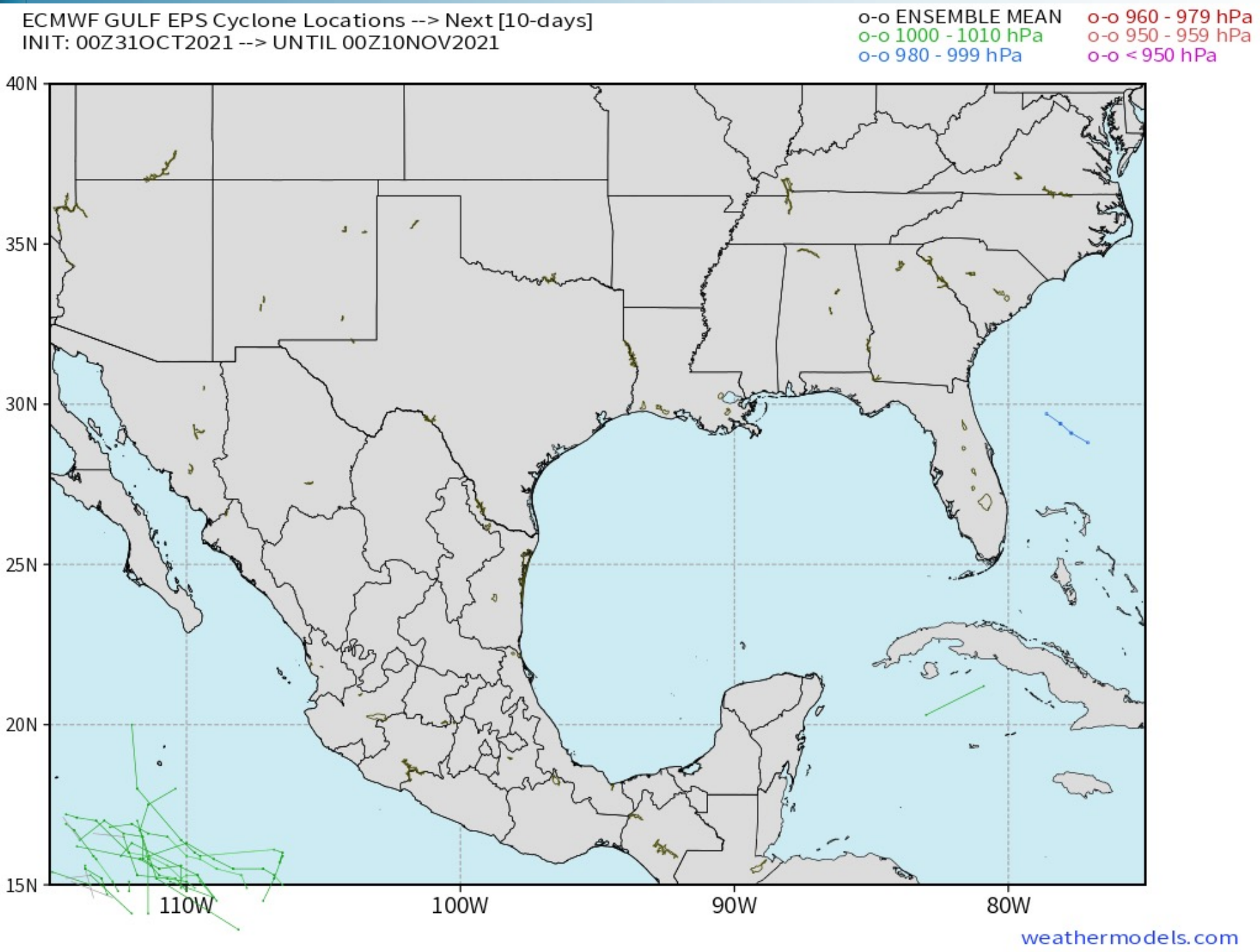

European Model Tracks

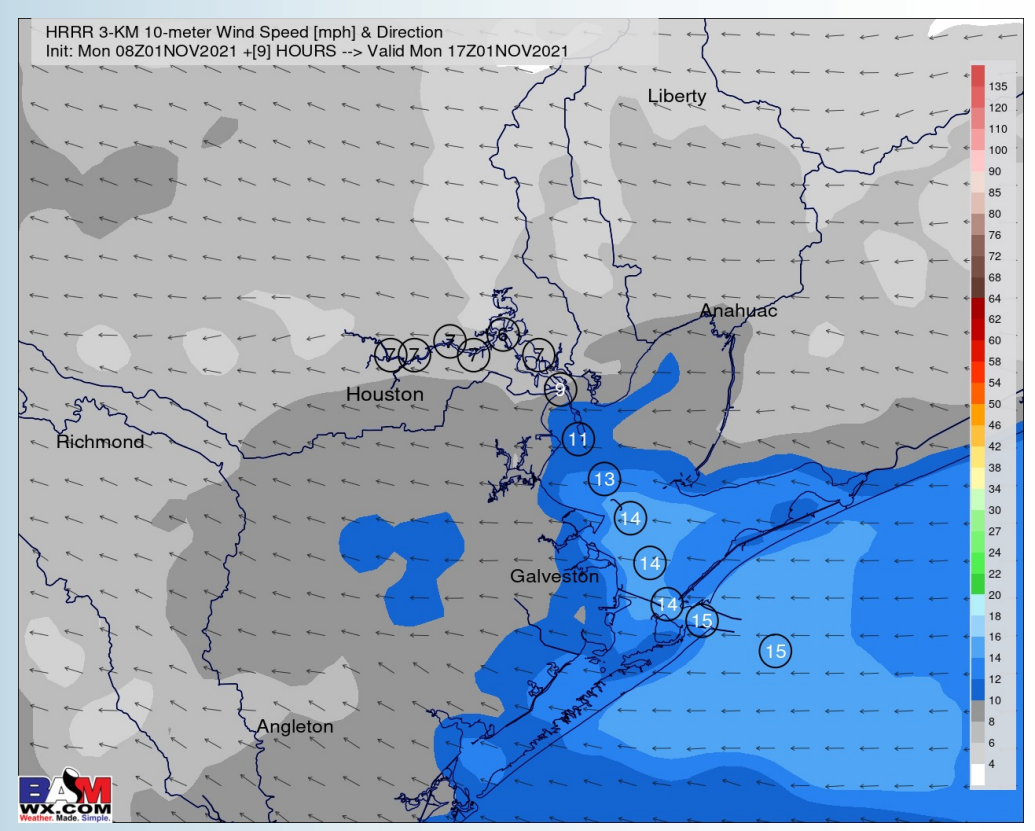


• No tropical activity is expected in the next 7-10 days.

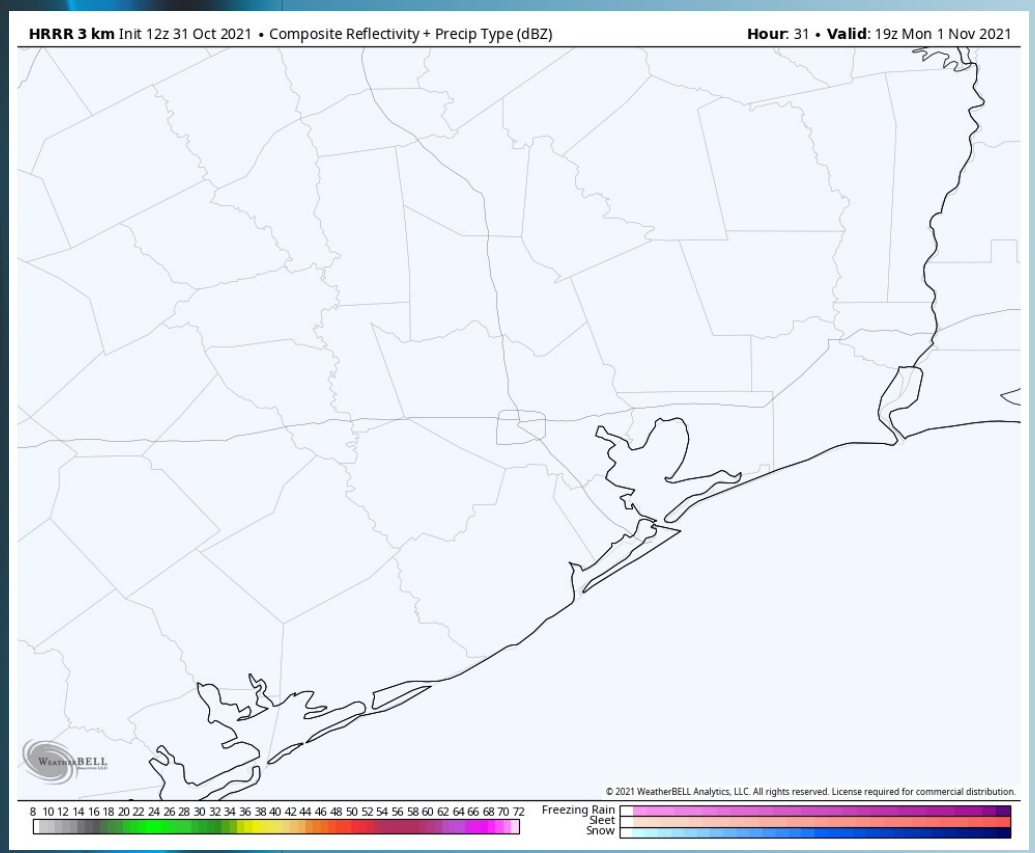
Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- **Dry