

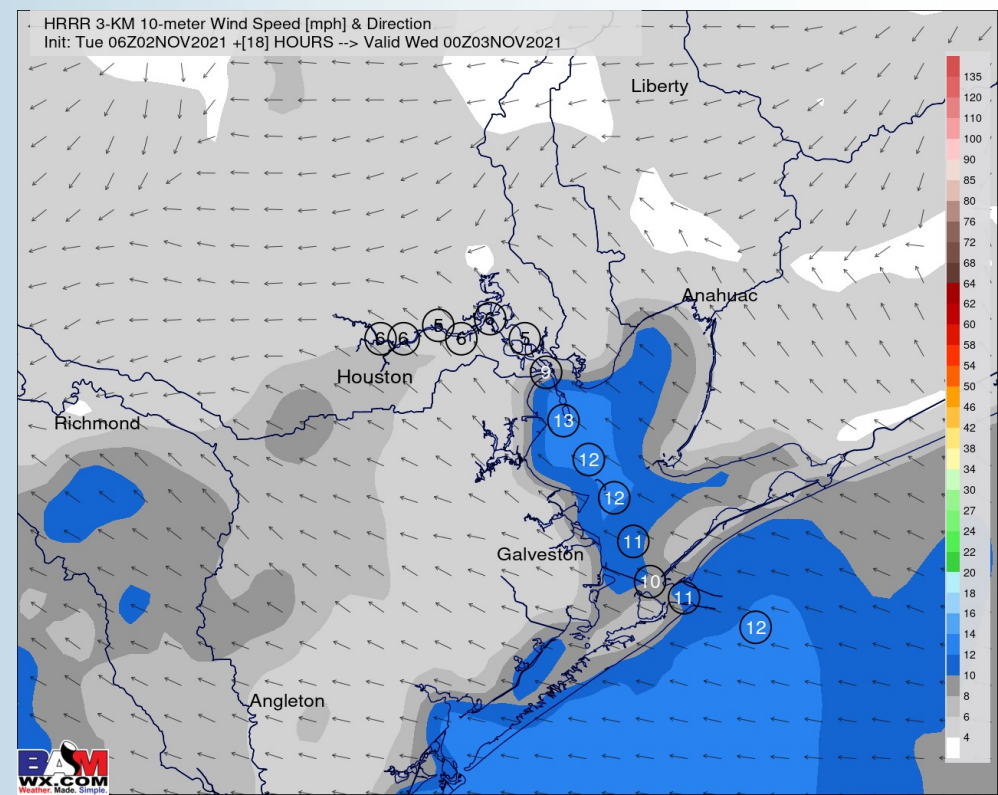

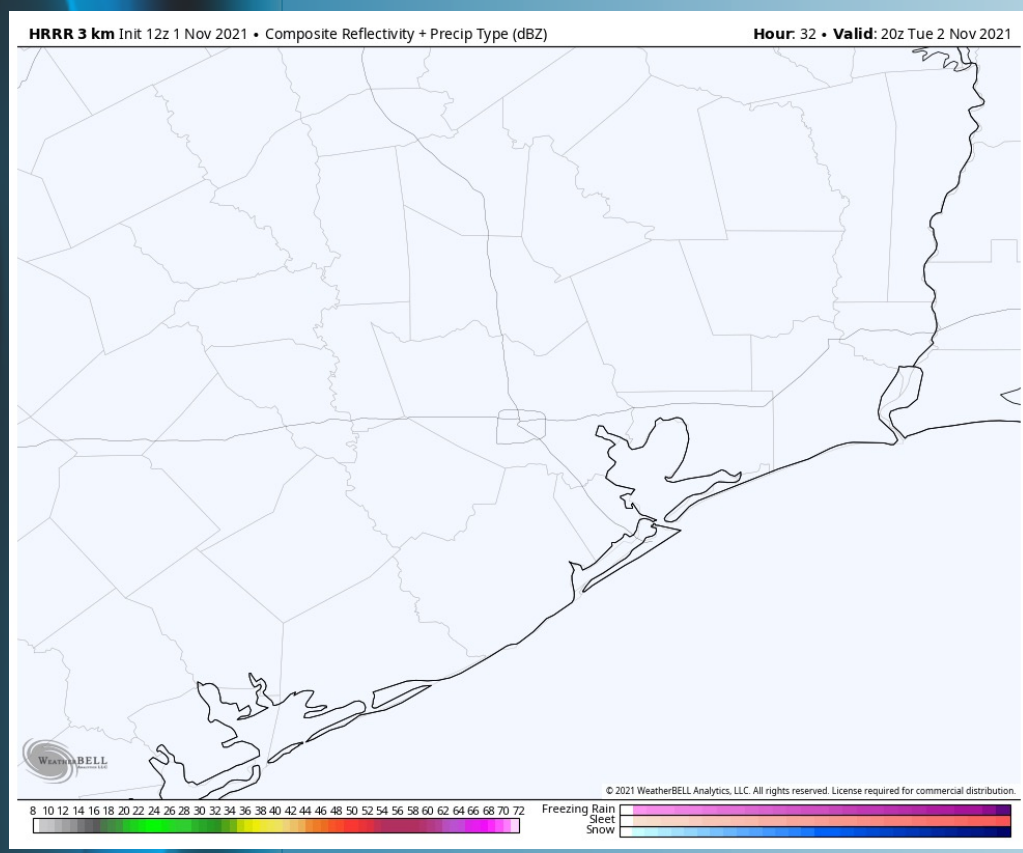
Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Dry stretch we have been seeing the past few days expected to continue today.
