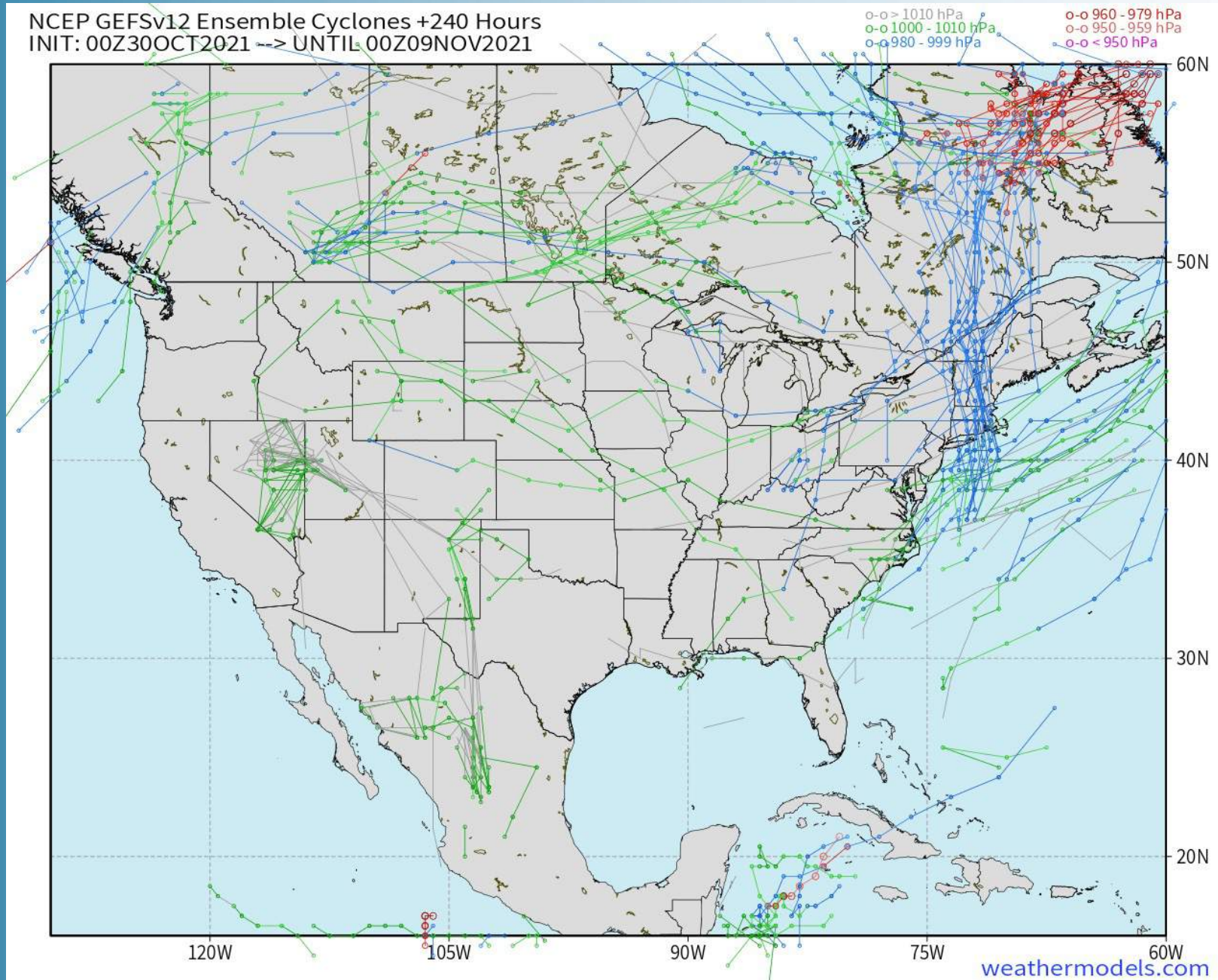

GEFS Ensemble 10-days Tracks

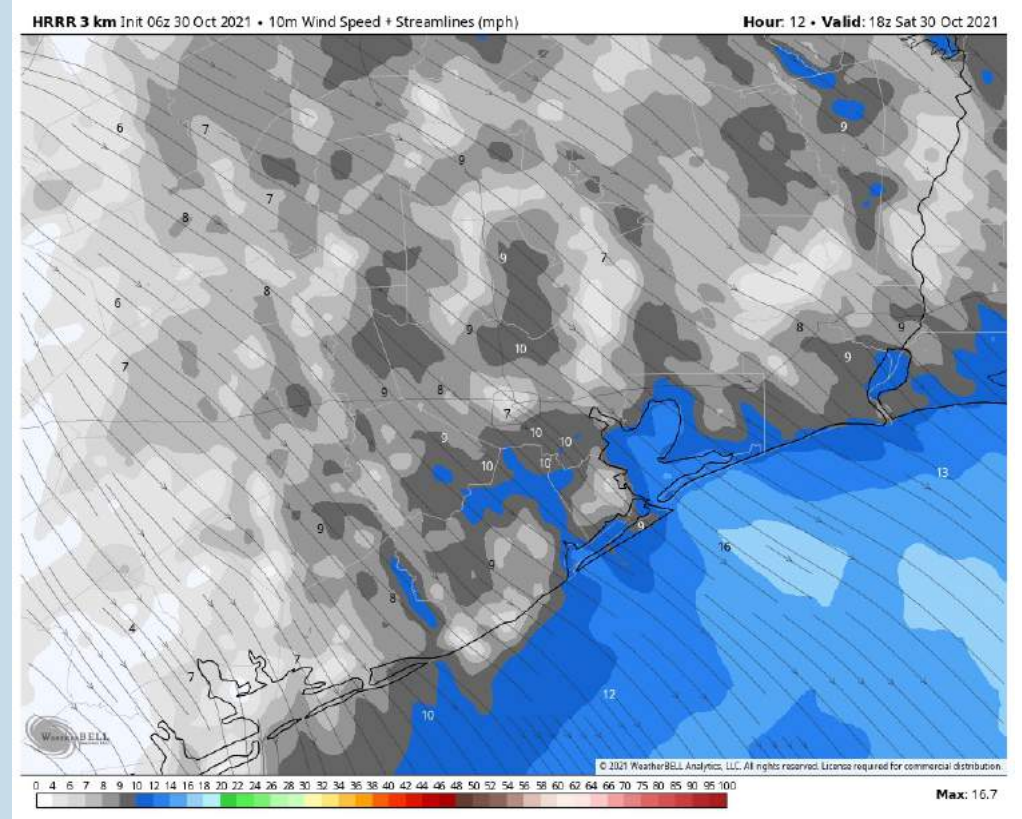


- We continue to favor the Gulf to remain quiet at least for the next 7-10 days. The GEFS tries to put in a disturbance