

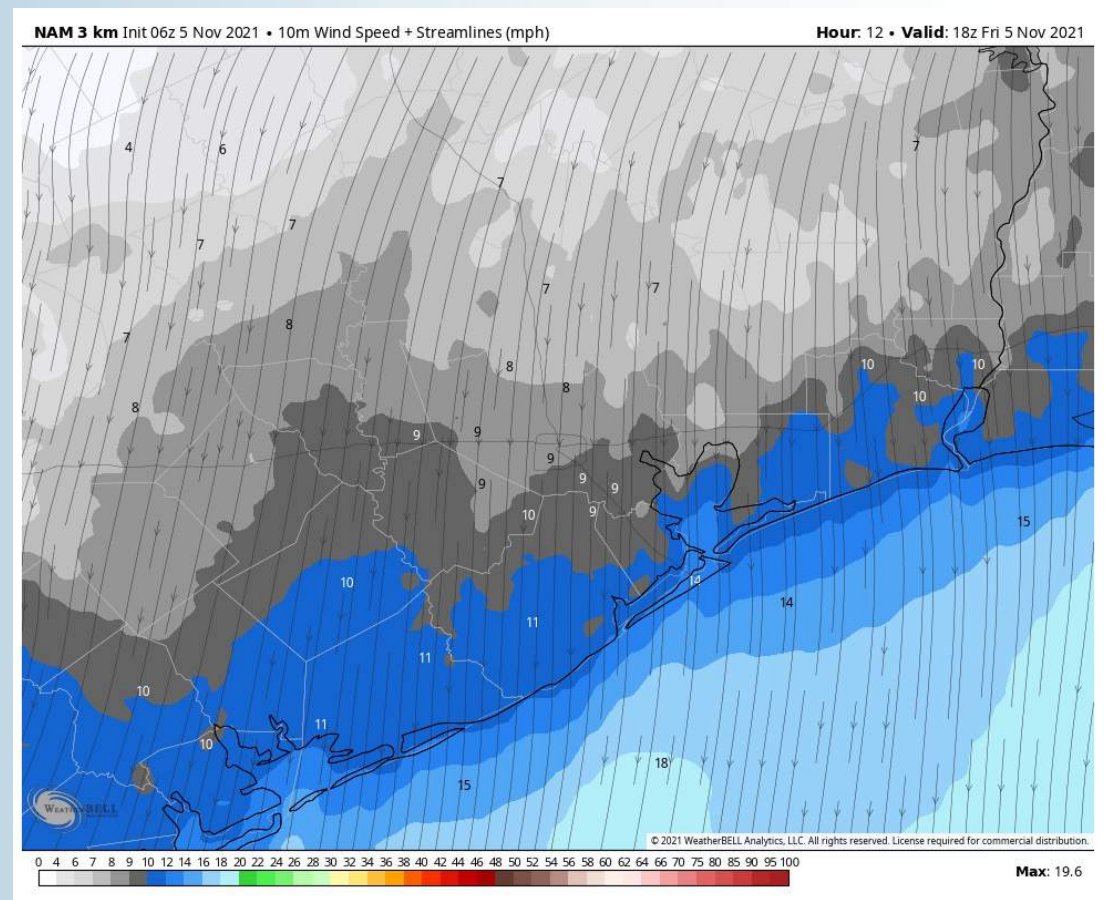

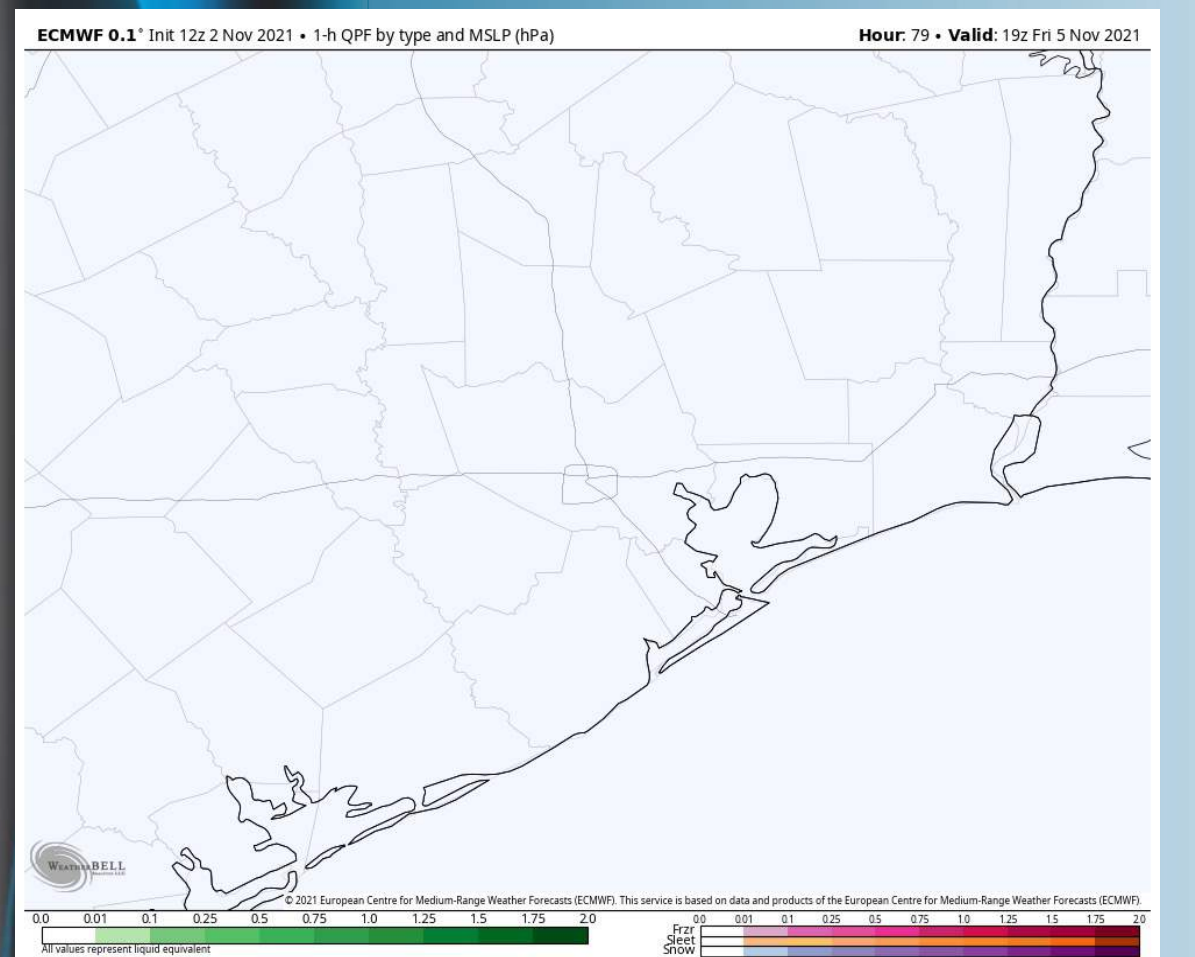
Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- **Dry conditions are anticipated for our stations on Friday.**
- **Winds slowly calm down throughout the morning. By 10 AM winds should be sustained around 10 – 15 MPH with gust around 20 MPH possible. Heading into the afternoon winds will generally