conditions expected to continue today.**
- **Sustained winds 8-13 MPH for our stations on Monday, gusts to 15 MPH possible at the boarding station mainly after 11 AM. Winds generally coming out of the E for most of the day, switching to a more SE flow after sundown.**
- **High temps look to be in the upper 70's F.**
- **Fog is currently not expected for our stations.**

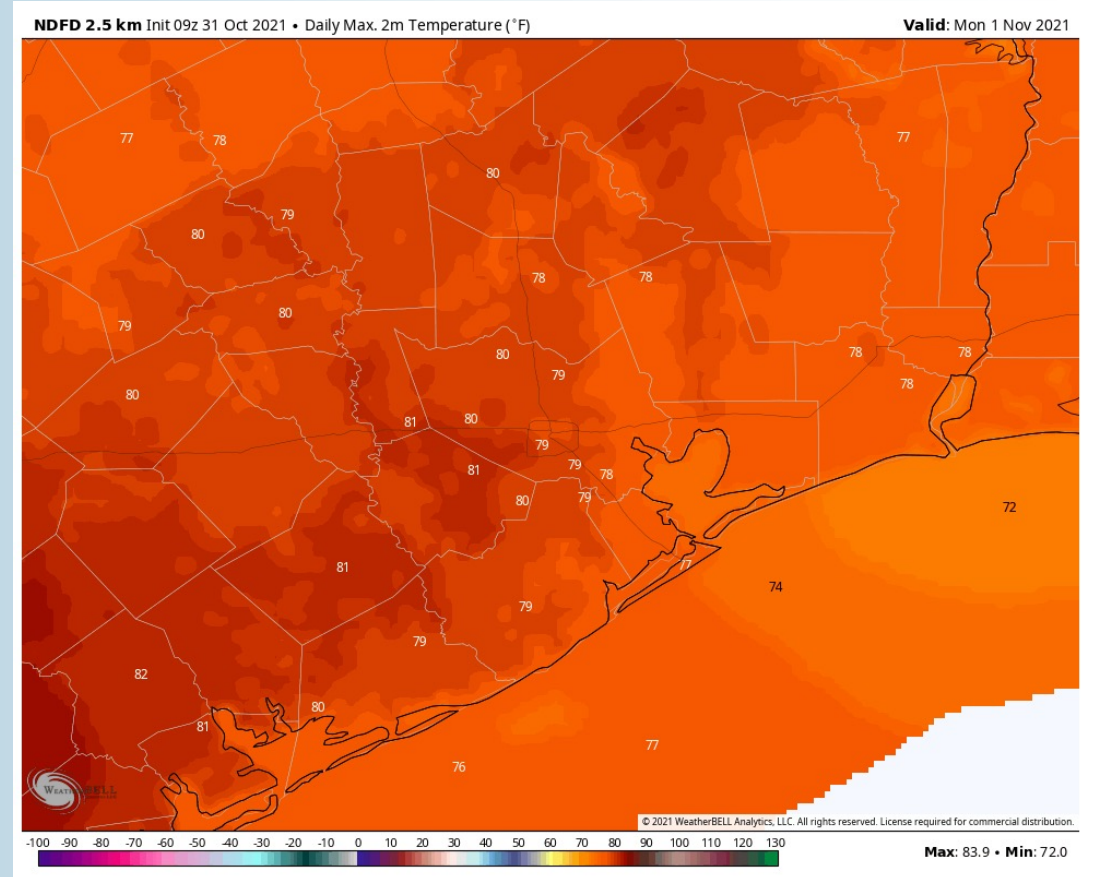
Sustained Winds (1 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (2 PM CT)



