

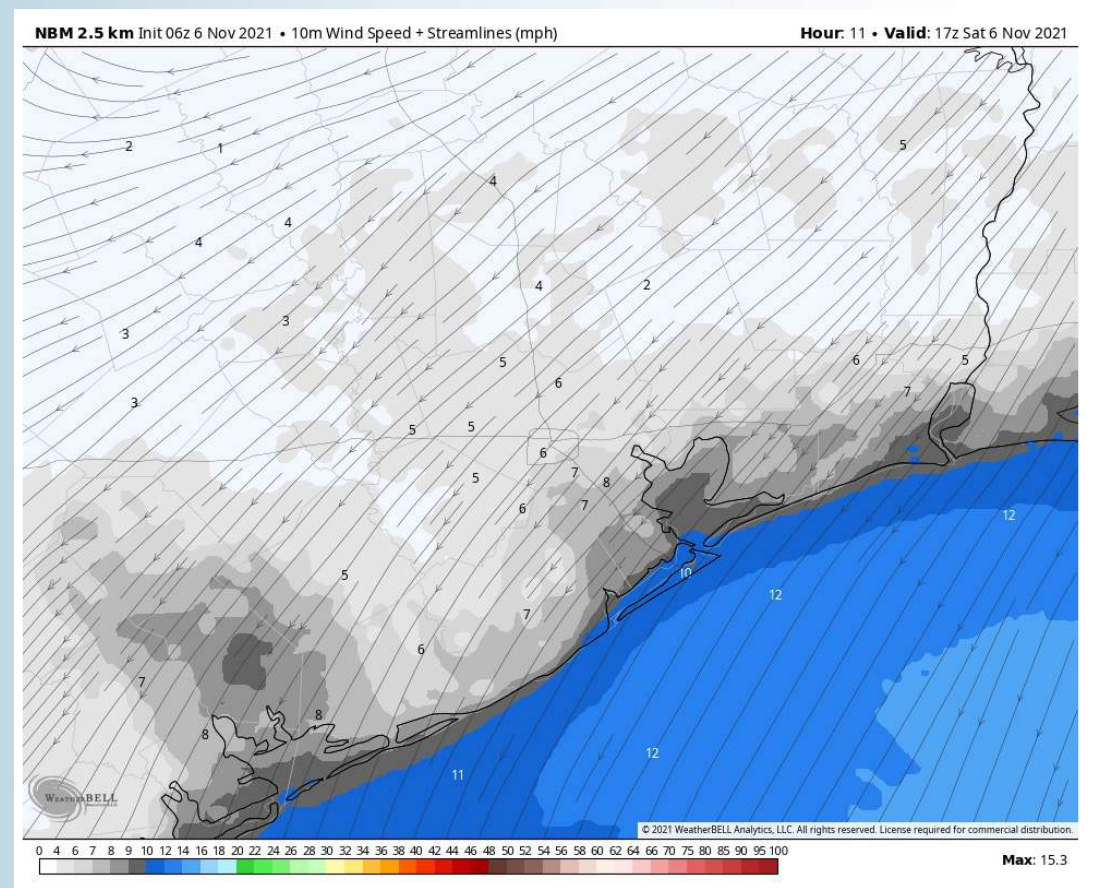

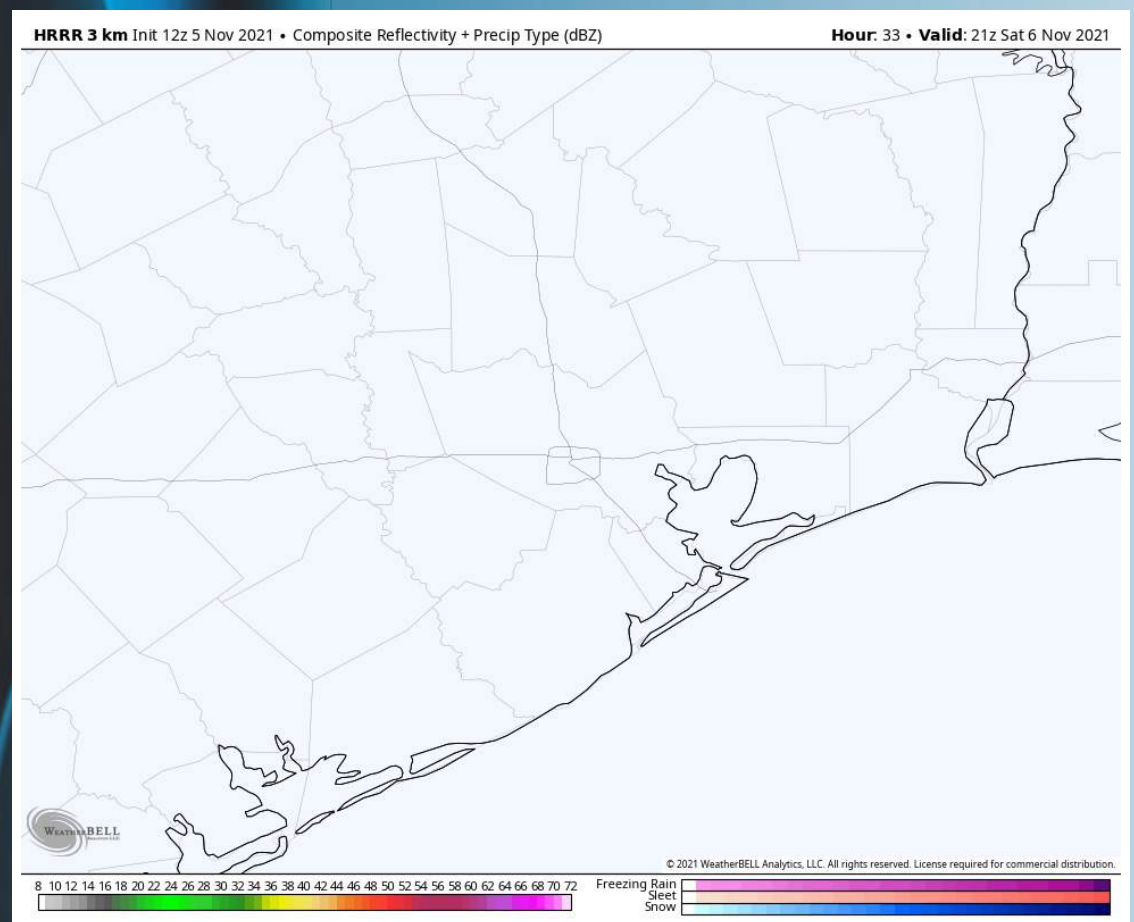
Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Saturday is expected to be a dry day for our stations.
- Winds will continue to be out of the NE throughout the day. Winds will calm down a