be around the 8 – 13 MPH sustained range although it may be closer to 15 MPH at times closer to the boarding station. Winds will remain out of the NNE throughout the day.**
- **High temps Friday look to be in the mid 60s.**
- **Fog is not anticipated for Friday.**

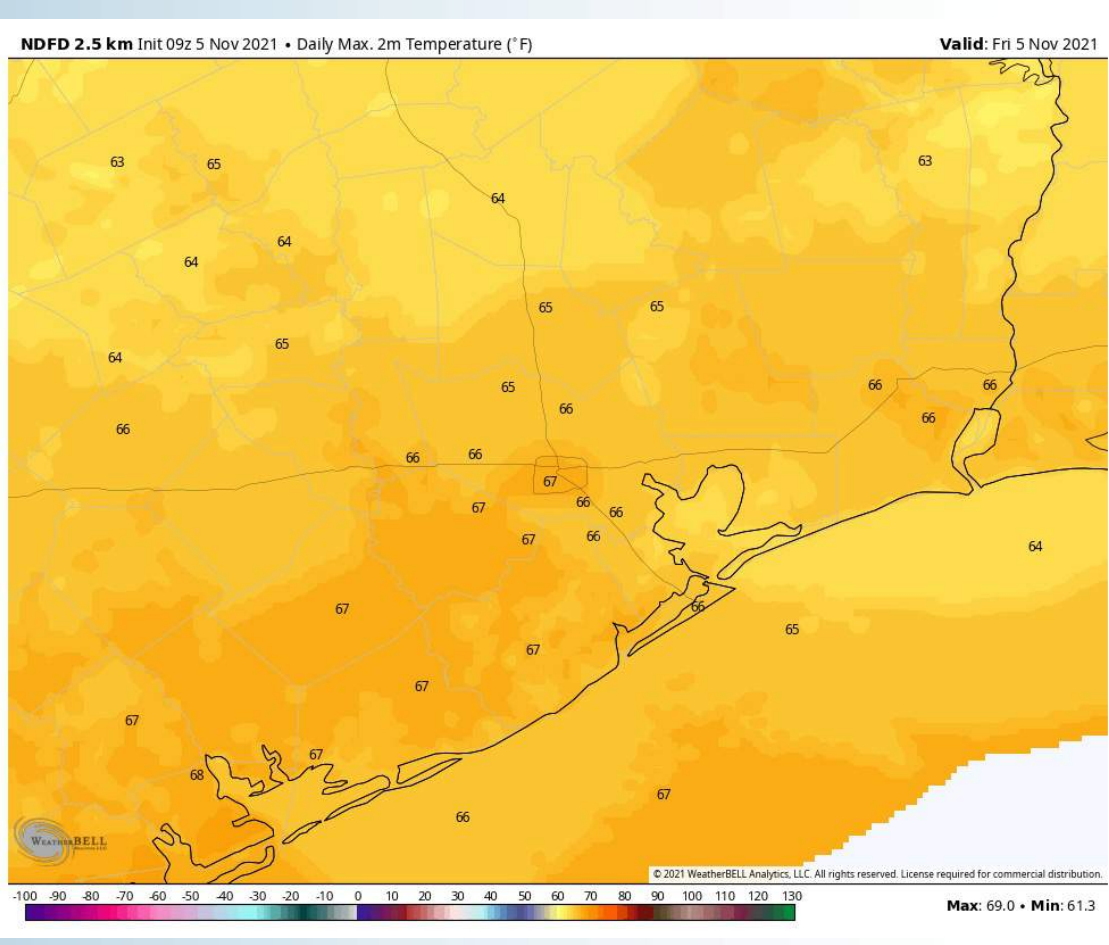
Sustained Winds (1 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (2 PM CT)