in the Caribbean, but not posing any risk further into the Gulf of Mexico.

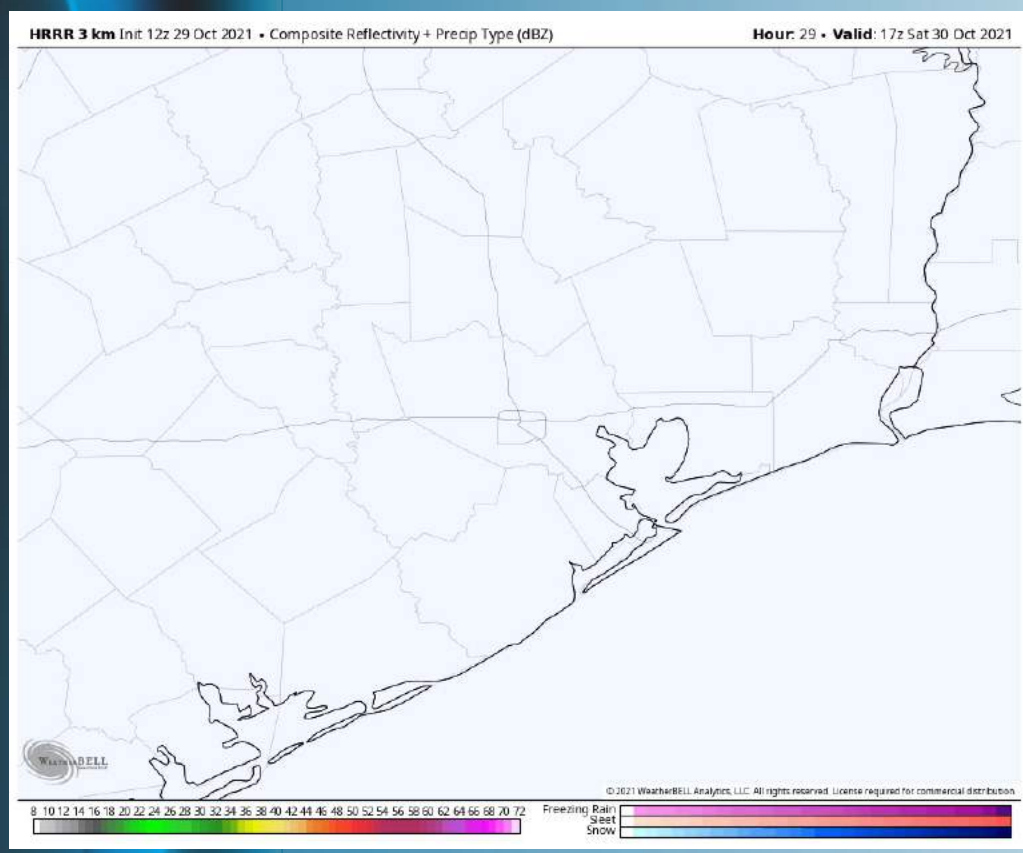
Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- No precip is expected on Saturday for our stations.