bit into the afternoon, with sustained winds around 5 – 10 MPH (at times closer to 13 MPH at the boarding station). A few gusts around 15 MPH cannot be ruled out.
- High temps will sit in mid to upper 60's F.
 - **Fog is not favored for Saturday.**

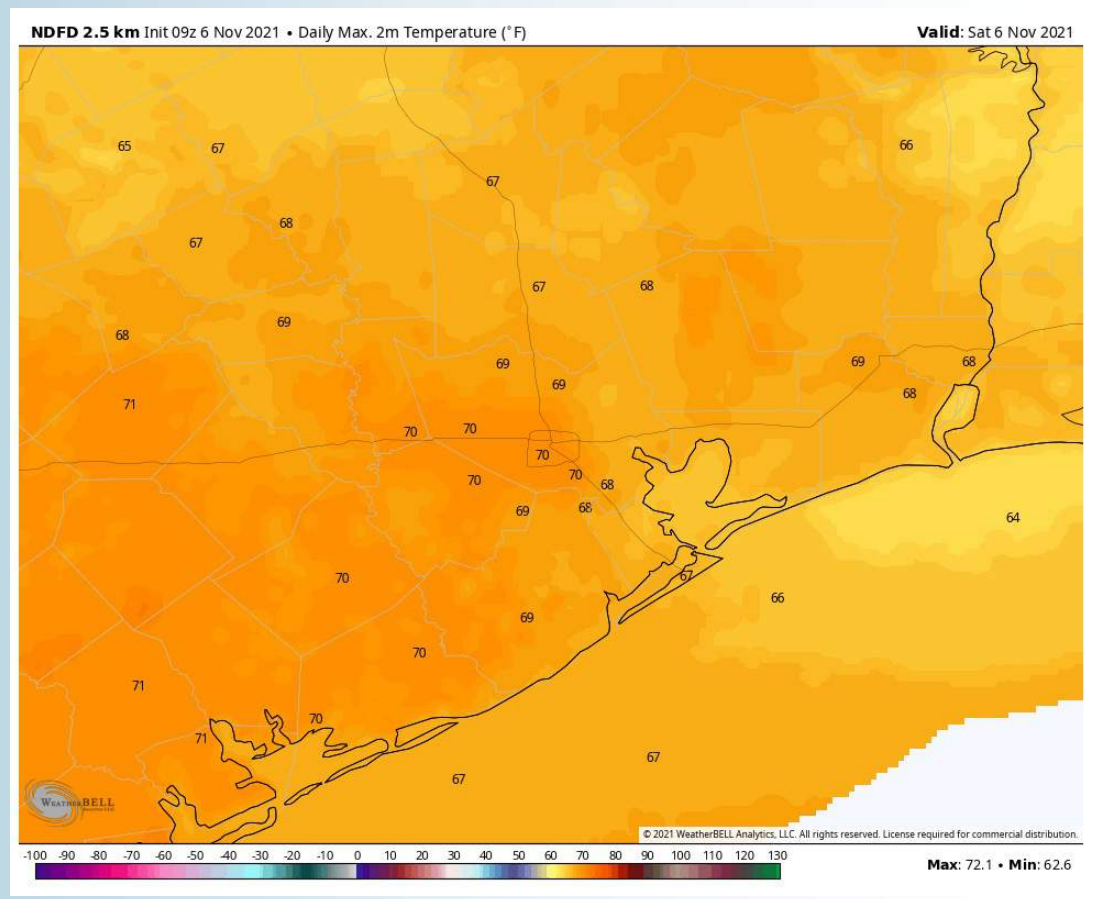