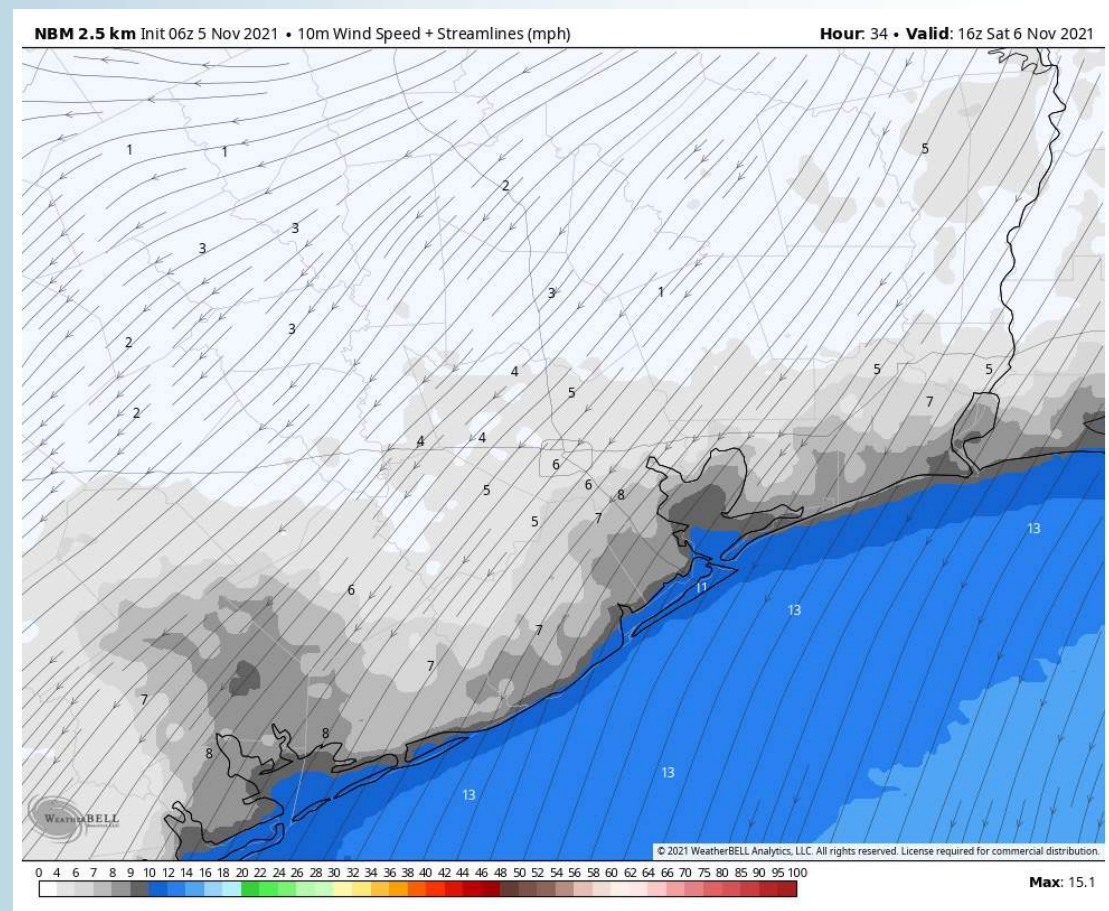
High Temperatures Friday



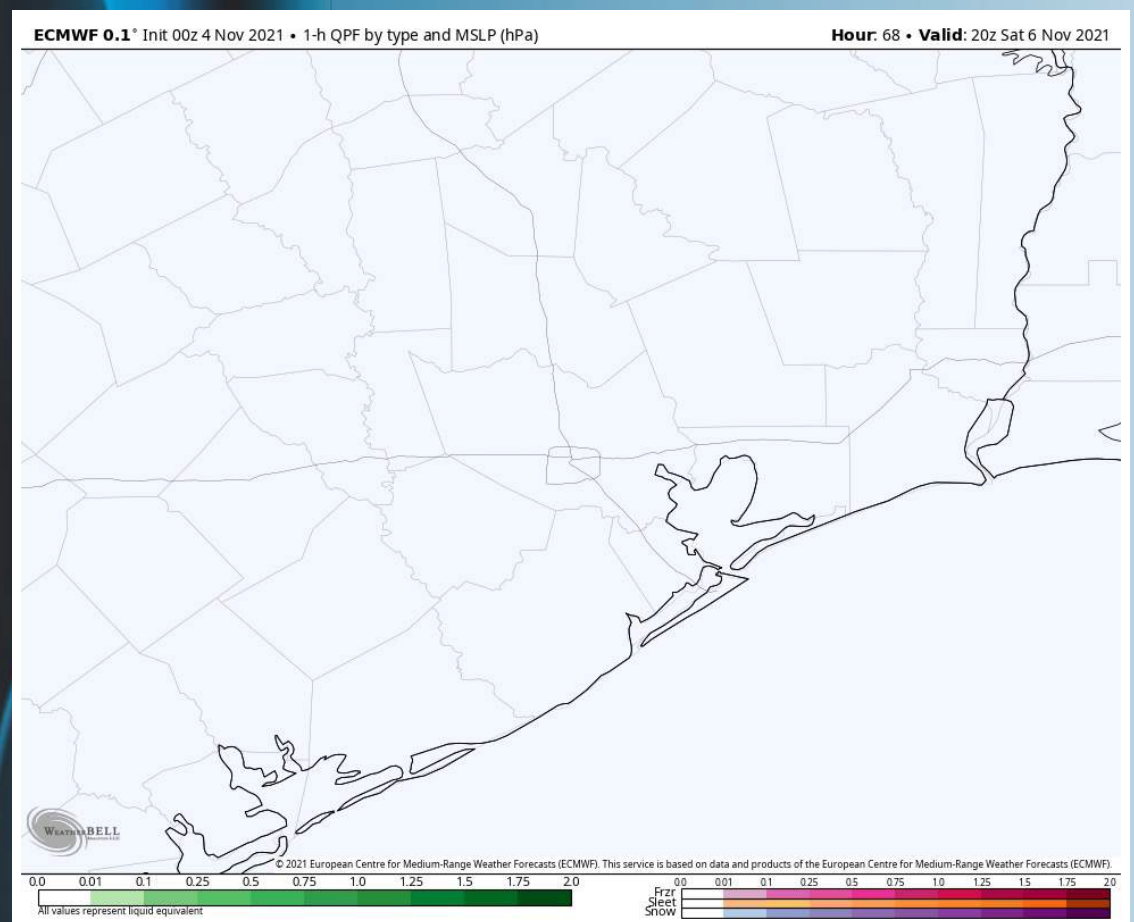
Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Saturday is expected to be quiet.
- Winds will be slowly calming down throughout the day generally staying out of the NE around 5 – 10 MPH. Gusts around 15 MPH possible.
- High temps will sit in mid to upper 60's F.
- **Fog is not favored for Saturday.**

