

ECMWF EPS 10-days Tracks




- We continue to favor the Gulf to remain quiet at least for the next 7-10 days. Current tropical activity is expected to stay confined to the Atlantic.


Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Favoring dry conditions today.
- Winds look to continue generally out of the N (NNE in direction possible at times). Sustained 5-10 MPH for most of the day, calming closer to 3-8 MPH after sundown. Gusts to 10-15 MPH possible out through about 11 AM at the boarding station.
- Highs look to climb into the mid to upper 80s.
- *Fog is not anticipated for today.*


Sustained Winds (2 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (1 PM CT)




High Temperatures Today




Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Wednesday looks to continue the dry conditions this week.
- Winds most of Wednesday look to be out of the N/NNE, switching to a SE flow beyond sundown. Sustained winds 5-10 MPH for our stations with gusts up to 15 MPH possible in the AM at the boarding station.
- Highs on Wednesday look to be in the mid to upper 80s.
- **Fog is not expected for Wednesday.**


Sustained Winds (11 AM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (11 AM CT)




High Temps Wednesday




Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Not expecting precip on our Thursday.
- At this distance winds look to be rather variable on Thursday with a sustained wind of 5-10 MPH expected.
- Highs once again are favored to work into the mid to upper 80s.
- *No fog favored for our stations Thursday.*


Sustained Winds (11 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (1 PM CT)





High Temps Thursday





Long-Range Forecast Discussion

- Rain chances look to be minimal to zero with a rather inactive week ahead. Temperatures average out to slightly above normal for the week ahead.
- The week 2 timeframe is expected to have above average temps with below normal precip risks. Not eyeing a specific threat for a tropical storm or hurricane at this distance but will need to continue to monitor for potential development.
- Right now, we have risks for slightly below normal temps and slightly below normal precip for the weeks 3/4 period. We will continue to monitor for tropical disturbances during this time. All it takes is for one system to produce above normal rainfall. The forecast may ultimately be “boom or bust” regarding precipitation potential.