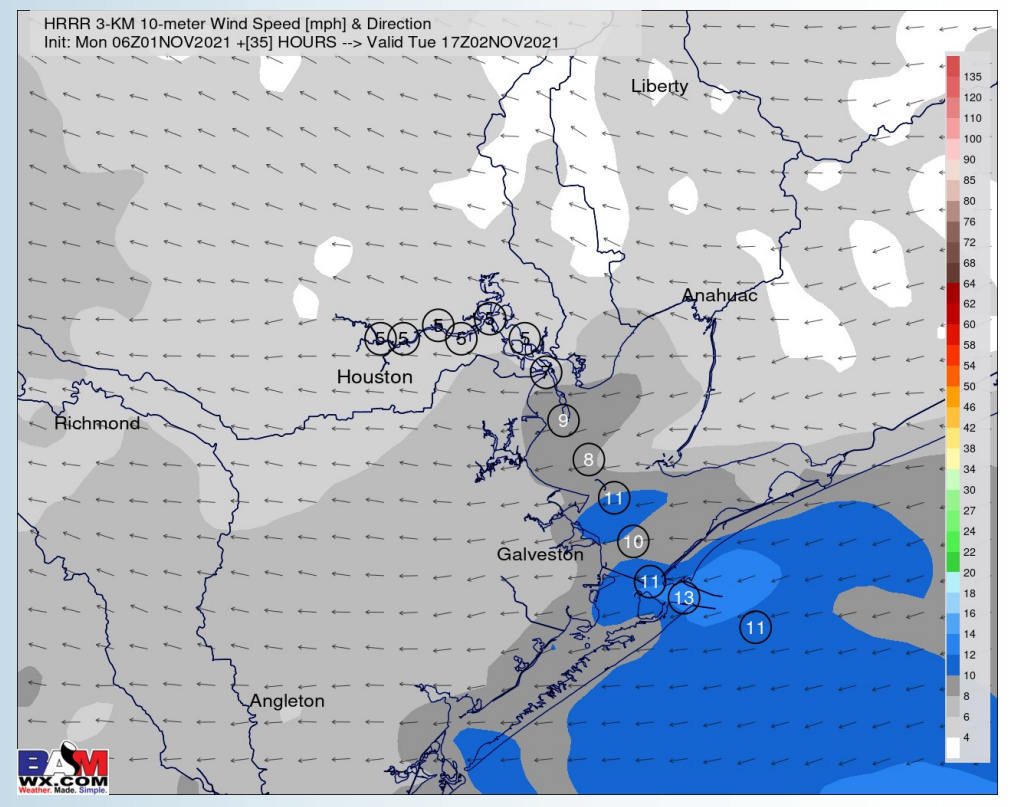
High Temperatures Today



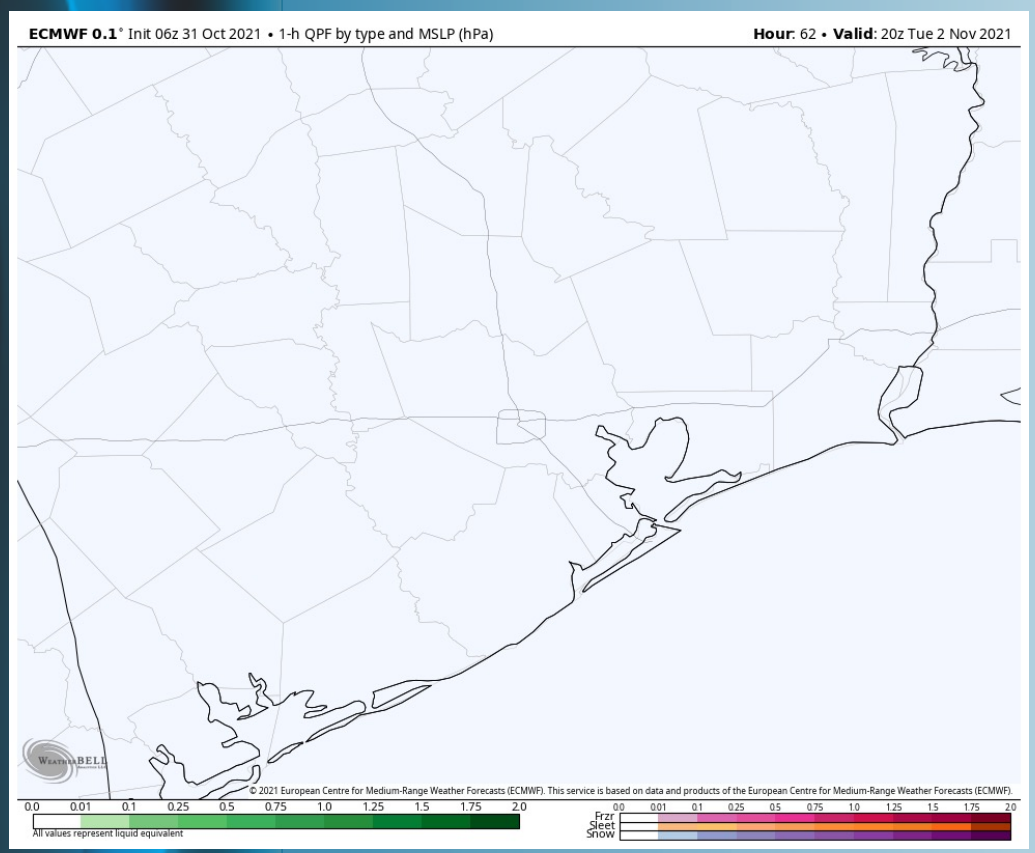
Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Dry stretch we have been seeing the past few days expected to continue for Tuesday.