- Sustained winds 5-10 MPH for the AM, closer to 8-13 MPH after noon for the boarding station. Gusts to 15 MPH for the boarding station in the evening/night hours will be possible. Winds generally coming out of the E for most of today with a bit more of a SE wind near ~ 4 PM.
- High temps look to be in the upper 70s to low 80s.
 - Any fog is favored to stay north of our locations this AM.

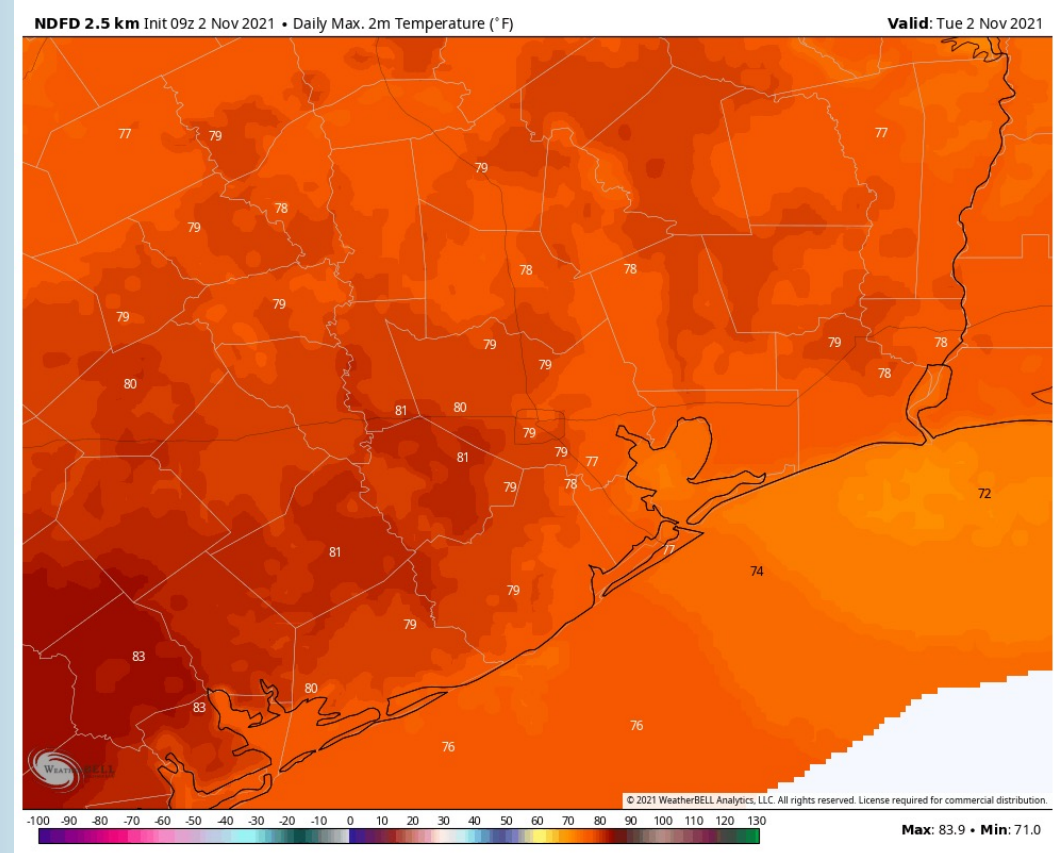