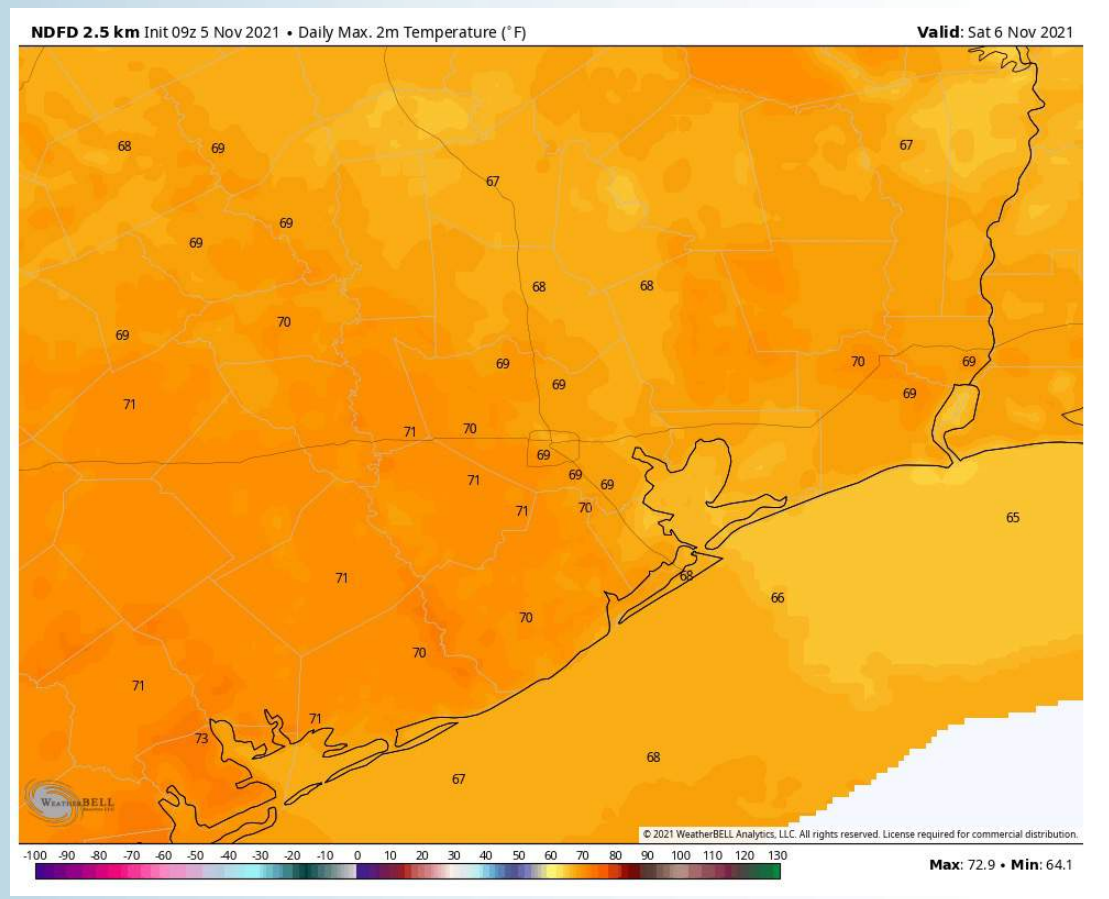
Sustained Winds (11 AM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (4 PM CT)



