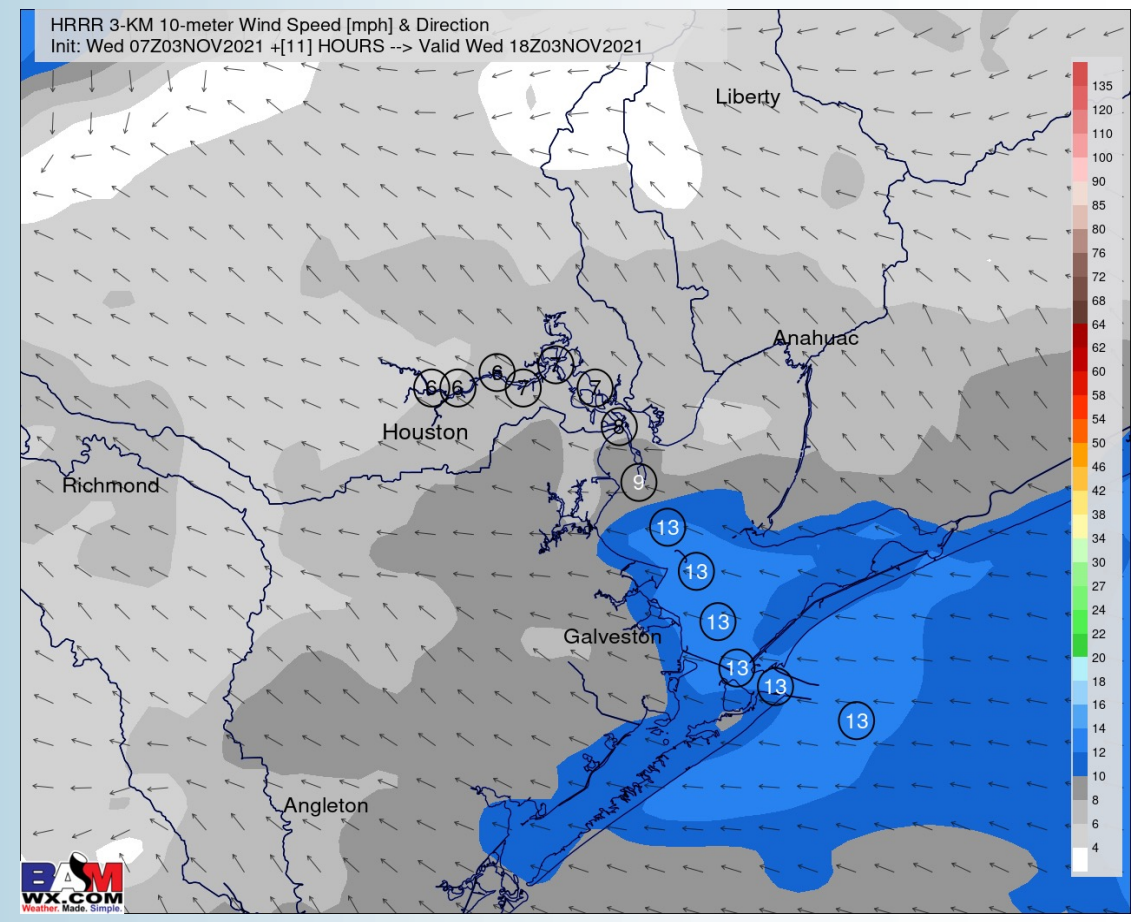

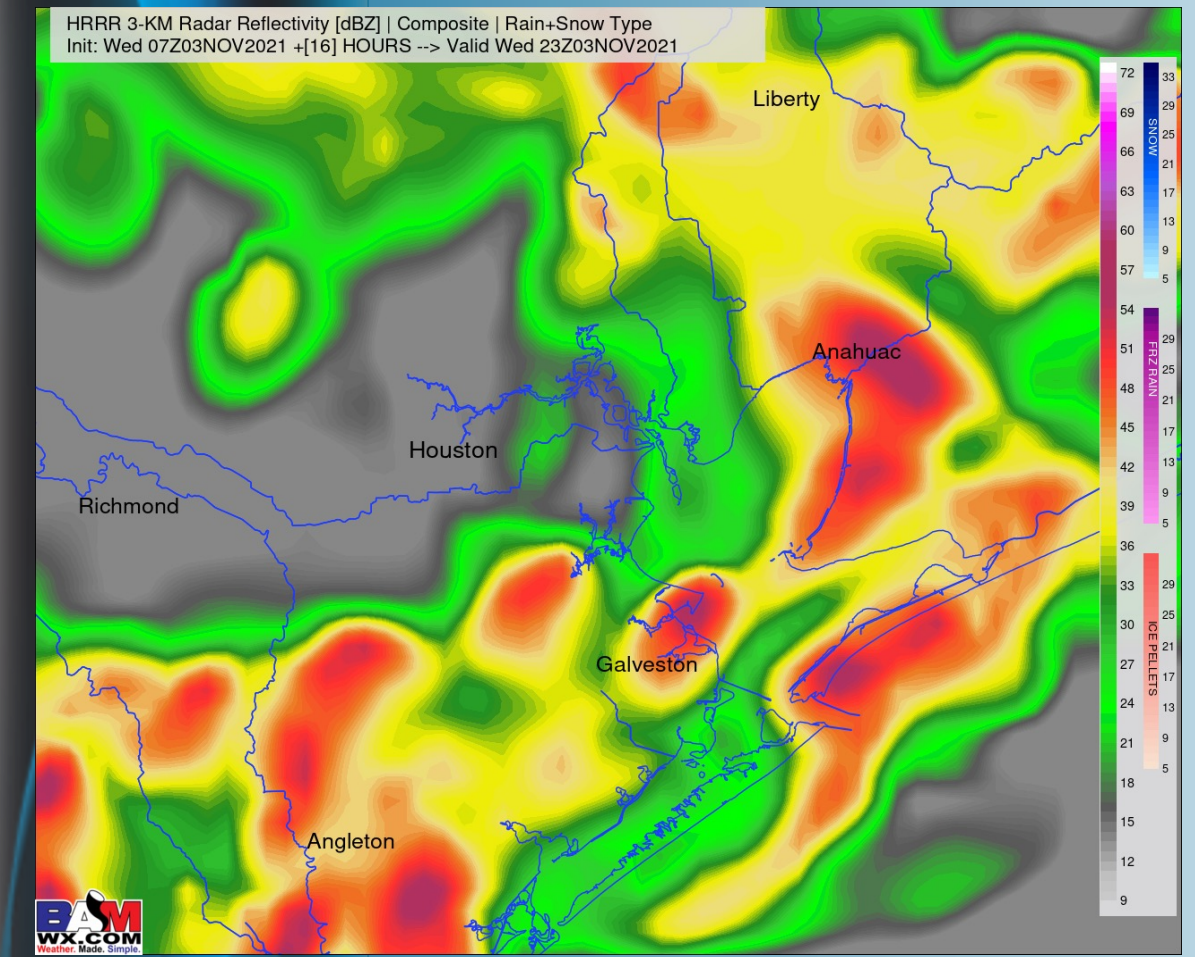
## Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Dry conditions are expected for the AM and early PM hours, however a few scattered showers/thunderstorms starting in the area around the 3-4PM timeframe will be possible. Arrival of the main front anticipated to be in the 8 – 10 PM timeframe. Showers and thunderstorms continue