- Winds continue to be from the NW today sustained around 8 – 13 MPH for most of the day (weaker towards Buffalo Bayou). After sunset, winds begin to weaken and wind direction starts to become variable at times, sustained closer to 4 – 8 MPH.
- Highs look to be in the low to mid 70s on the day Saturday.
 - **Not expecting fog for Saturday.**

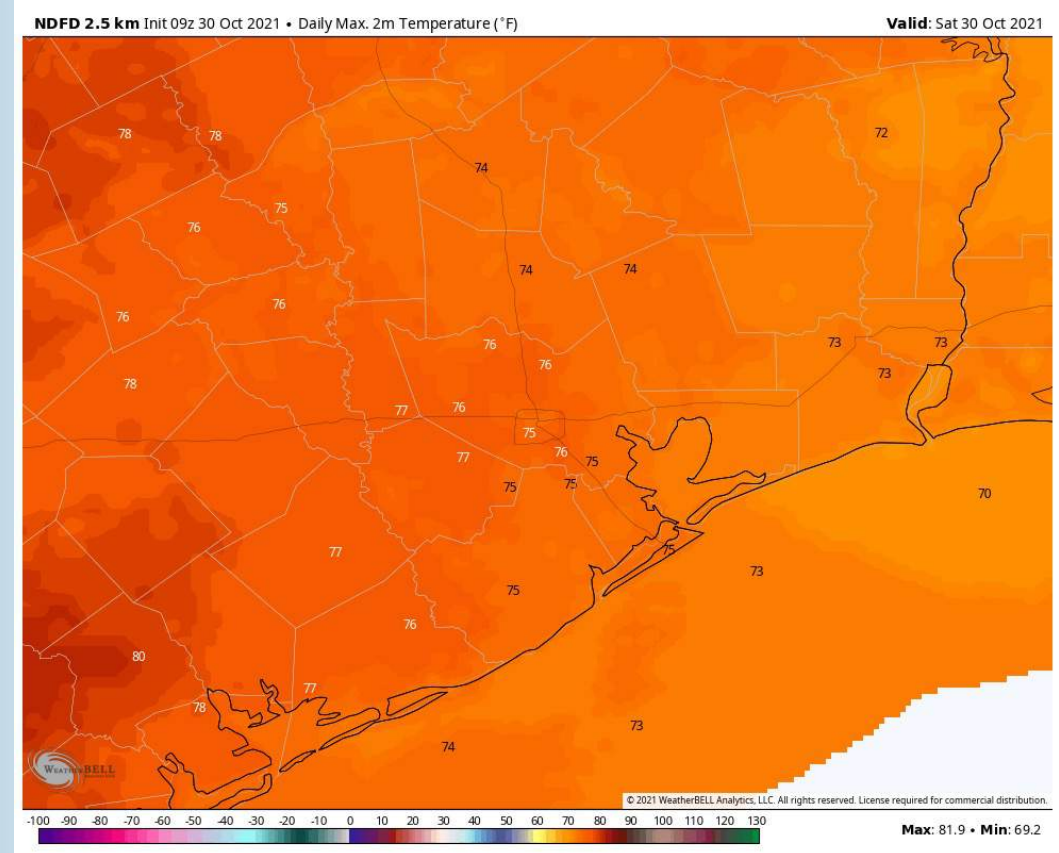
Sustained Winds (1 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (12 PM CT)