Sustained Winds (12 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (4 PM CT)



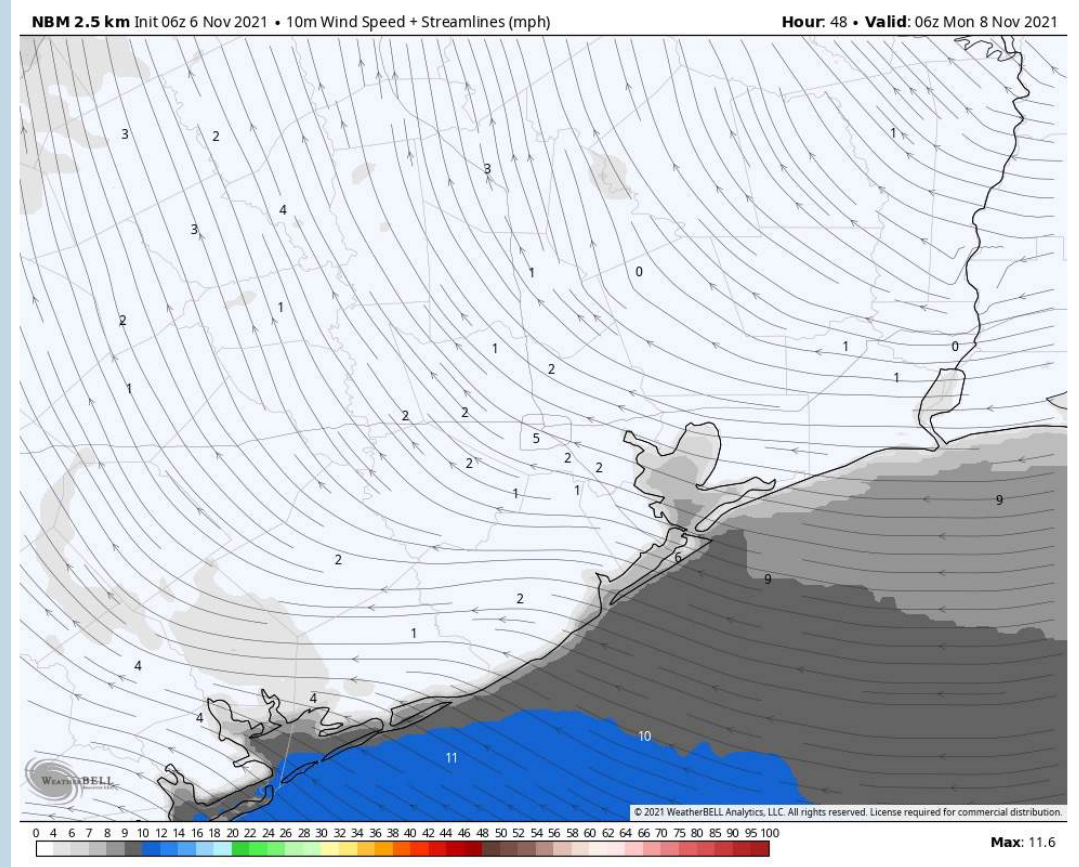
High Temps Saturday



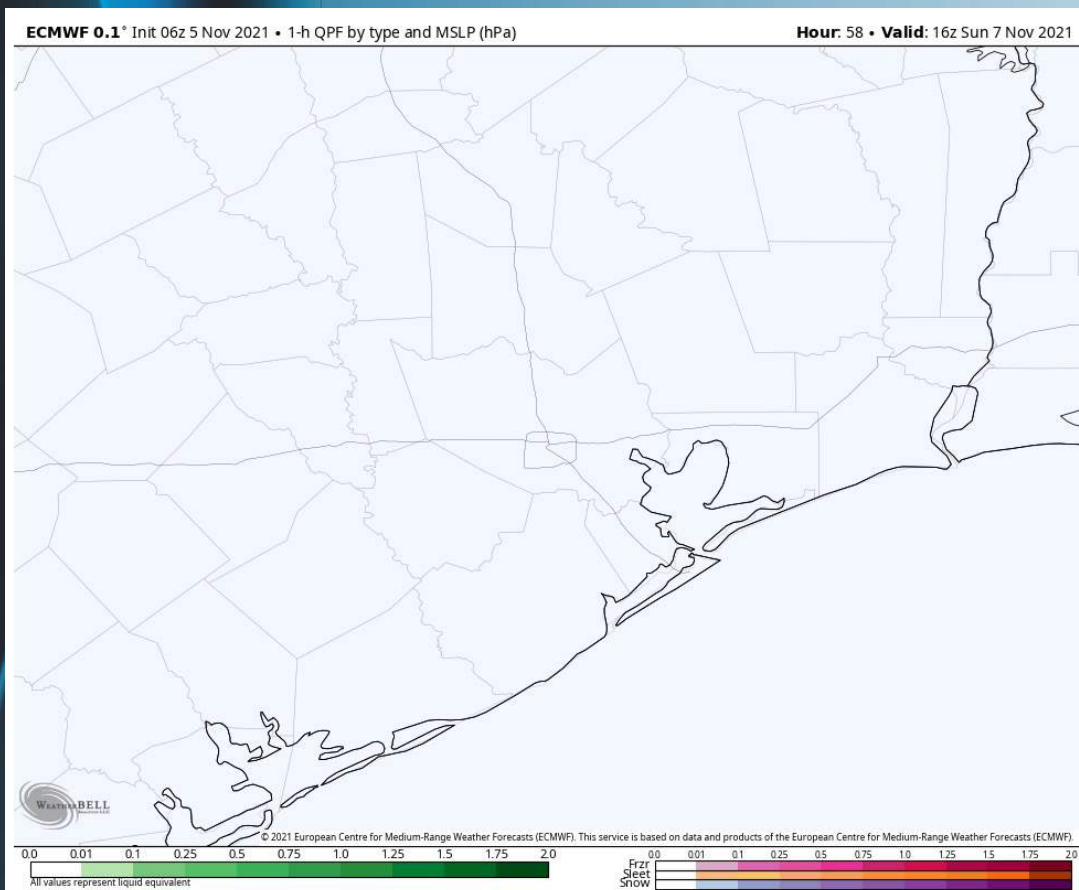
Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Another dry day is expected for Sunday.