Sustained Winds (7 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (3 PM CT)



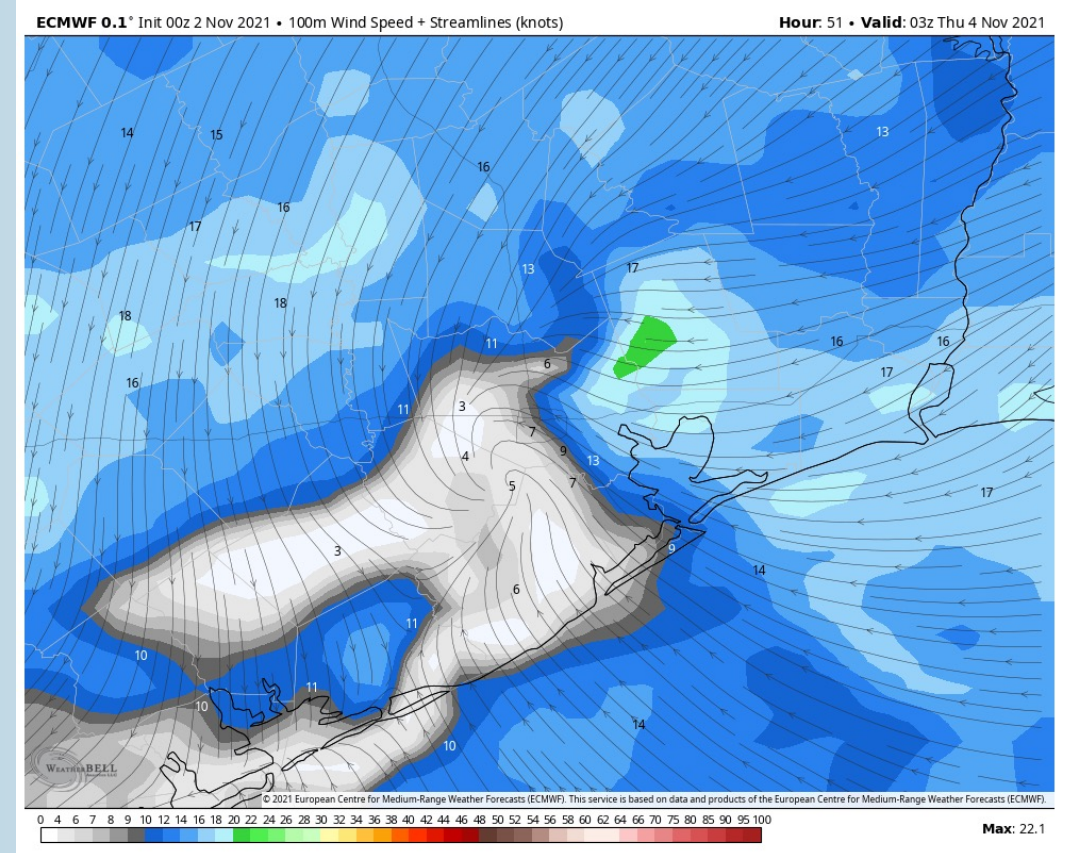
High Temperatures Today



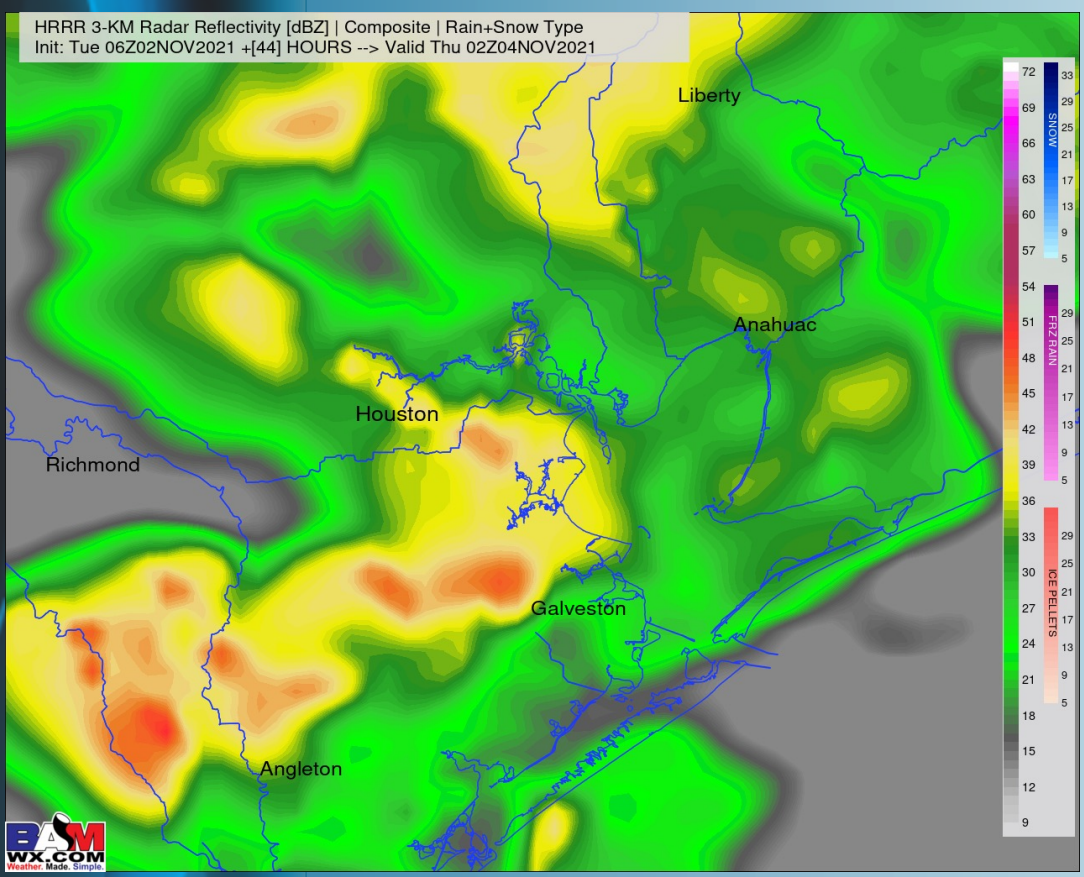
Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- A very stray shower cannot be ruled out starting around Noon (~20%). Dry conditions are expected for the AM and mostly dry conditions for the PM hours on Wed as a cold front brings in showers and thunderstorms to the area beginning in the nighttime hours, continuing