


## Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Data has trended a bit weaker with precip chances this AM as coverage looks to be lighter and a little more spotty than first thought. Pockets of drizzle/very light rain will continue to be possible out through about ~11 AM in a hit/ miss nature.
- Winds will gradually subside as the day goes on, however will stay elevated this AM. Out through ~11 AM, winds of 18-23 MPH with gusts 23-28 MPH will be possible at the boarding station coming out of the NE. Winds the rest of the afternoon/evening look to sit 13-18 MPH with gusts to 20 MPH possible.
  - High temps look to be in the low 60s.
- **Fog is not expected; however, low visibility will be possible under pockets of precipitation this morning.**


## Sustained Winds (11 AM CT)



## Simulated Radar Snapshot (8 AM CT)






## Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Dry conditions are anticipated for our stations on Friday.
- Winds slowly calm on the day Fri, sustained 13-18 MPH in the AM for the boarding station with gusts to 20 MPH possible. By 10 AM, winds look to be 10-15 MPH. Winds coming out of the NNE for Fri. Winds expected to be slightly weaker for the northern most stations.
- High temps Friday look to be in the mid 60s.
  - **Fog is not anticipated for Friday.**


## Sustained Winds (7 AM CT)



## Simulated Radar Snapshot (2 PM CT)






## Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- **Fog is not favored for Saturday.**


## Sustained Winds (1 PM CT)





## Simulated Radar Snapshot (4 PM CT)



## Long-Range Forecast Discussion

- Temperatures will be below normal the next few days with the passage of a cold front tonight. Temperatures begin to warm up above normal SUN – MON through next WED. Precipitation will be mainly confined to precipitation with the cold front with an overall inactive stretch.
- The week 2 timeframe looks to feature below normal temperatures and below normal precipitation risks. Not eyeing any tropical threats at the moment.