- NE winds in the AM will slowly transition to SE winds in the PM. Sustained winds will generally be around 5 – 10 MPH. Gust approaching 15 MPH cannot be ruled out towards the boarding station.
- Highs temps look to be in the low 70s.
- **Fog is not favored for our stations on Sun, currently favoring fog to stay N of our stations.**

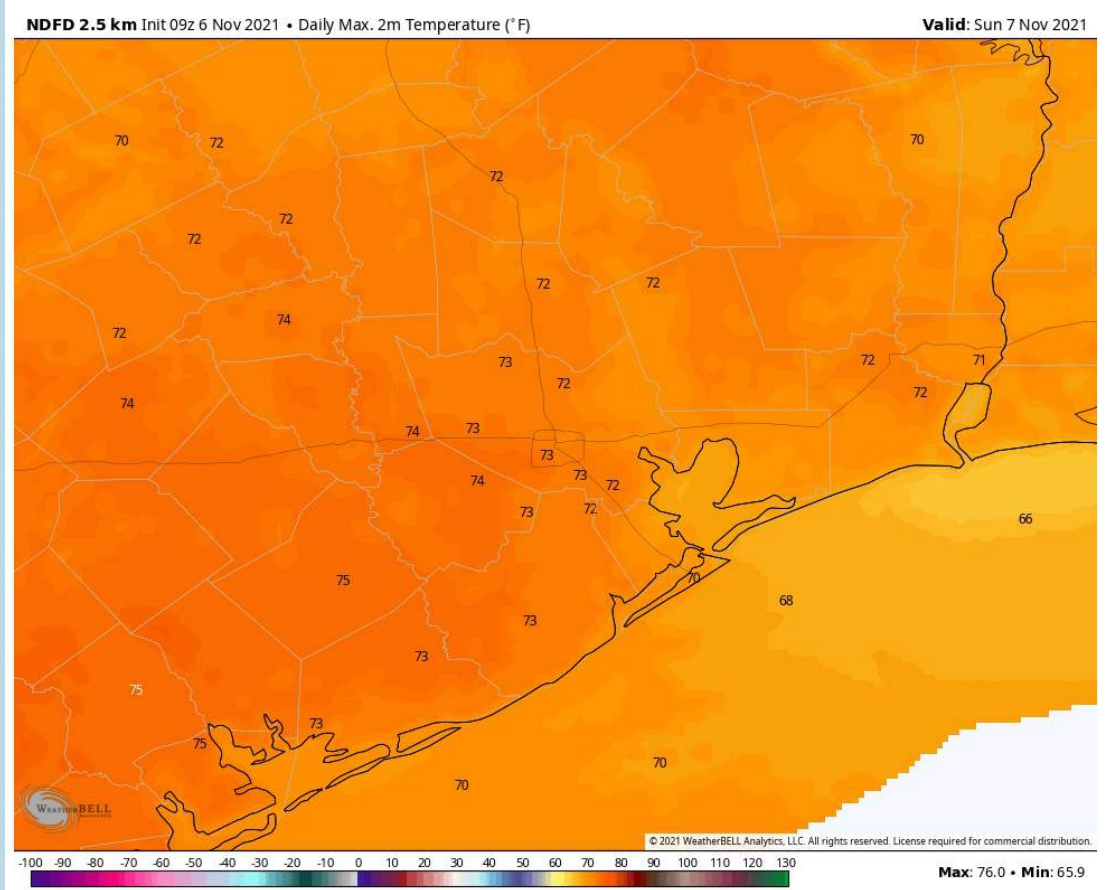
Sustained Winds (12 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (11 AM CT)



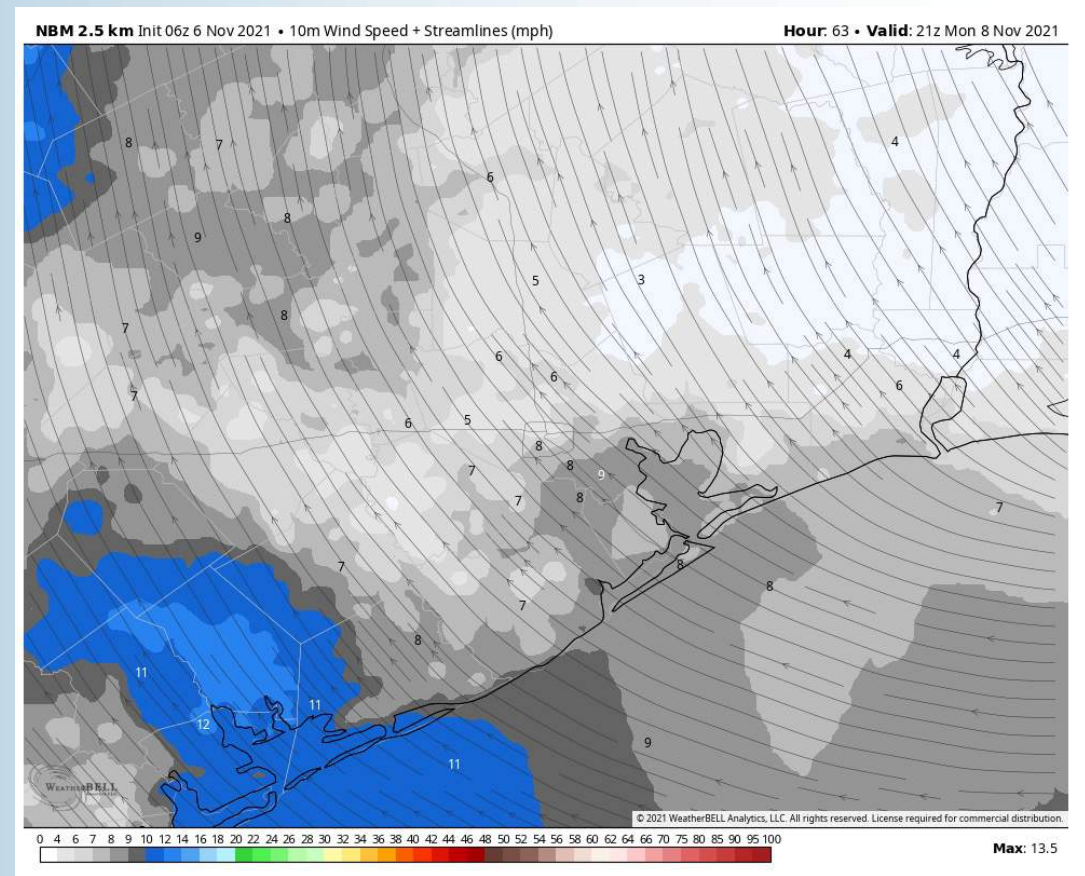
High Temperatures Sunday