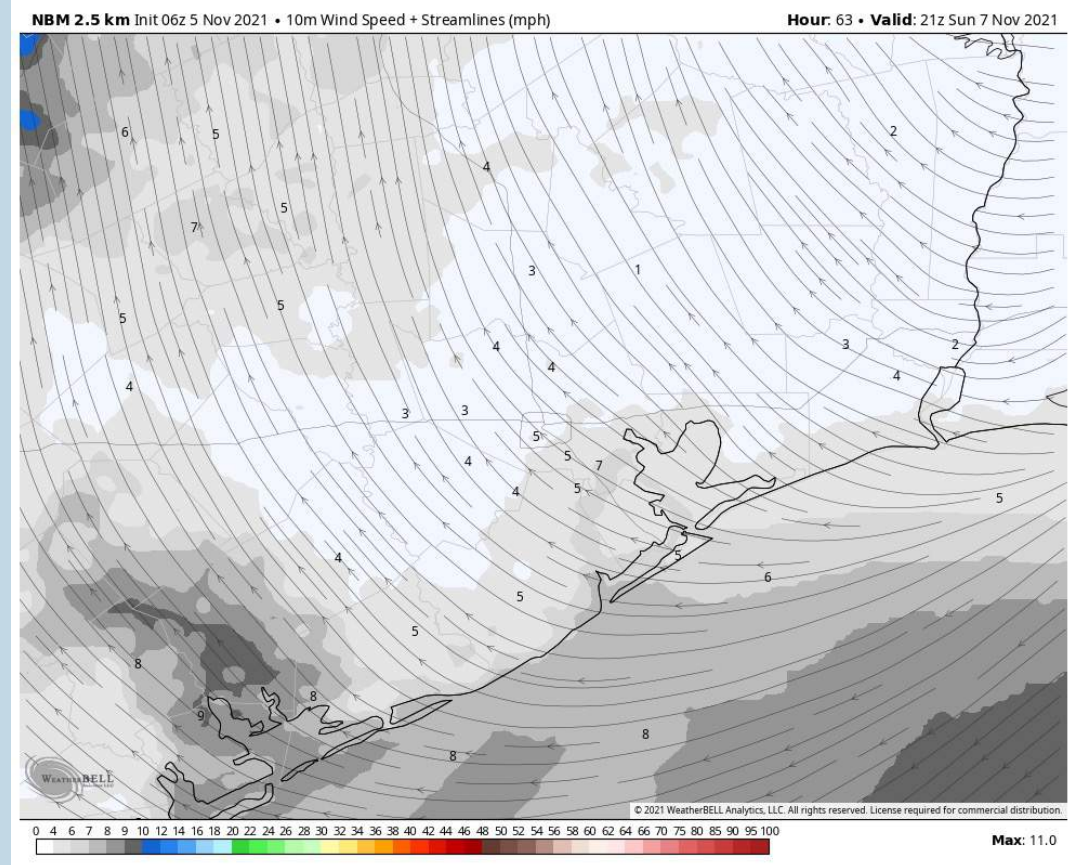
High Temps Saturday



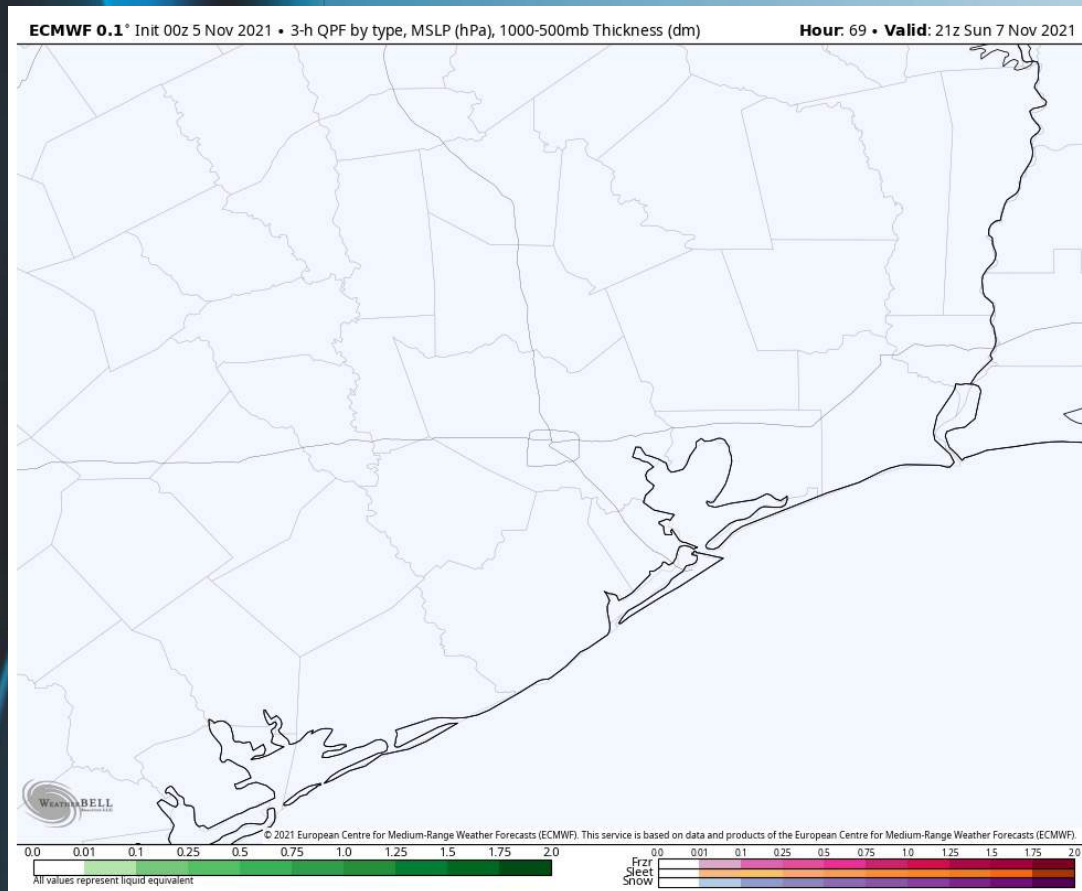
Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Another dry day is expected for Sunday
- NE winds Sun morning give shift out of the SE into the afternoon. Winds are anticipated to be on the lighter side sustained around 5 – 10 MPH.
- Lows will be in the low to mid 50s for most stations.
- **Fog is not favored on Sunday at this distance. Will need to keep an eye Sunday morning as there is some potential there.**