through the overnight. Still some disagreement on timing, eyeing the 8 - 11PM timeframe for front arrival. Lightning and a locally heavier downpour will be possible as the front pushes through.
- Sustained winds 10-15 MPH in the AM hours, gusts to 15-20 MPH for the boarding station with winds generally coming out of the E. As the front pushes through in the evening/night hours, sustained winds 13-18 MPH at the boarding station with gusts 18-23 MPH will be possible.
- High temps Wed look to be in the mid to upper 70s.
 - **Not expecting fog for our stations on Wed.**

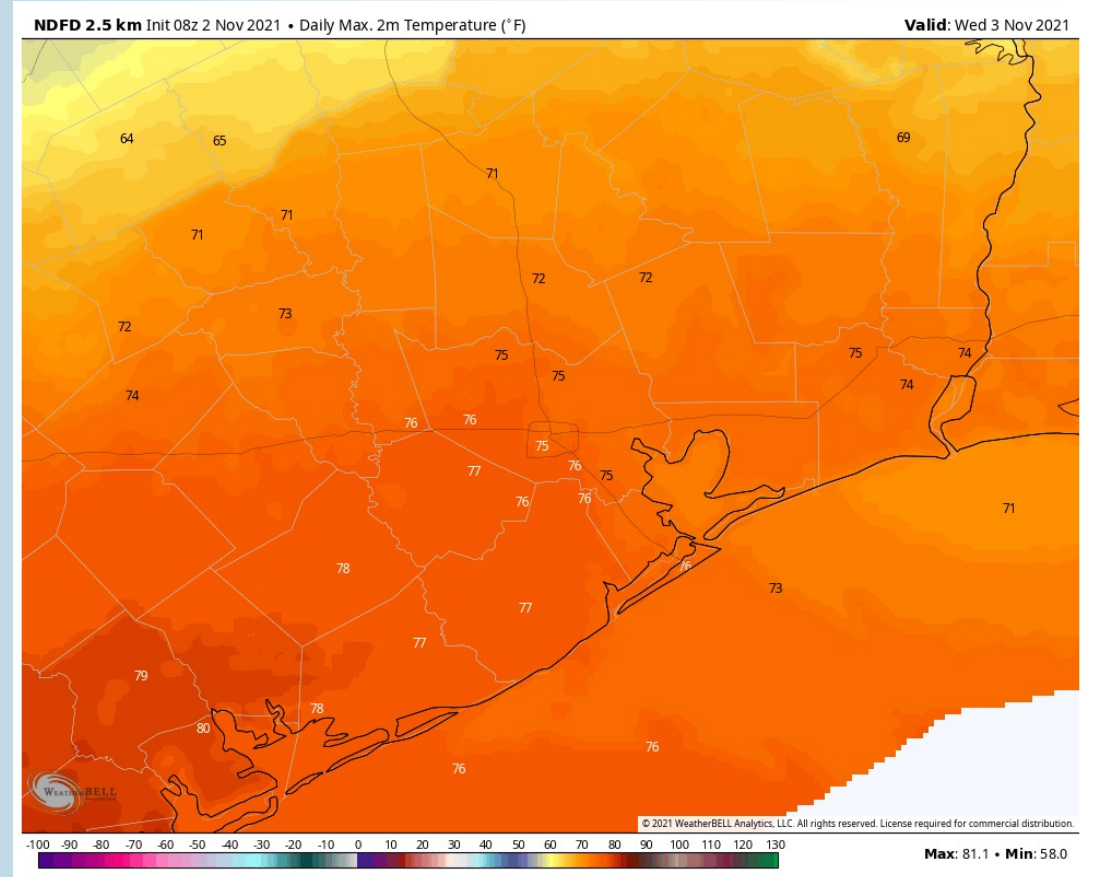
Sustained Winds (9 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (9 PM CT)



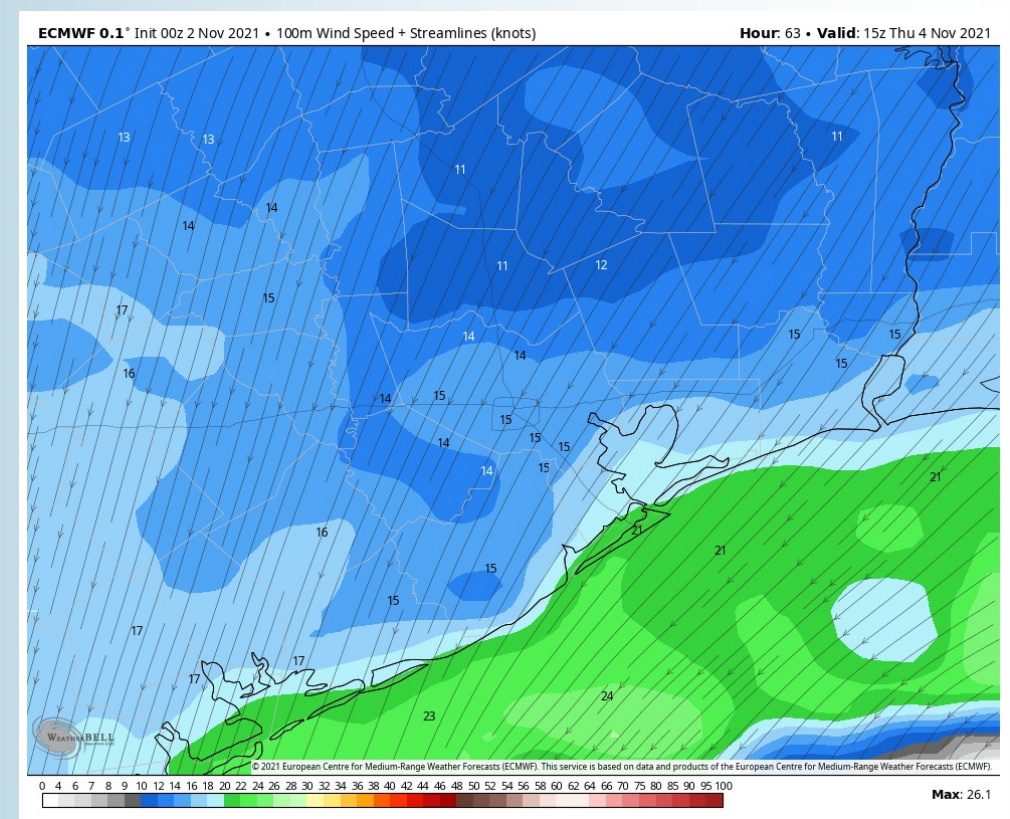
High Temperatures Wednesday



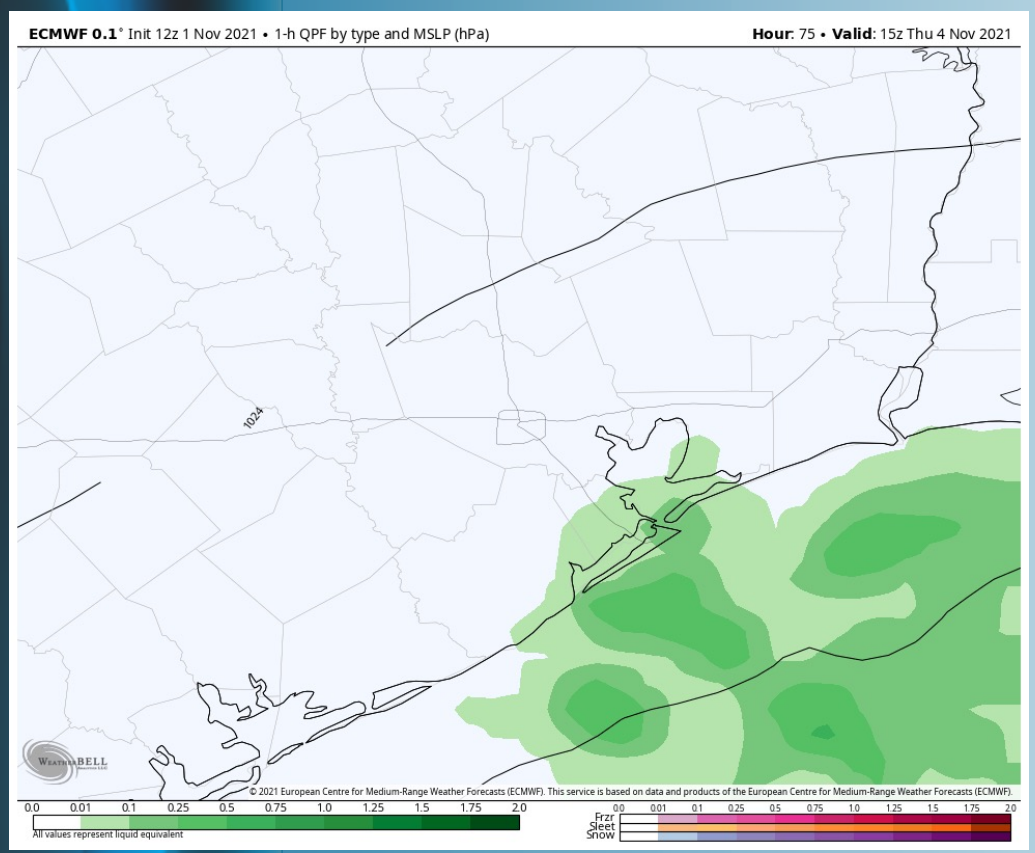
Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Showers and possible thunderstorms continuing through the AM hours of Thursday with lightning and locally heavier downpours still possible. Anticipating to be clear by the late AM/noon timeframe and dry conditions for the PM hours.
- Winds will be the strongest in the AM hours of Thursday. From 5 AM to Noon, sustained winds of 18-23 MPH will be possible calming to 15-20 MPH beyond Noon. Gusts to 30 MPH possible in the AM for the boarding station, 20-25 MPH in the PM. Winds generally coming out of the NNE.
- High temps Thu look to be in the low to mid 60s.