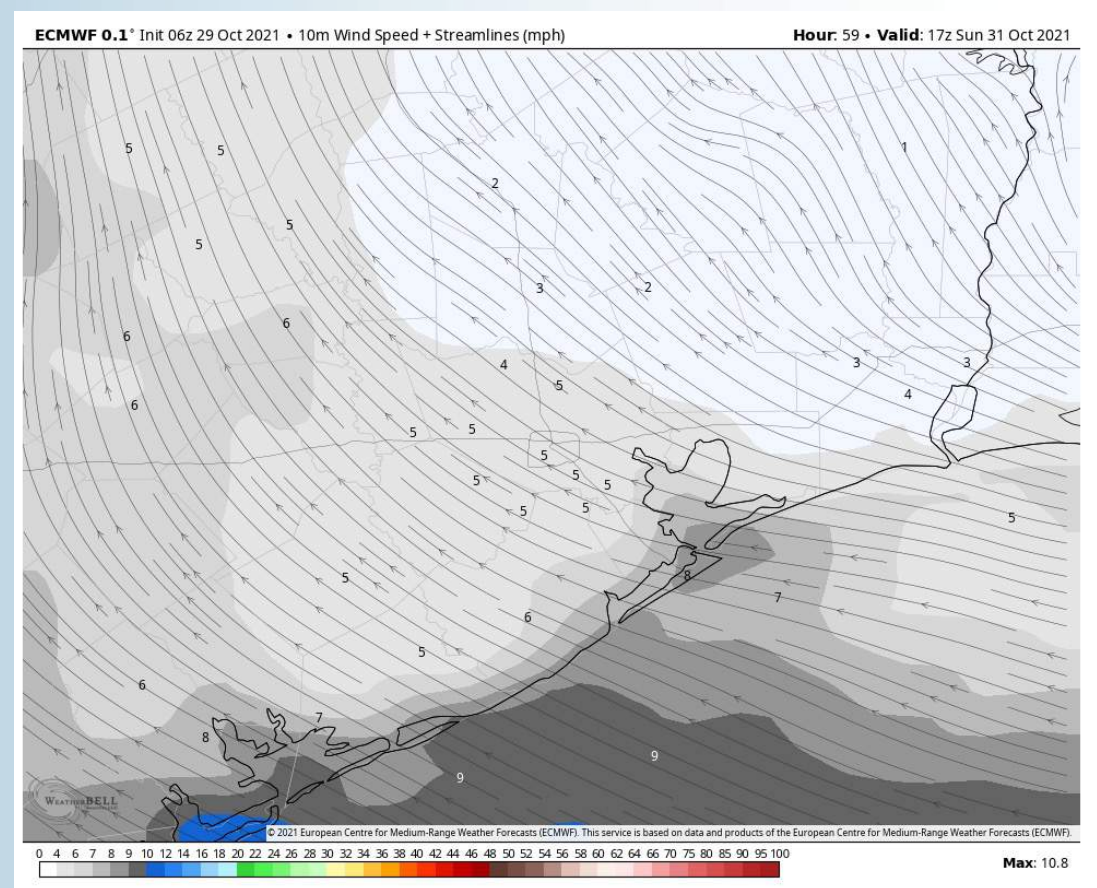
High Temps Saturday



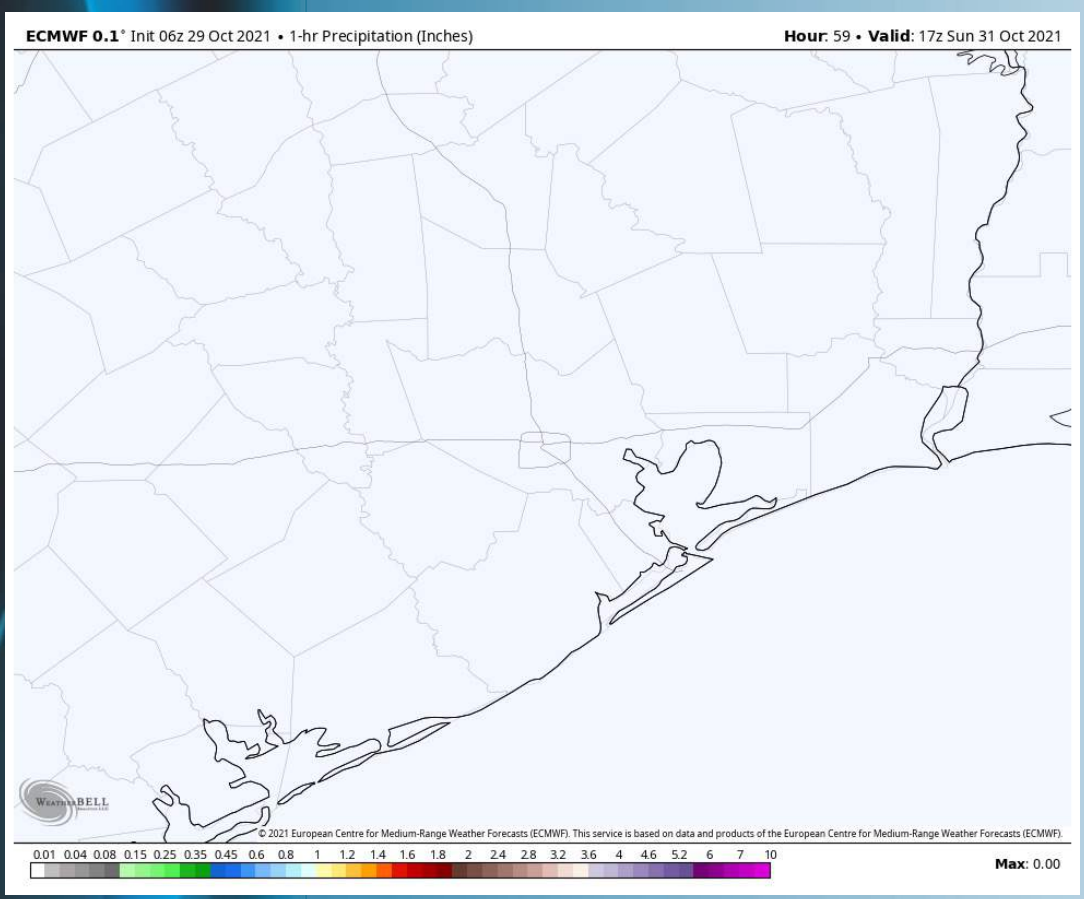
Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Another dry day is anticipated for Sunday.
- Light NNE winds in the AM tomorrow start to shift more out of the SE into the afternoon. Winds are anticipated to be on the lighter side throughout the day, only sustained around 5 – 10 MPH.