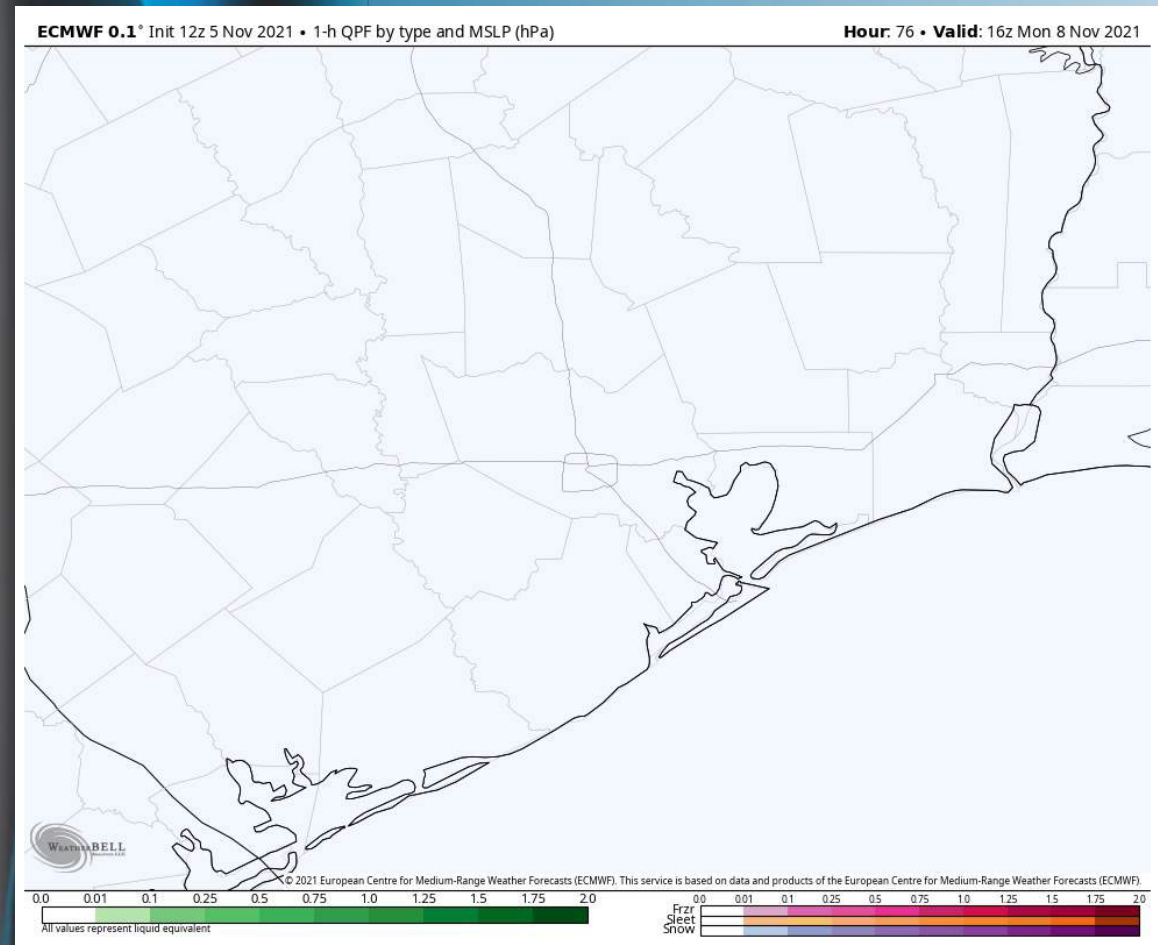
Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Dry stretch expected to continue for Monday.
- Winds look to be sustained around 5 – 10 MPH out of the SE throughout the day on Monday.
- High temps on Monday look to be in the mid 70s.
