

Keeping an eye on fog potential for inland stations Sunday AM.







Forecast Discussion

- Precip:** An overall dry day today with very light precipitation chances entering in the overnight hours past midnight tonight.
- Wind:** Sustained winds for the AM and early PM hours 5-10 MPH with gusts to 15 MPH possible for the boarding station. After about ~3PM sustained winds closer to 10-15 MPH for the boarding station through midnight with gusts 15-20 MPH possible. Winds generally continue out of the SE.
- Temps:** High temperatures today look to be in the mid to upper 70s.
- Visibility:** Not favoring fog for our stations, continuing to favor fog to stay E and N of our stations.


Sim Radar Snapshot: 3 PM CT

Precip: Anticipating overall dry conditions for Wed. A ~20% chance for a few isolated showers in the midday to mid PM timeframe. Coverage looks to be rather minimal.


Wind: Sustained winds in the AM 5-10 MPH for the boarding station with gusts to 20 MPH. Sustained winds look to pick up closer to 13-18 MPH for most of our stations after ~noon. Gusts 18-23 MPH possible at the boarding station through midnight. Winds generally coming out of the S/SE.

Temps: High temperatures look to be in the mid to upper 70s.


Visibility: Currently not favoring fog for our stations on Wednesday.

Forecast Discussion


Precip: Anticipating arrival of cold front in the early AM hours 3-4 AM, bringing showers and possible thunderstorms through the 6-8 AM timeframe. A brief heavier downpour cannot be ruled out. Expecting dry conditions for the rest of our day.

Wind: Sustained winds in the AM with the passage of the front 15-20 MPH with gusts 20-25 MPH at the boarding station. Winds remain elevated through ~1PM, slowly decreasing in the PM hours around 10-15 MPH for the boarding station with gusts to 20 MPH possible through midnight. Winds out of the SW in the AM before the front, switching to a NW flow with the passage of the front, and remaining out of the N/NW for the rest of the day.


Temps: High temperatures Thu look to be in the mid to upper 70s.

Visibility: No fog expected on Thu, however, brief reduced visibility will be possible in the AM under a heavier storm.


Sim Radar Snapshot: 4 AM CT










Houston Pilots: Tue. 11/09/2021



- The main weather feature in the next 7 days will be an approaching cold front on THU bringing showers to the area, quieting down for the rest of the week. Temps the next 7 days will be near normal to slightly above normal.
- The week 2 timeframe is expected to have above normal risks for temps and below normal risks for precip.
- Right now, we are favoring slightly below normal temperatures and precipitation risks for the back half of November.