through the night and overnight hours as the front pushes through. Lightning and a locally heavier downpour will be possible as the front pushes through.
- Sustained winds 10-15 MPH are favored for much of the day with gusts 15-20 MPH for the boarding station possible. Winds will generally coming out of the E. As the front reaches the area, sustained winds of 15-20 MPH at the boarding station with gusts 20-25+ MPH possible through the night/overnight with the strongest storms .
  - High temps look to be in the mid to upper 70s.
  - **Not expecting fog for our stations.**

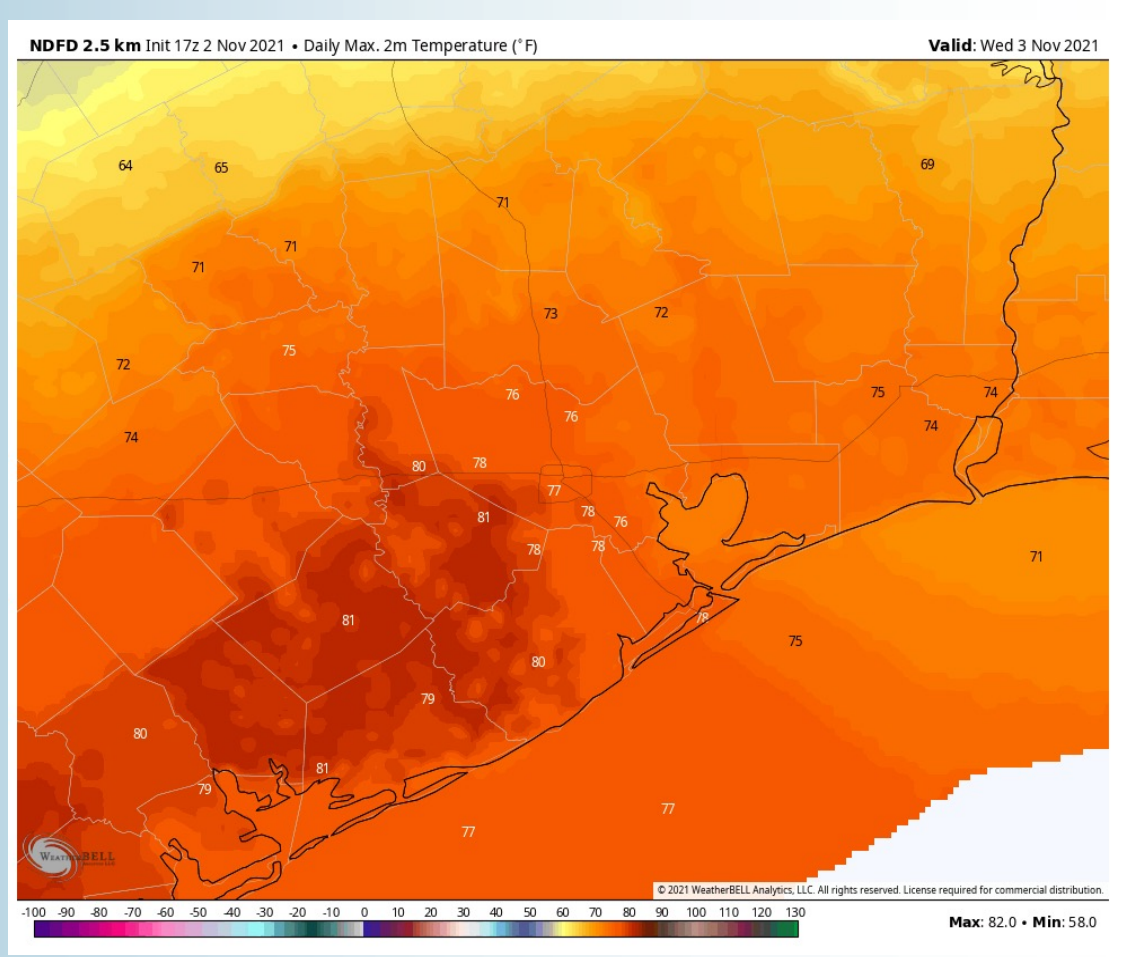
## Sustained Winds (1 PM CT)



## Simulated Radar Snapshot (9 PM CT)



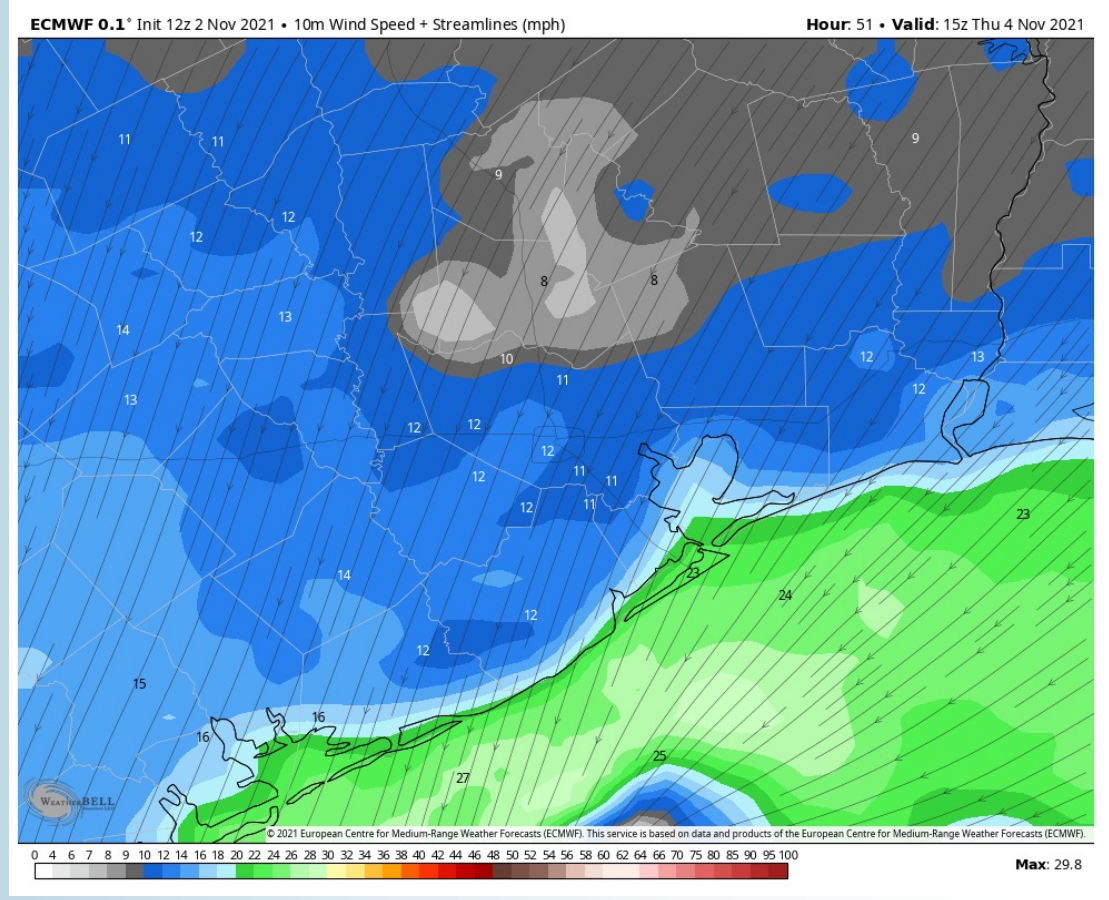

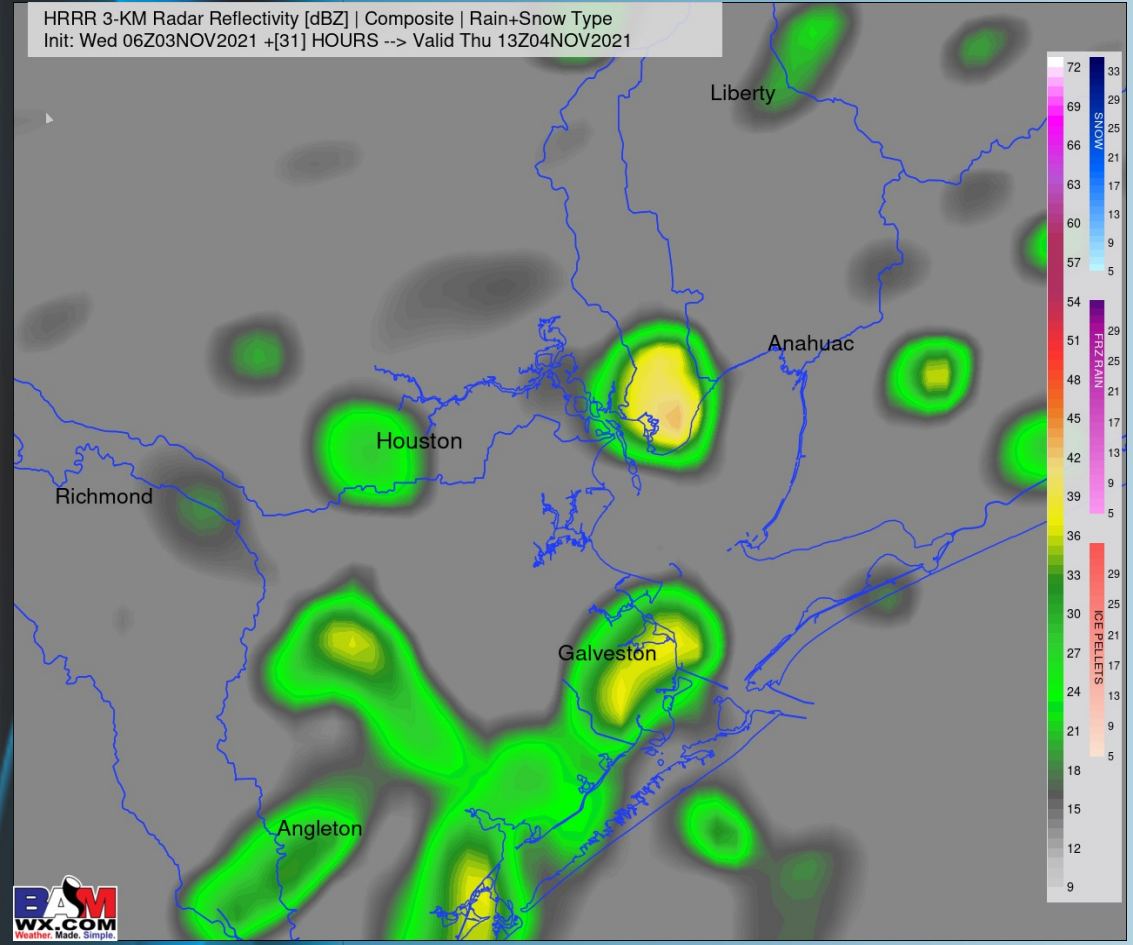
## Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- **A few scattered showers and possible rumbles of thunder continue through the AM hours of Thursday. Anticipating to be clear by the late AM/noon timeframe and dry conditions for the PM hours.**
- **Winds will be the strongest in the AM and early PM hours of Thursday. From 5 AM to ~2PM, sustained winds of 18-23 MPH will be possible calming to 15-20 MPH beyond this period. Gusts to 30 MPH possible in the AM for the boarding station, 20-25 MPH after ~2 PM. Winds generally coming out of the NNE.**
- **High temps Thu look to be in the low to mid 60s.**
- **Fog is not expected; however, low visibility will be possible under a heavier shower/storm.**

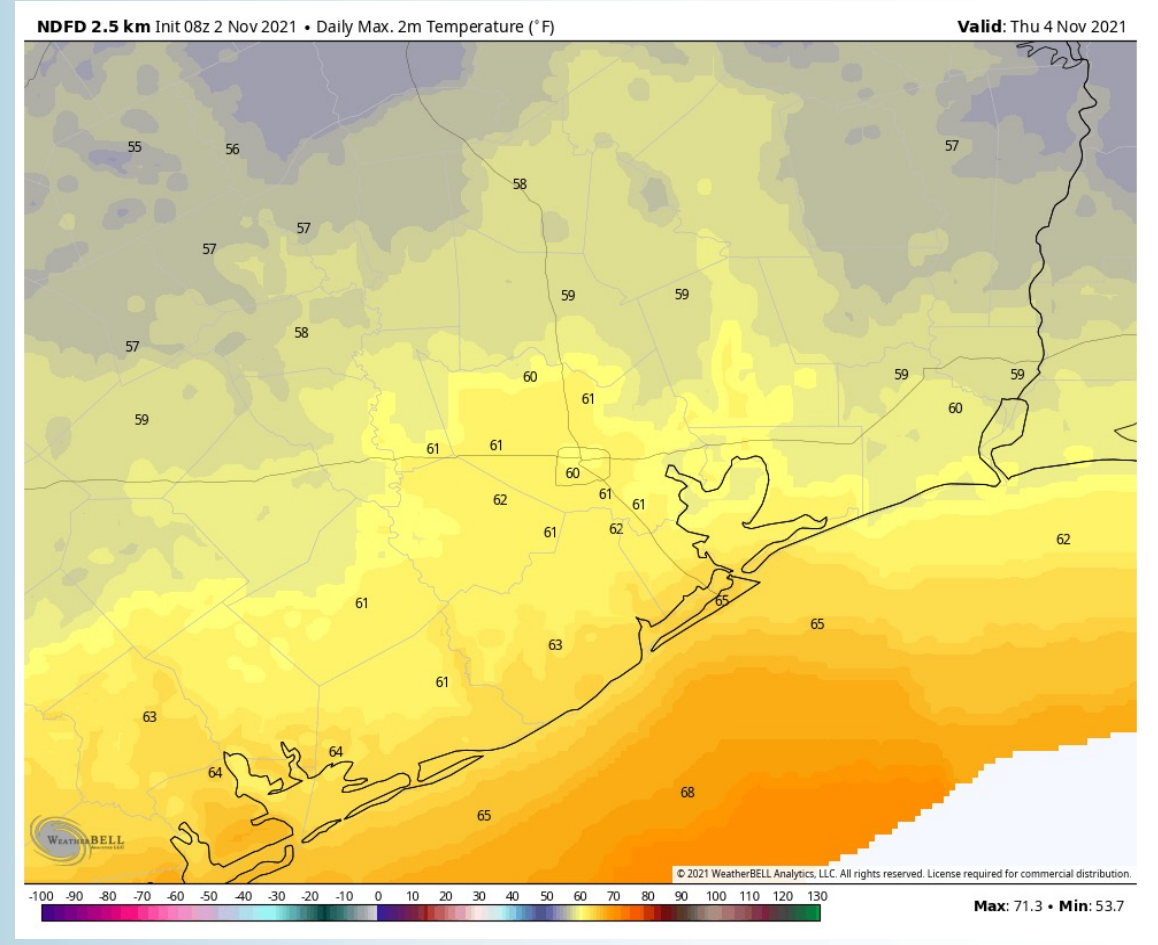
## Sustained Winds (10 AM CT)



## Simulated Radar Snapshot (8 AM CT)



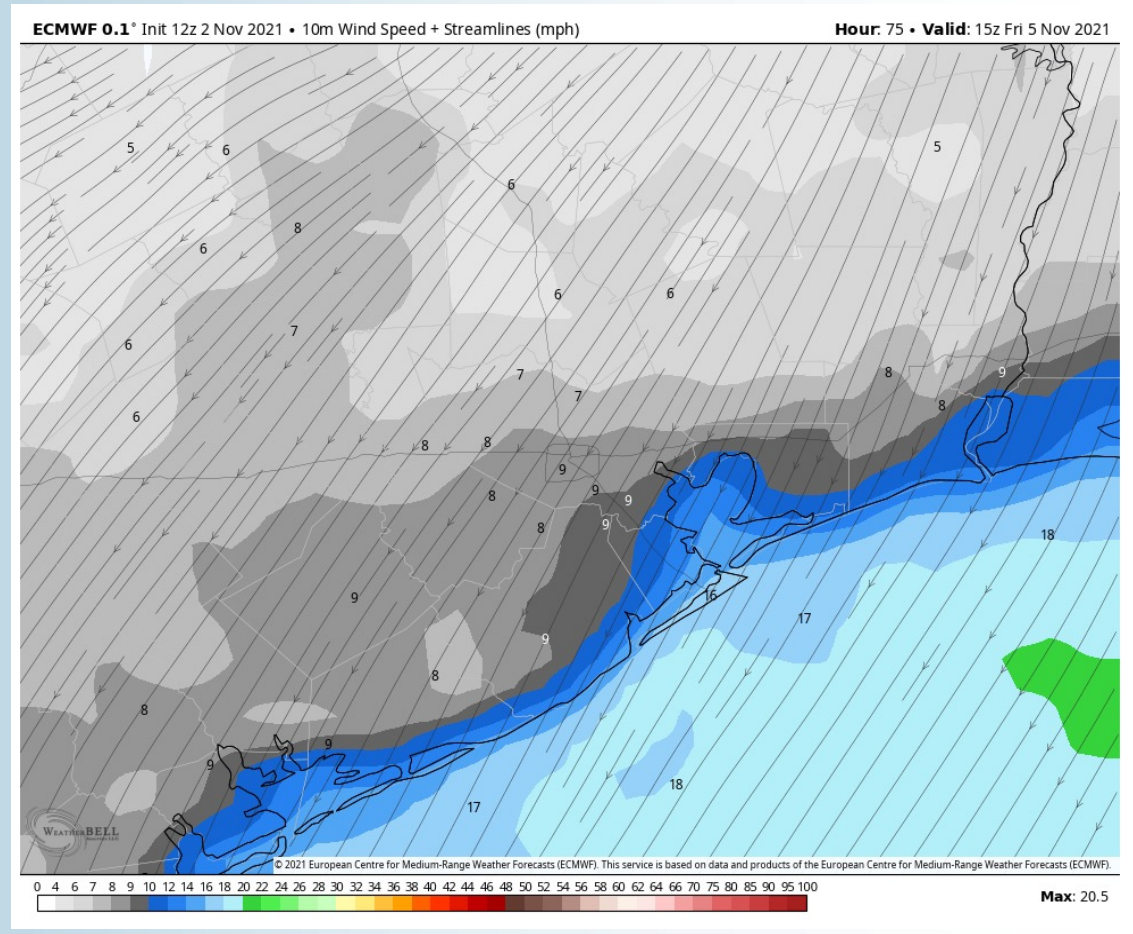