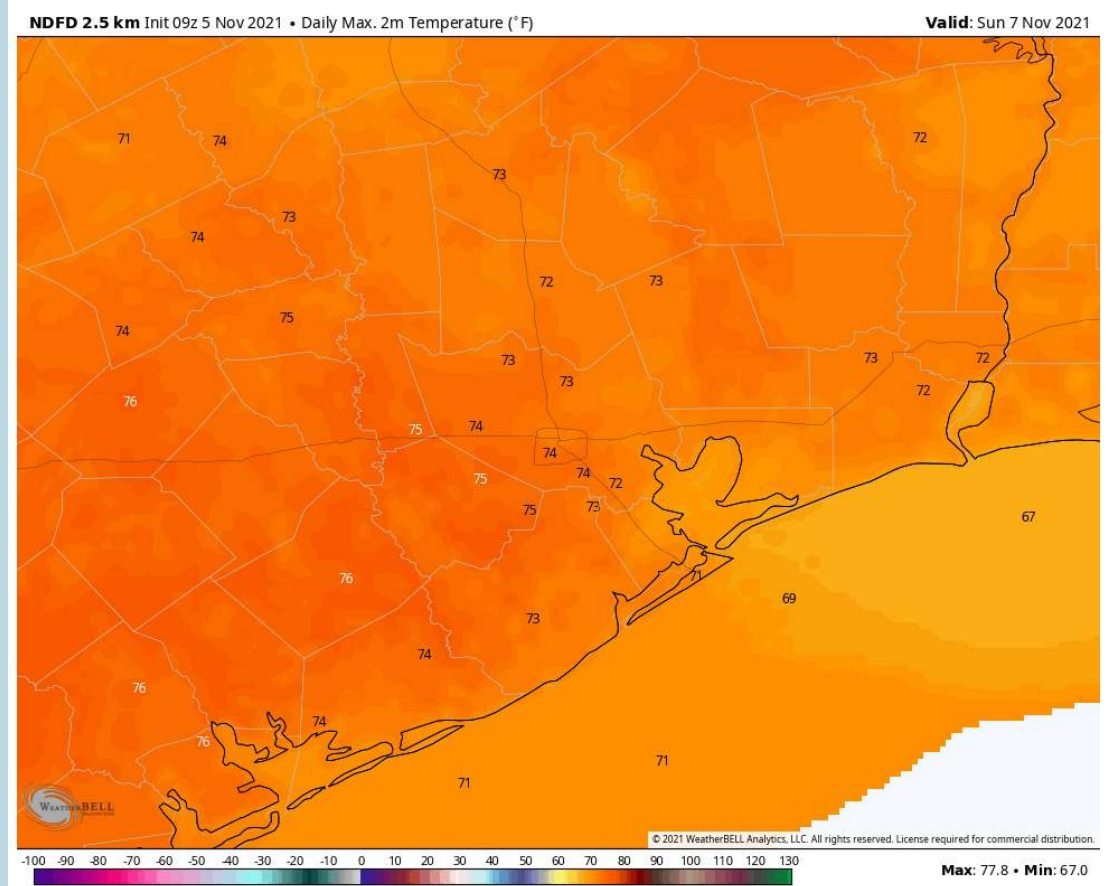
Sustained Winds (3 PM CT)



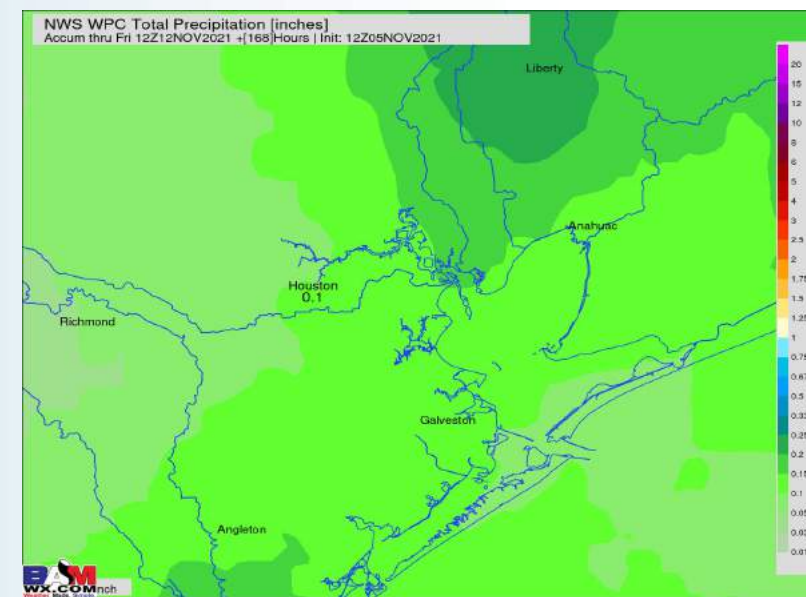
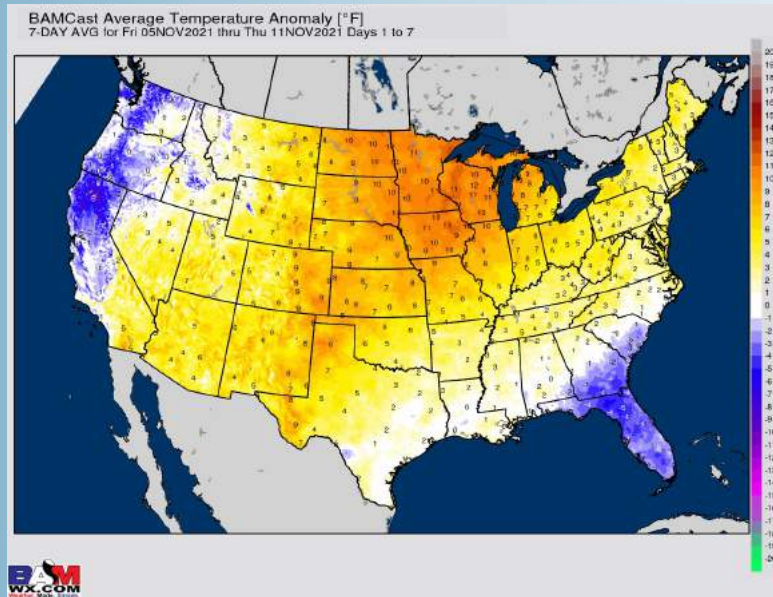
Simulated Radar Snapshot (3 PM CT)

