

Houston Pilots Extended Range Visibility Report



Friday, 11/26/21

Not anticipating fog for our stations on Fri. Elevated winds out of the north look to continue into Fri morning.



Saturday, 11/27/21

Continuing to keep an eye on light winds that could aid in fog potential and some data that suggests fog near our stations, but currently not anticipating fog to impact our stations Sat AM.



Sunday, 11/28/21

Not anticipating fog for our stations on Sun, briefly reduced visibility will be possible however with showers/thunderstorms in the early morning hours.

Forecast Discussion



Precip: Anticipating dry conditions to continue for our stations on Tuesday.

Wind: Sustained winds for most of Tuesday 10-15 MPH at the boarding station with gusts to 18 MPH possible through sundown. After around sundown, winds look to pick up closer to 15-20 MPH with gusts to 25 MPH at the boarding station continuing into the overnight. Winds out of the ENE in the AM, veering to a SE flow by noon for the PM.


Temps: High temperatures Tuesday look to sit in the upper 60s to low 70s F.

Visibility: Currently not favoring fog for our stations on Tuesday.



Precip: Anticipating dry conditions to continue for our stations on Wednesday.

Wind: Sustained winds 13-18 MPH out of the SE continue into Wednesday and for most of the day at the boarding station, closer to 10-15 MPH by the 10-11 PM timeframe. Gusts 18-23 MPH possible at the boarding station through nighttime.


Temps: High temperatures Wednesday look to sit in the mid 70s F.

Visibility: Not anticipating fog at our stations on Wednesday.

Forecast Discussion



Precip: Anticipating showers/thunderstorms to begin in the mid to late morning hours with the arrival of the cold front to the Hou area and continue through sundown. Lightning and a heavier downpour will be possible with any cell.

Wind: Sustained winds 13-18 MPH out of the SE at the boarding station in the AM and early PM hours with gusts 18-23 MPH through noon. Still some uncertainty with exact timing of the front/wind shift but anticipating sustained winds to pick up 20-30 MPH out of the north at the boarding station by the 5-6 PM timeframe with gusts 30-40 MPH possible through midnight.


Temps: High temperatures Thu look to sit in the low to mid 70s F.

Houston Pilots: 11/23/21



- Quiet conditions anticipated for the first half of the week before a front works through on our Thanksgiving Thursday. Temps look to average out to near normal this week.
- The week 2 timeframe is expected to have above normal temperatures and slightly above normal risks for precip.
- Right now, we are favoring slightly above normal risks for temperatures and near normal to slightly above normal risks for precip for the first half of December.
