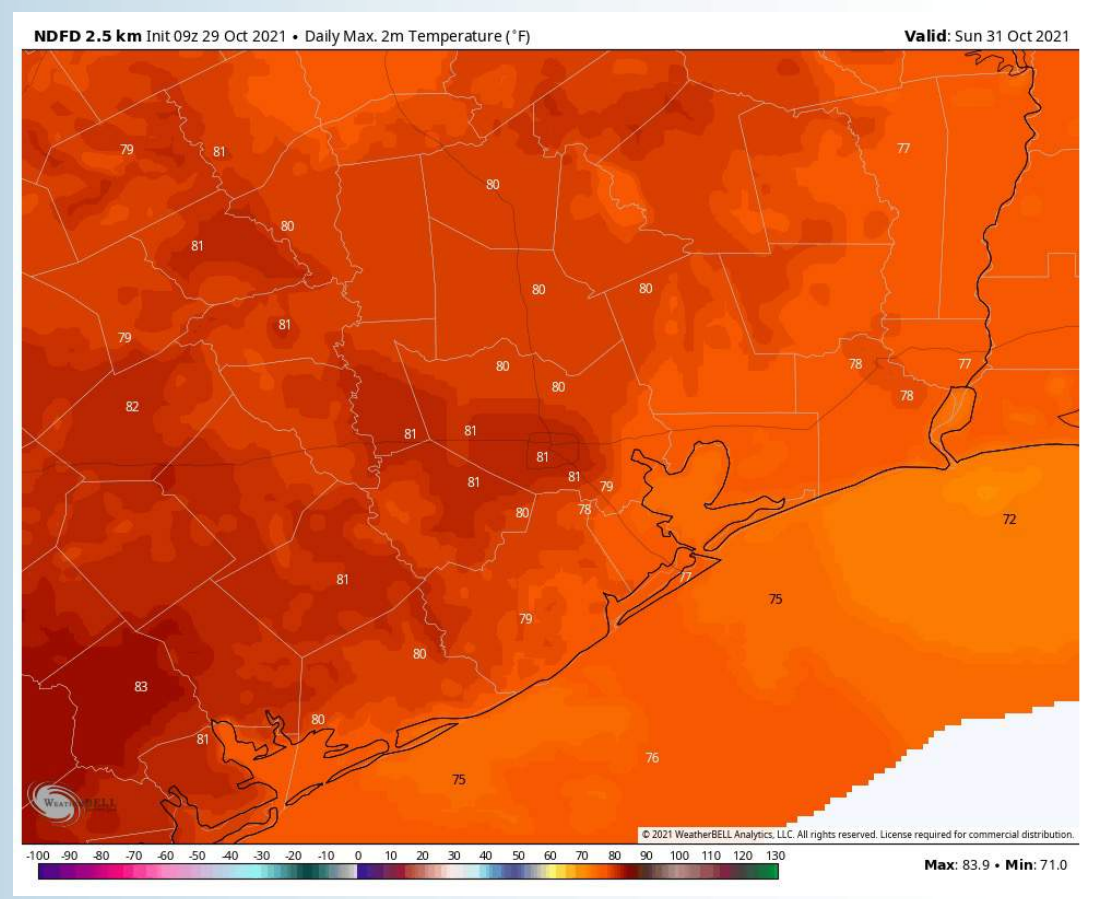
Sustained Winds (4 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (8 PM CT)



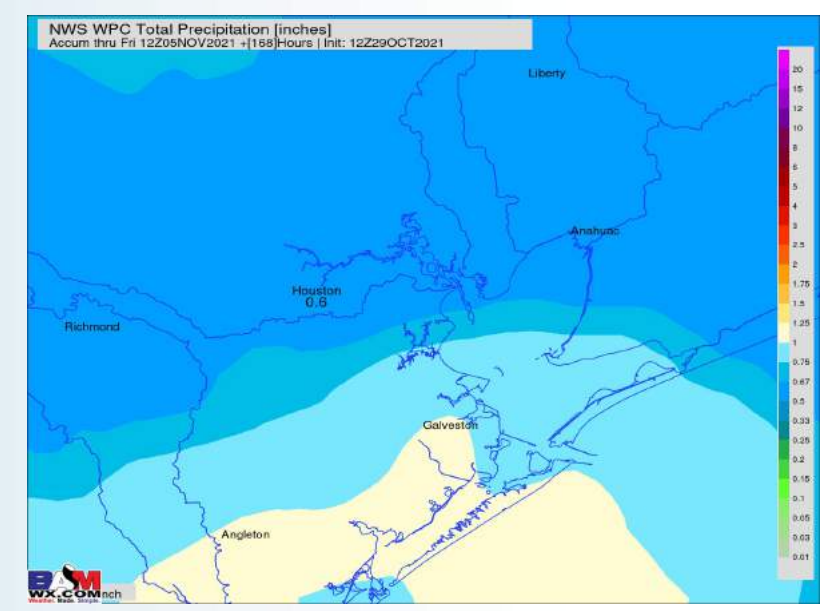
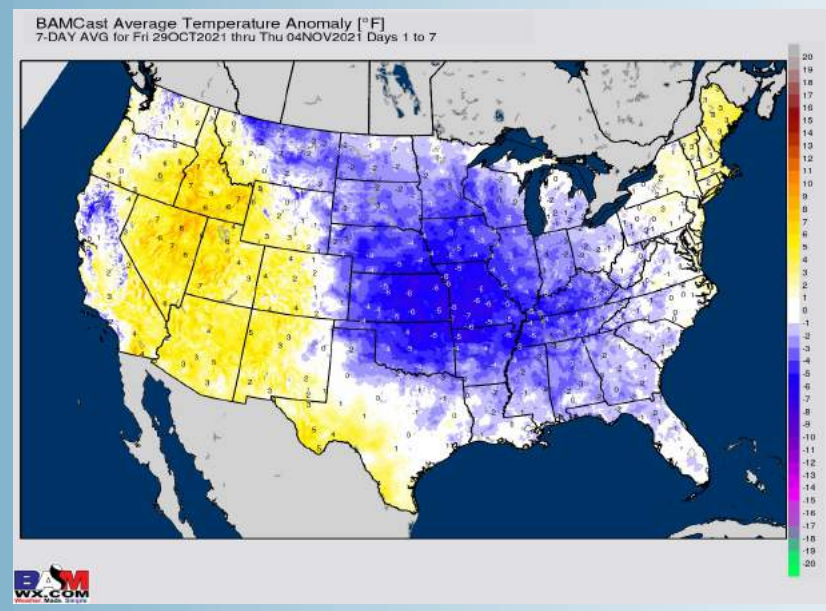
High Temperatures Sunday