- **Fog is not expected; however, low visibility will be possible under a heavier shower/storm.**

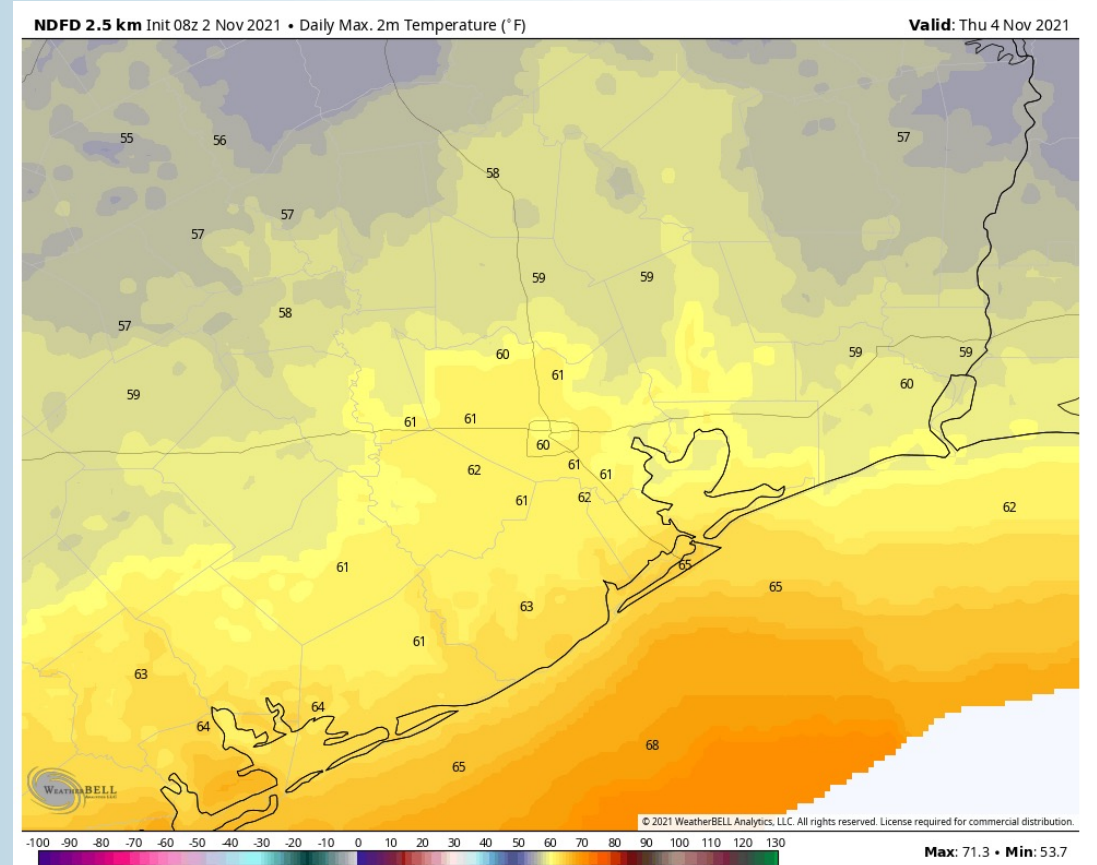
Sustained Winds (10 AM CT)



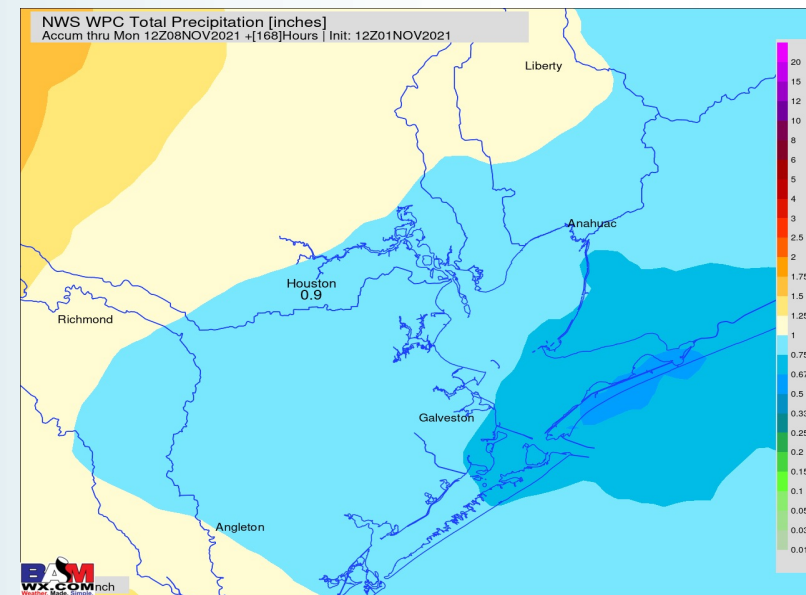
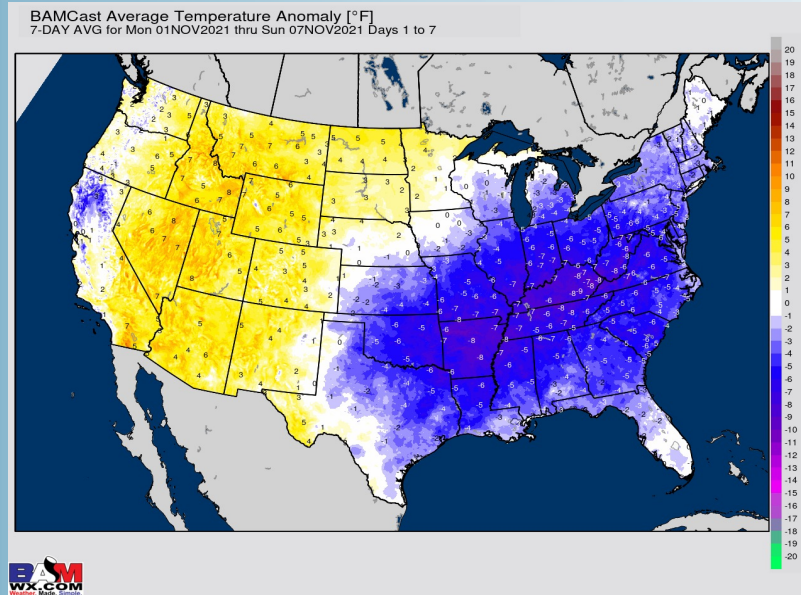
Simulated Radar Snapshot (10 AM CT)



High Temperatures Thursday



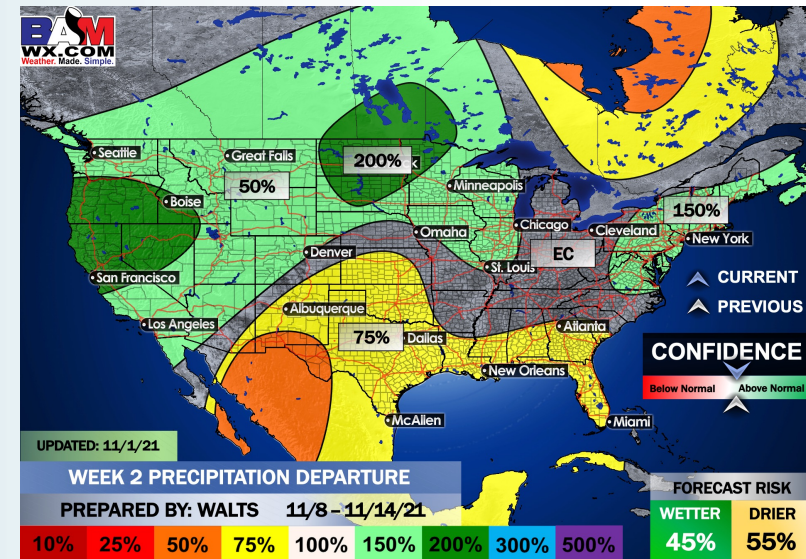
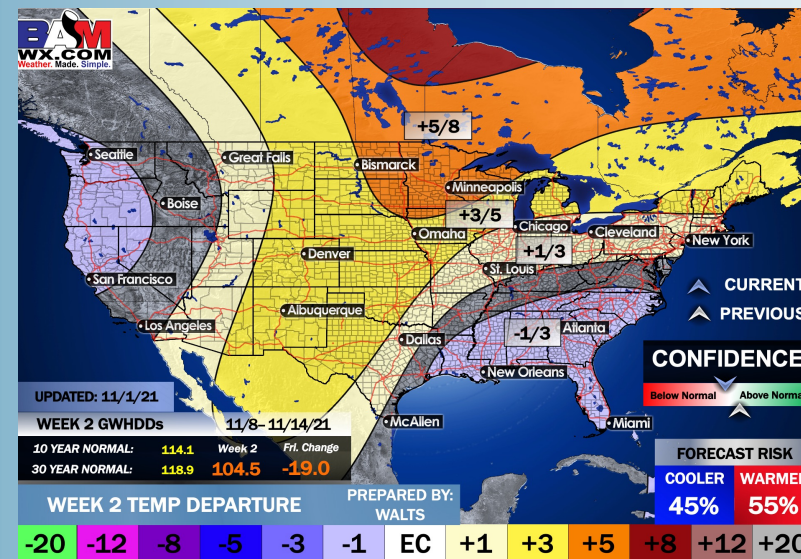
Week 1 Forecast



Long-Range Forecast Discussion

- Even with the upcoming front in the late Wed – early Thu period, this week still looks overall quite and featuring much more dry time than not. Pockets of heavier rain will be possible with this front. Temperatures will average out below normal for the upcoming week.
- The week 2 timeframe is expected to have near normal to slightly below normal temps with below average risks for precip. Not eyeing a specific threat for a tropical storm or hurricane at this distance.
- Right now, we have risks for slightly below average temps and about average precip for the first half of November. Tropical risks are on the lower side, but not a threat that should be 100% eliminated.