- High temperatures on Sunday look to be in the mid 70's F.
- **Fog is not anticipated SUN morning as hi-res data continues to not favor.**

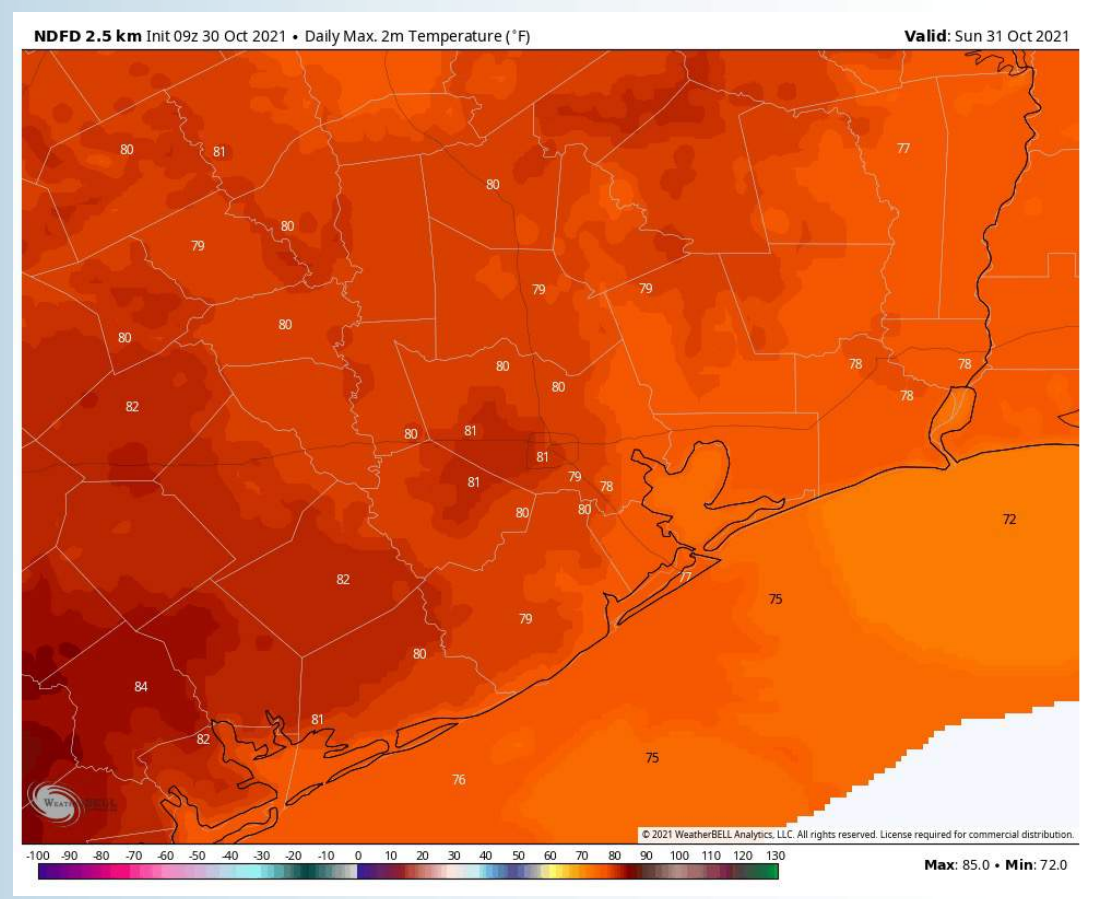
Sustained Winds (12 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (12 PM CT)



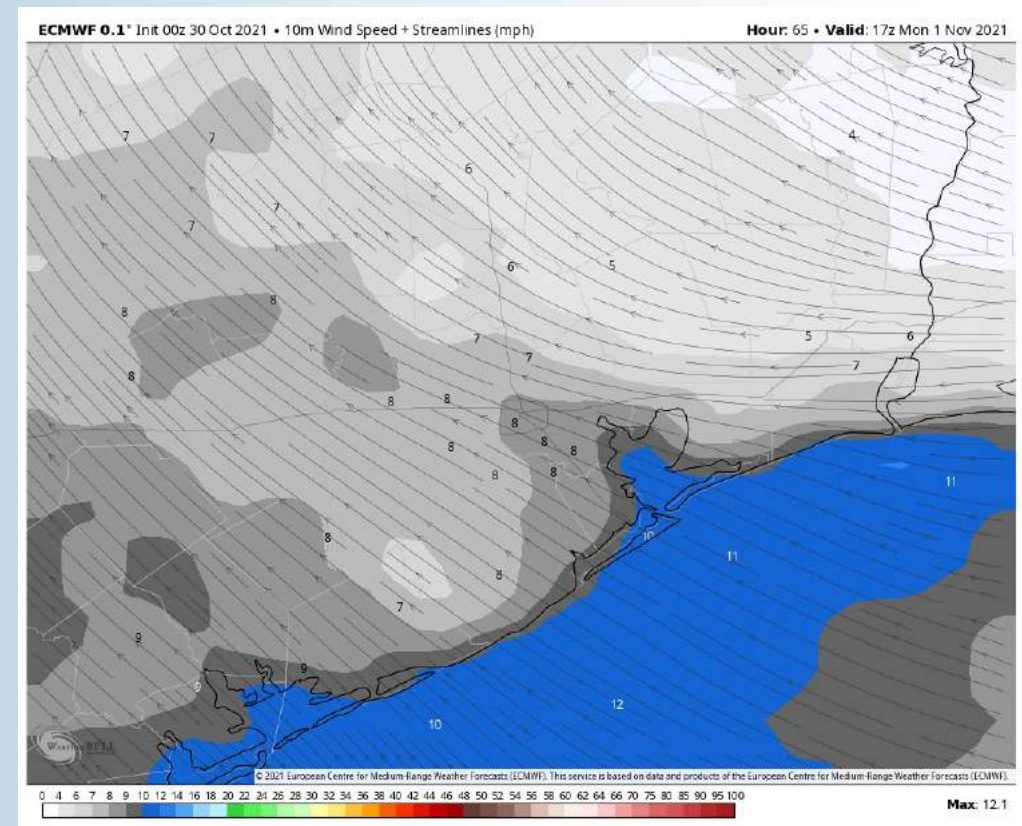
High Temperatures Sunday