- **Currently not anticipating fog for Monday, keeping an eye on potential fog N of our stations.**

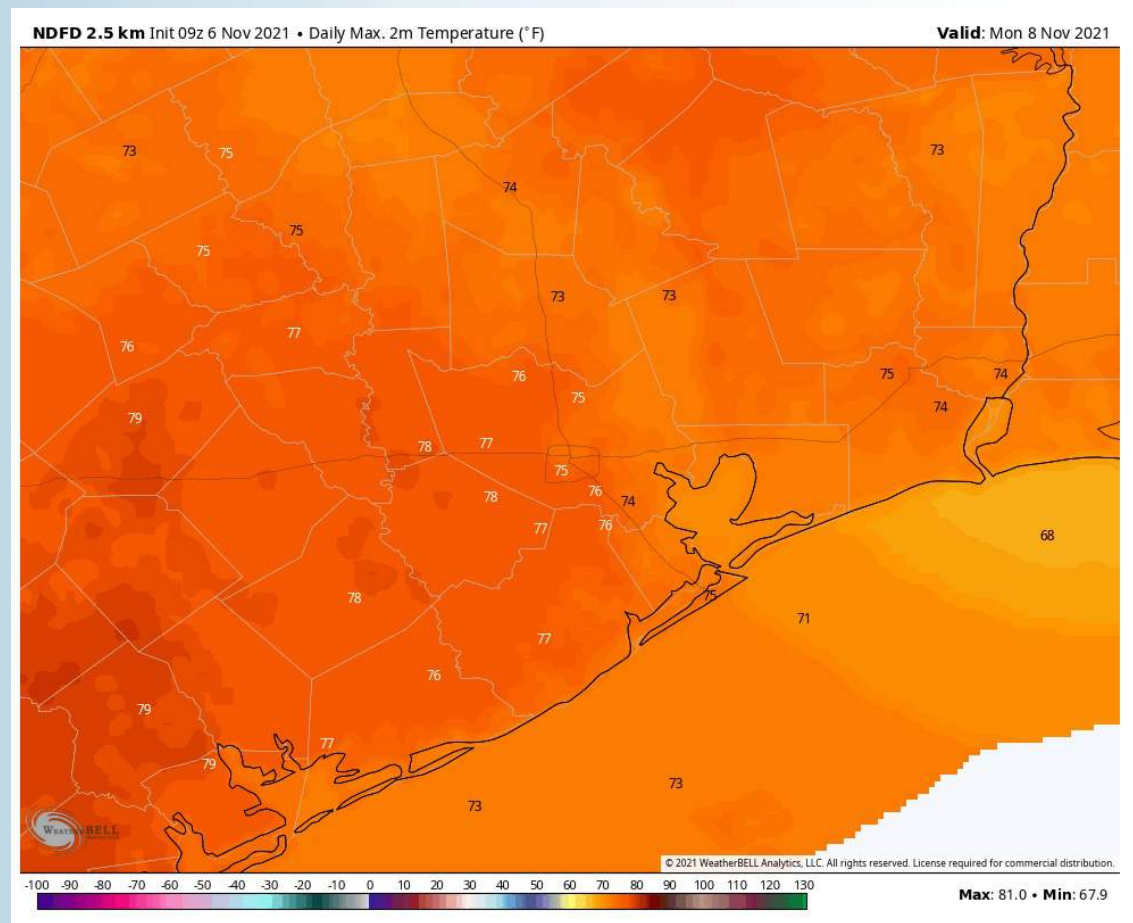
Sustained Winds (3 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (11 AM CT)



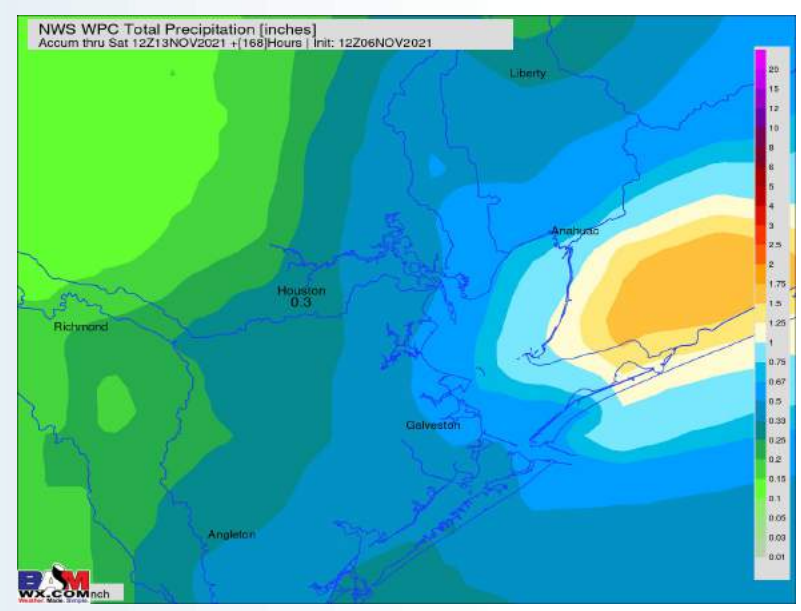
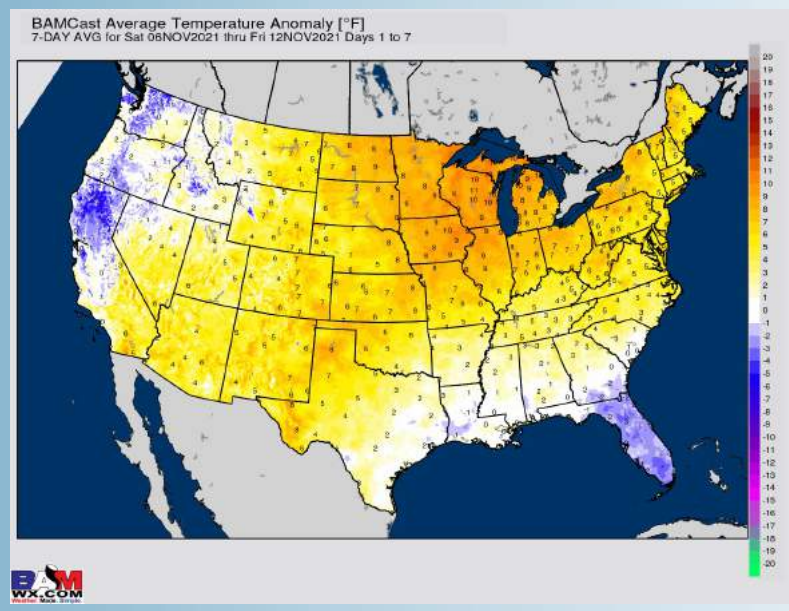
High Temperatures Monday



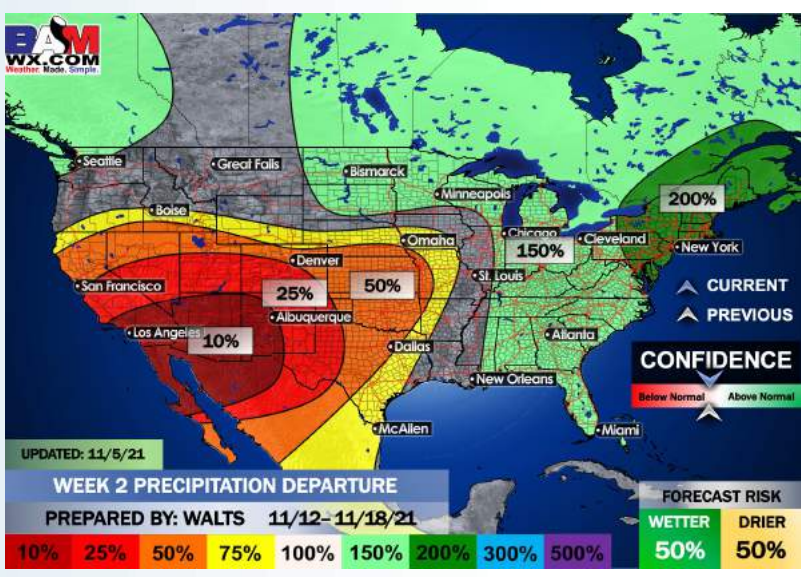
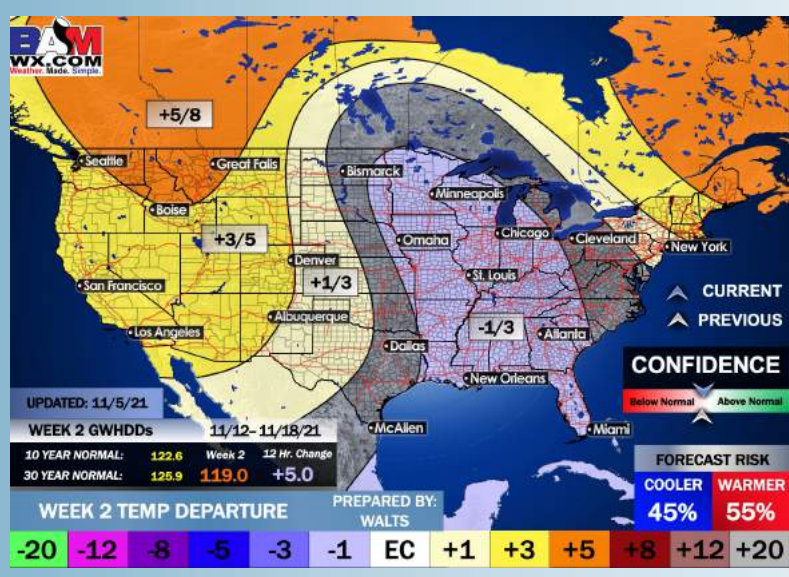
Long-Range Forecast Discussion

- The main weather feature in the next 7 days will be an approaching cold front on THU. A few scattered chances will be possible Wed before more widespread moisture on THU. As is typical with passing of cold front, will need to watch for an uptick in winds THU evening into Friday.
- The week 2 timeframe is expected to have near normal to slightly below normal risks for temp and precip. Not eyeing a specific threat for a tropical storm or hurricane at this distance.
- Right now we are favoring near normal temperatures for the back half of November with slightly above normal precipitation risks. Tropical threats look quite minimal as we get towards the end of the season.