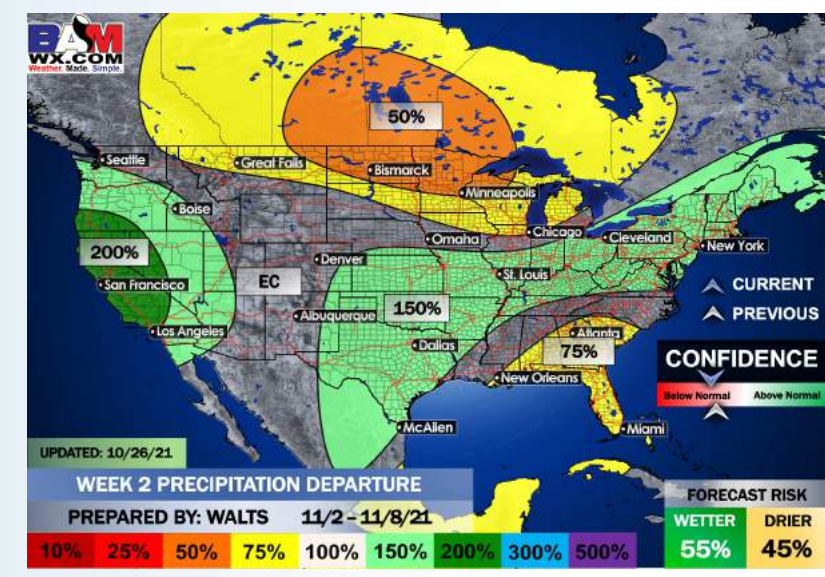
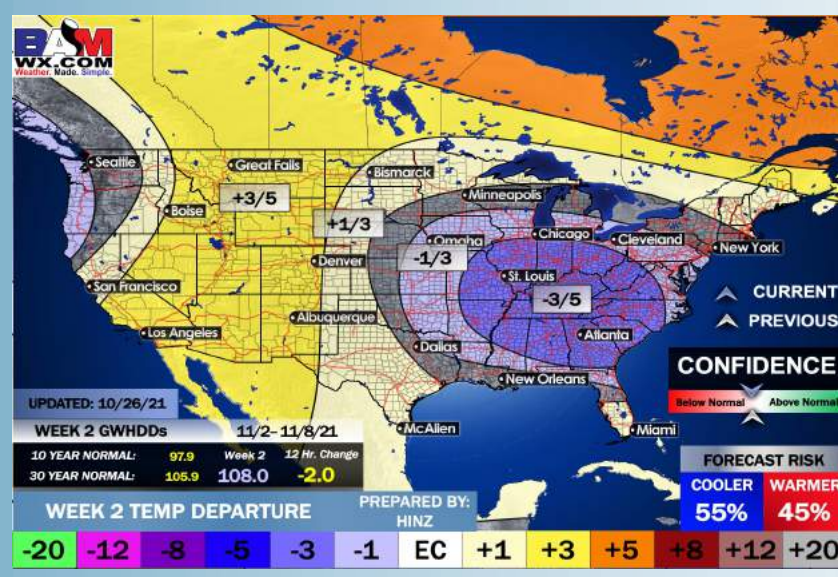
Long-Range Forecast Discussion

- The first half of the next 7 days looks to be rather inactive before the approach of another frontal boundary next THU - SAT. Pockets of heavier rain will be possible with this. Temperature will average out to near normal the next 7 days.
- The week 2 timeframe is expected to have near normal to slightly above normal temps with slightly above average risks for precip. Not eyeing a specific threat for a tropical storm or hurricane at this distance.
- Right now, we have risks for about average temps and below average precip for the first half of November. Tropical risks are on the lower side, but not a threat that should be 100% eliminated.