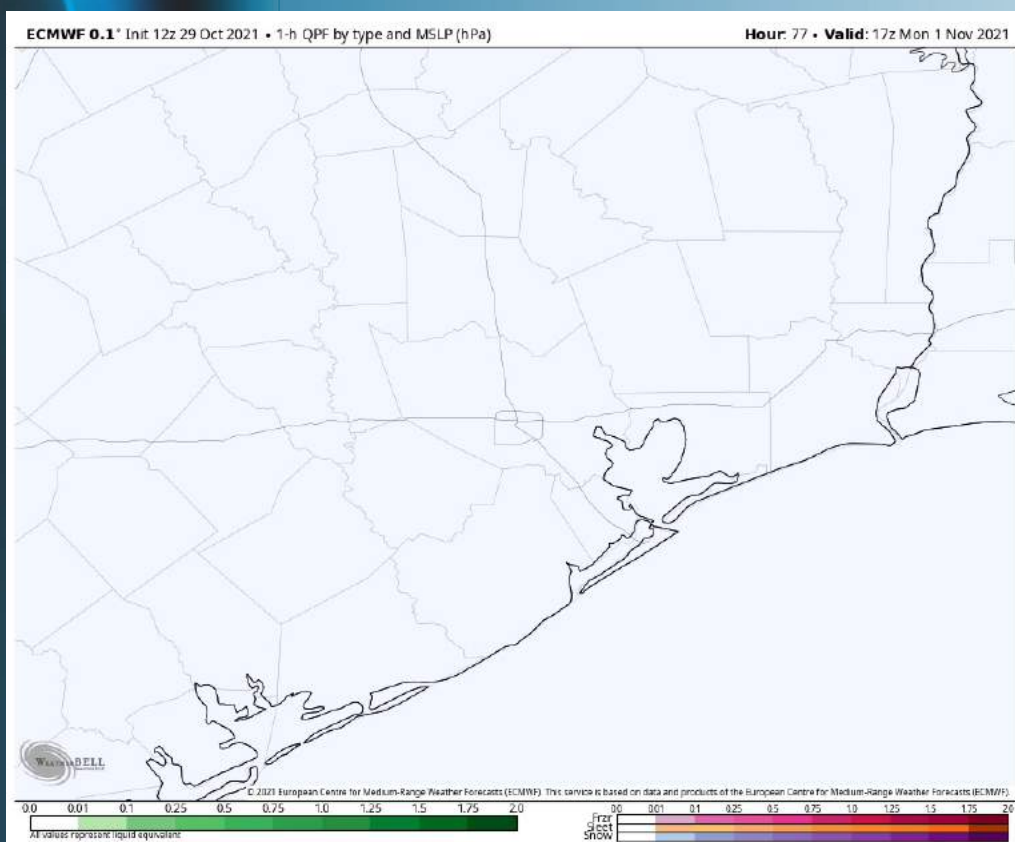
Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Dry conditions expected to continue for Monday.
- Sustained winds 5-10 MPH for our stations on Monday, gusts to 16 MPH at the boarding station. Winds generally coming out of the ESE for most of the day.
- High temps on Monday look to be in the mid-to-upper 70's F on Monday.