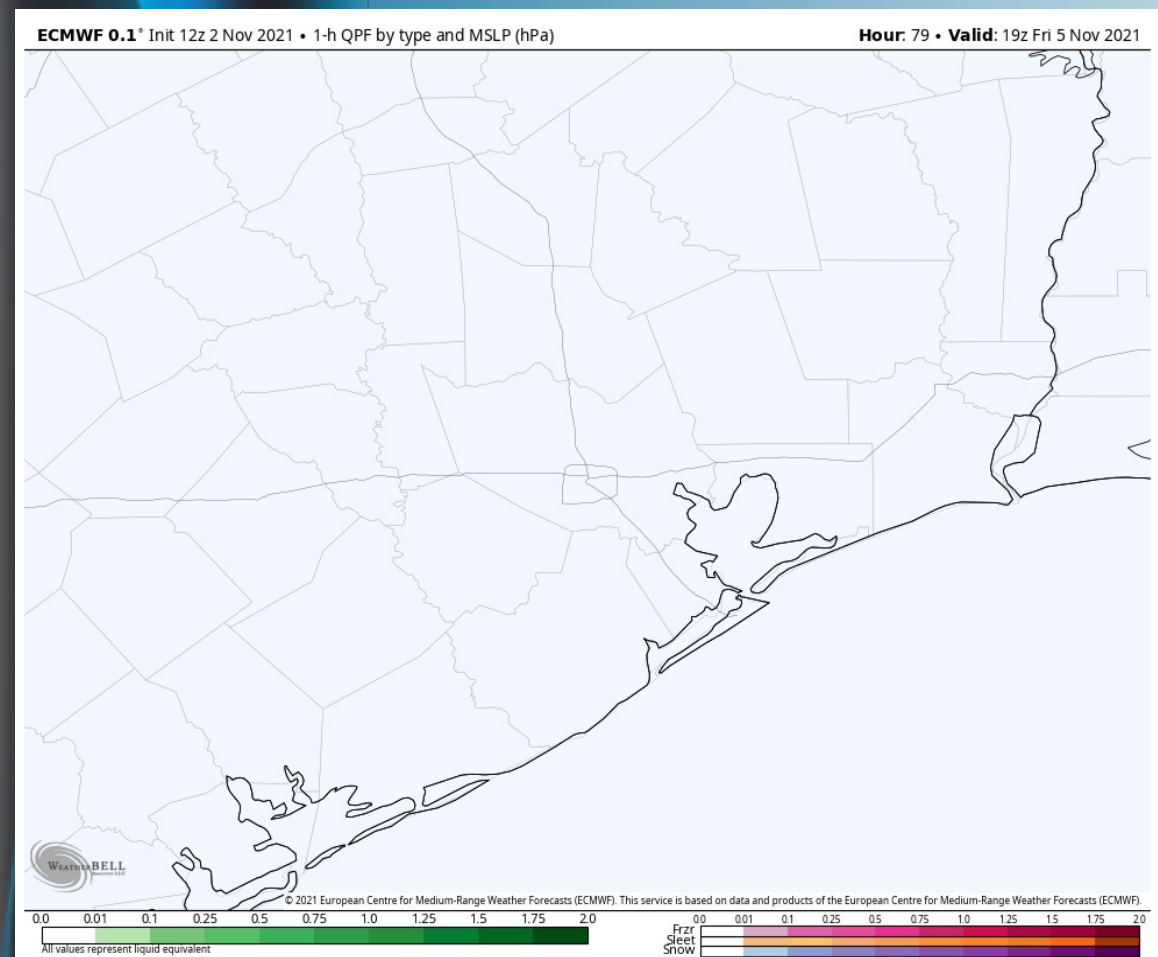
## Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Dry conditions are anticipated for our stations on Friday.
- Winds slowly calm on the day Fri, sustained 15-20 MPH in the AM for the boarding station with gusts to 25 MPH possible. By 10 AM, winds look to be 10-15 MPH with gusts to 20 MPH. Winds coming out of the NNE for Fri.
- High temps Friday look to be in the low to mid 60s.