Week 1 Forecast

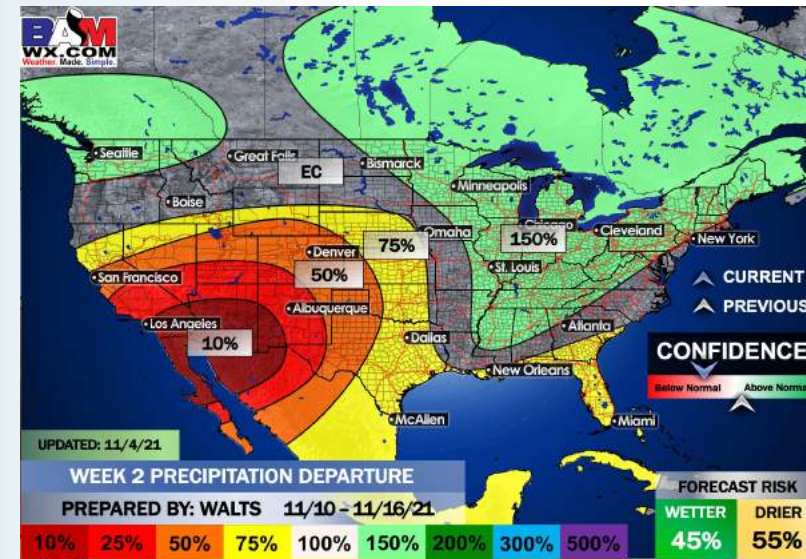
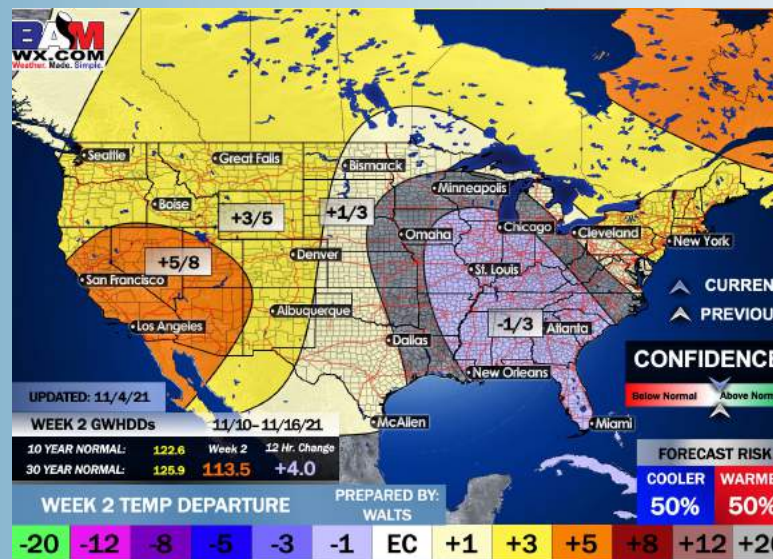


Long-Range Forecast Discussion

- A rather inactive stretch of weather is upcoming the next 7 days for the HOU area. Better precipitation chances arrive towards next THU – FRI associated with another Cold front. Temps should run slightly above normal this week.

Week 2 Forecast

- The week 2 timeframe is expected to have near normal temps with below average risks for precip. Not eyeing a specific threat for a tropical storm or hurricane at this distance.



Weeks 3/4 Forecast

- Right now we are favoring near normal temperatures for the back half of November with slightly above normal precipitation risks. Tropical threats look quite minimal as we get towards the end of the season.