 - **Fog is currently not expected for our stations on Monday, keeping an eye on light SE winds that could promote potential fog.**

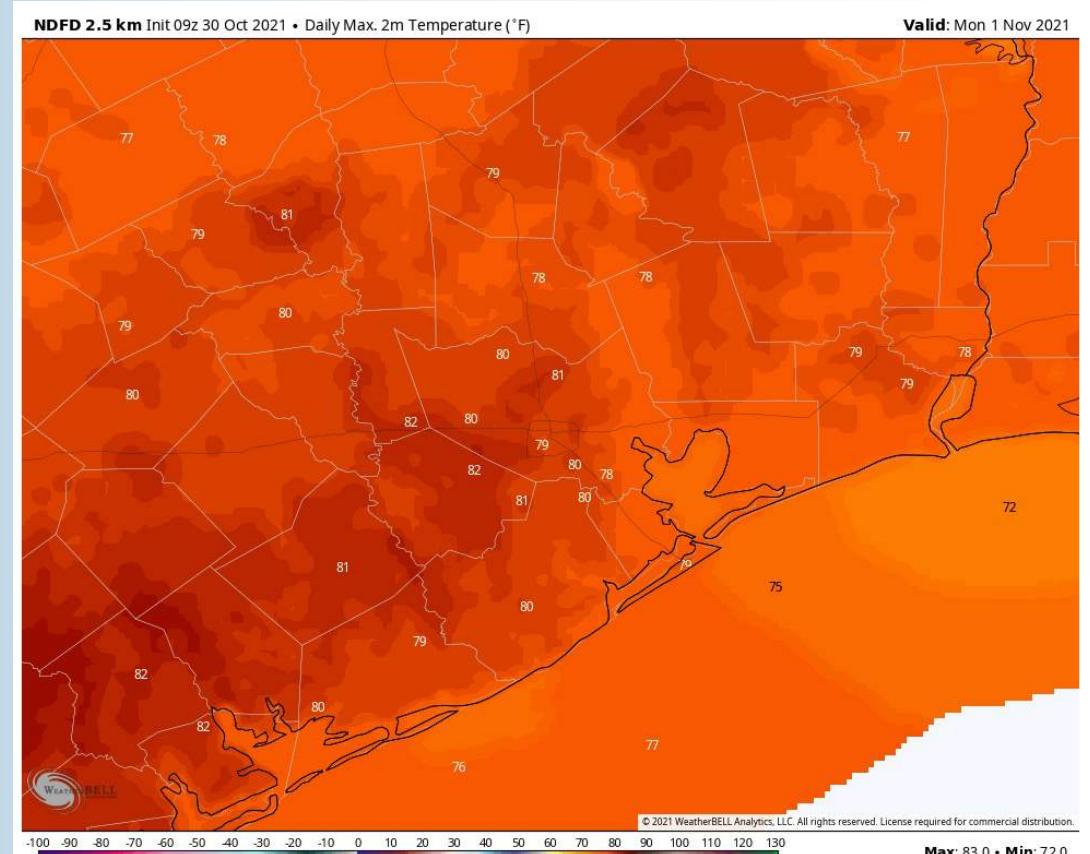
Sustained Winds (12 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (12 PM CT)



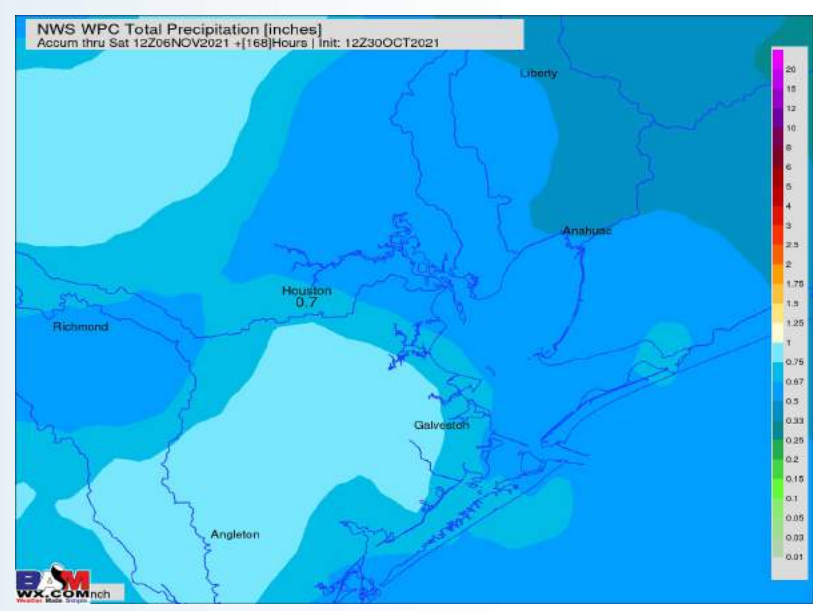
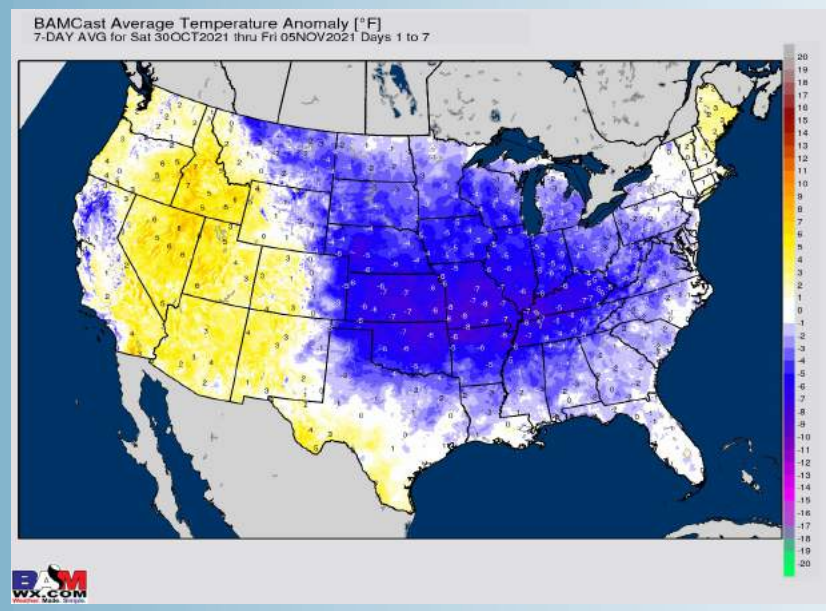
High Temperatures Monday



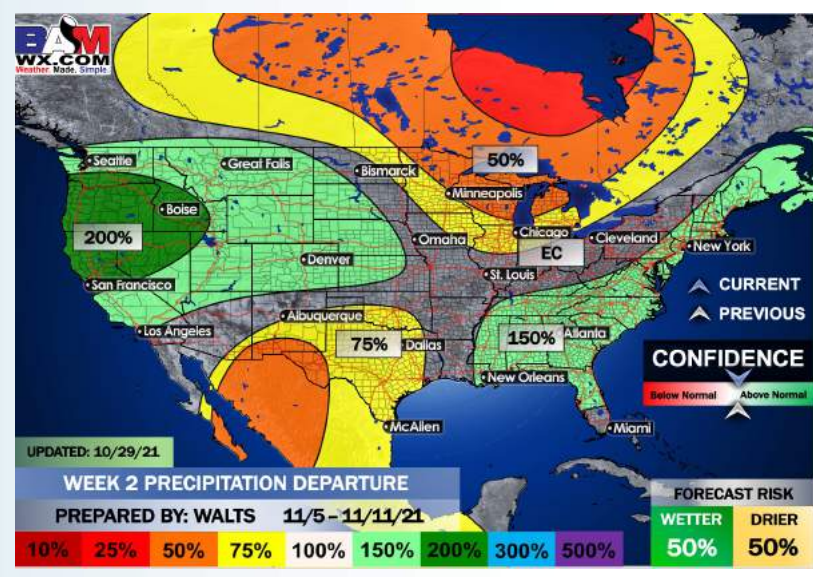
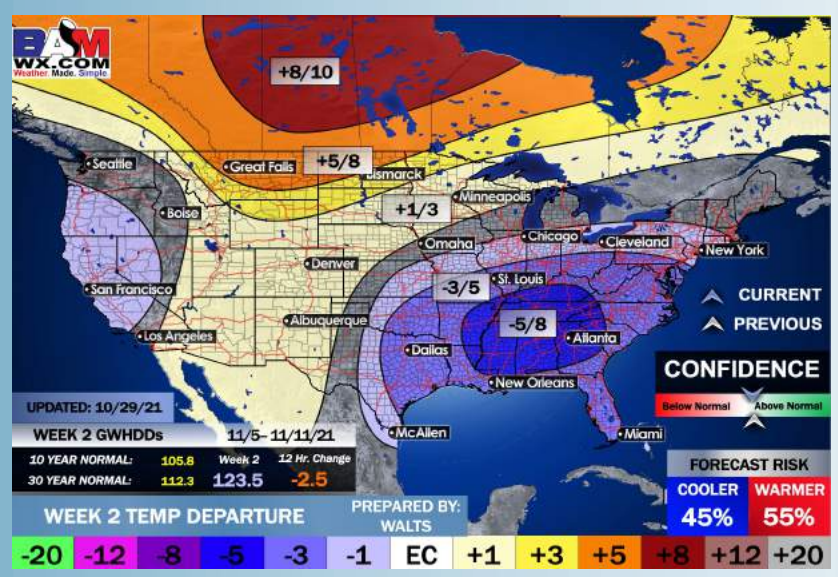
Long-Range Forecast Discussion

- The first half of the next 7 days looks to be rather inactive before the approach of another frontal boundary late WED - SAT. Pockets of heavier rain will be possible with this. Temperatures will average out near normal to slightly below normal.
- The week 2 timeframe is expected to have below normal temps with about average to slightly below average risks for precip. Not eyeing a specific threat for a tropical storm or hurricane at this distance.
- Right now, we have risks for slightly below average temps and about average precip for the first half of November. Tropical risks are on the lower side, but not a threat that should be 100% eliminated.