- **Fog is not anticipated for Friday.**

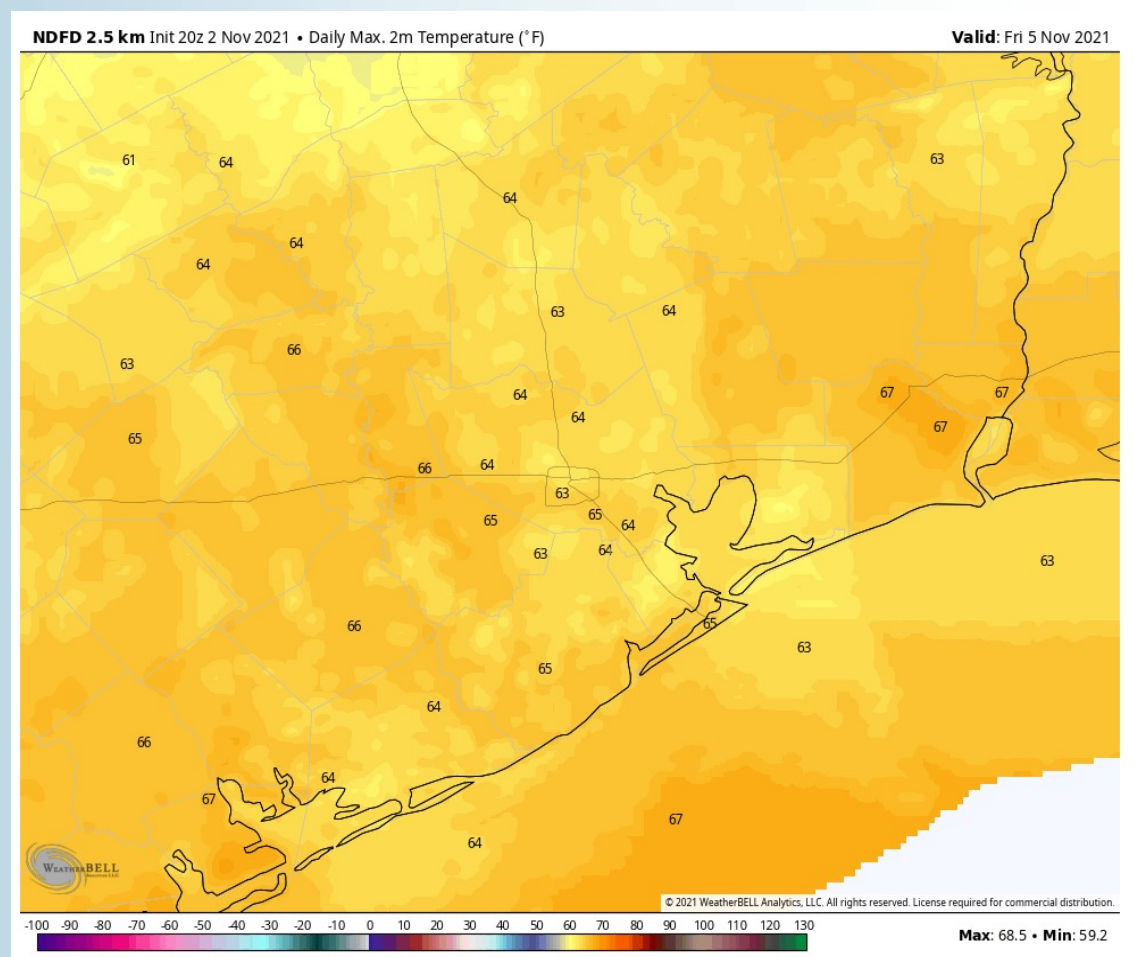
## Sustained Winds (10 AM CT)



## Simulated Radar Snapshot (2 PM CT)



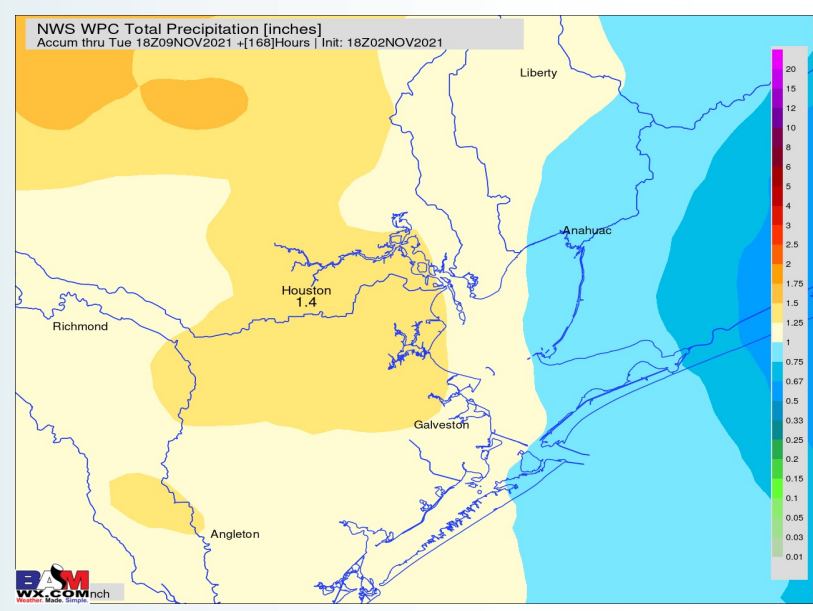
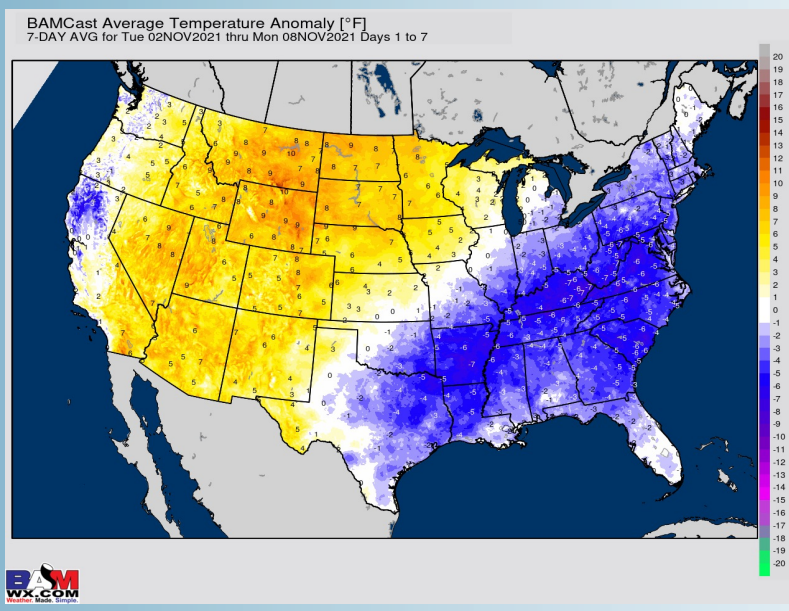

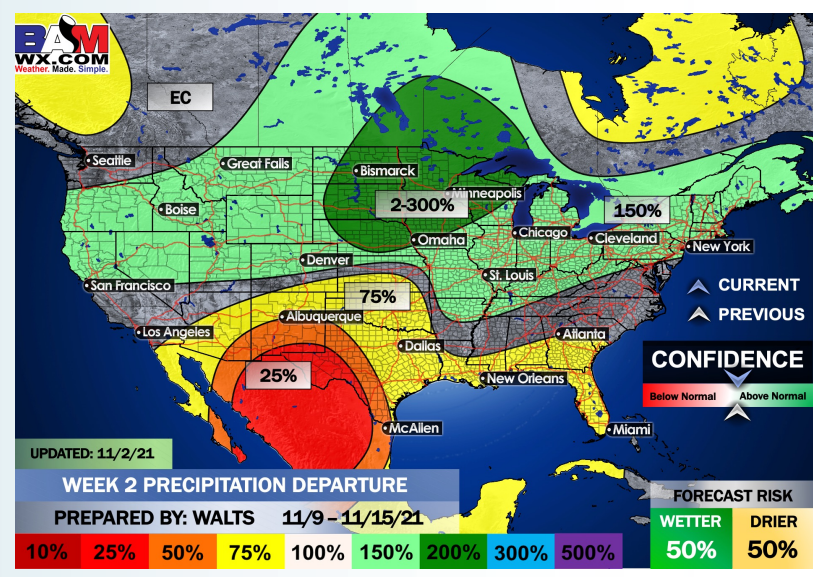
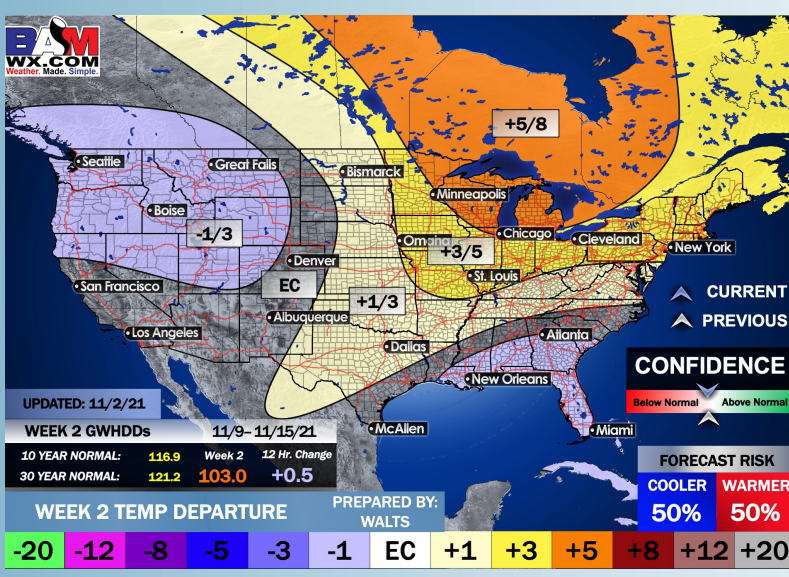
## Long-Range Forecast Discussion

- Even with the upcoming front in the late Wed – early Thu period, this week still looks overall quite and featuring much more dry time than not. Pockets of heavier rain will be possible with this front. Temperatures will average out below normal for the upcoming week.
- The week 2 timeframe is expected to have near normal temps with below average risks for precip. Not eyeing a specific threat for a tropical storm or hurricane at this distance.
- Right now, we have risks for slightly below average temps and slightly above average precip for the first half of November. Tropical risks are on the lower side, but not a threat that should be 100% eliminated.