- Sustained winds 5-10 MPH for the AM, closer to 8-13 MPH after noon for the boarding station. Gusts to 15 MPH for the boarding station in the PM hours. Winds switch from SE to NE near ~11 AM, and then back to the SE after ~5 PM.
- High temps Tuesday look to be in the upper 70s to low 80s.
- **Currently not expecting fog for our stations on Tue, any fog looks to stay N of our stations.**

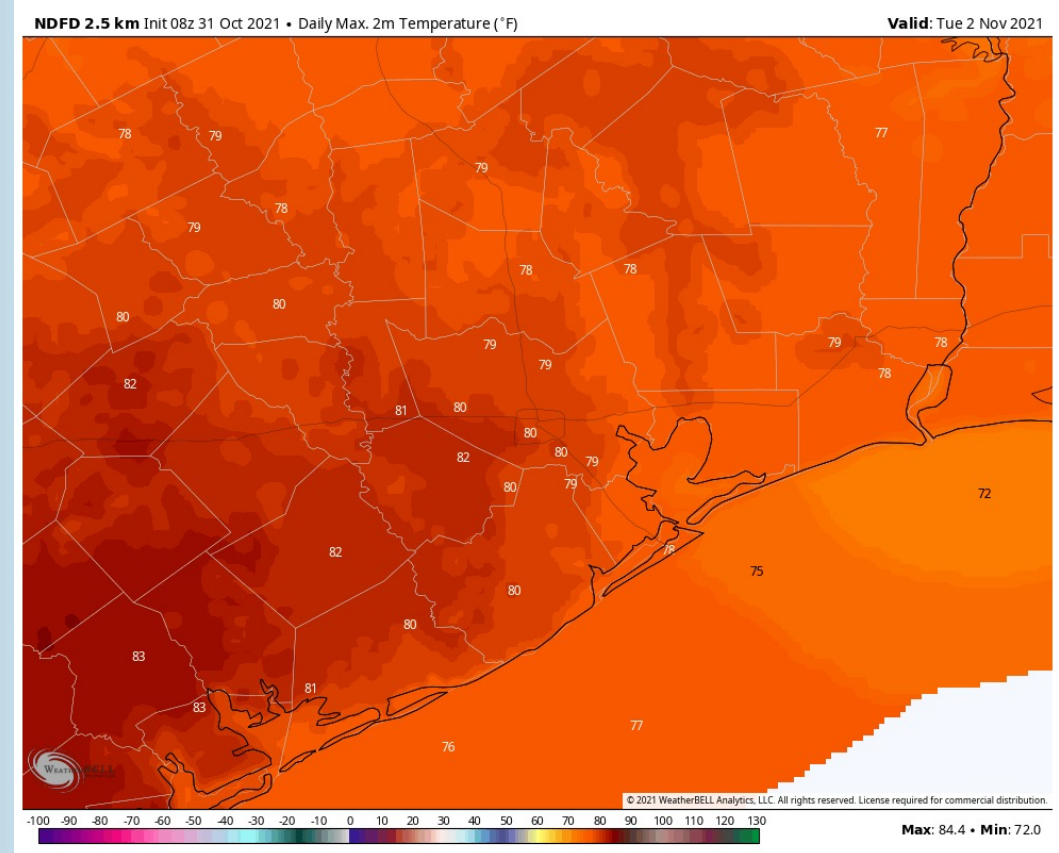
Sustained Winds (1 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (3 PM CT)



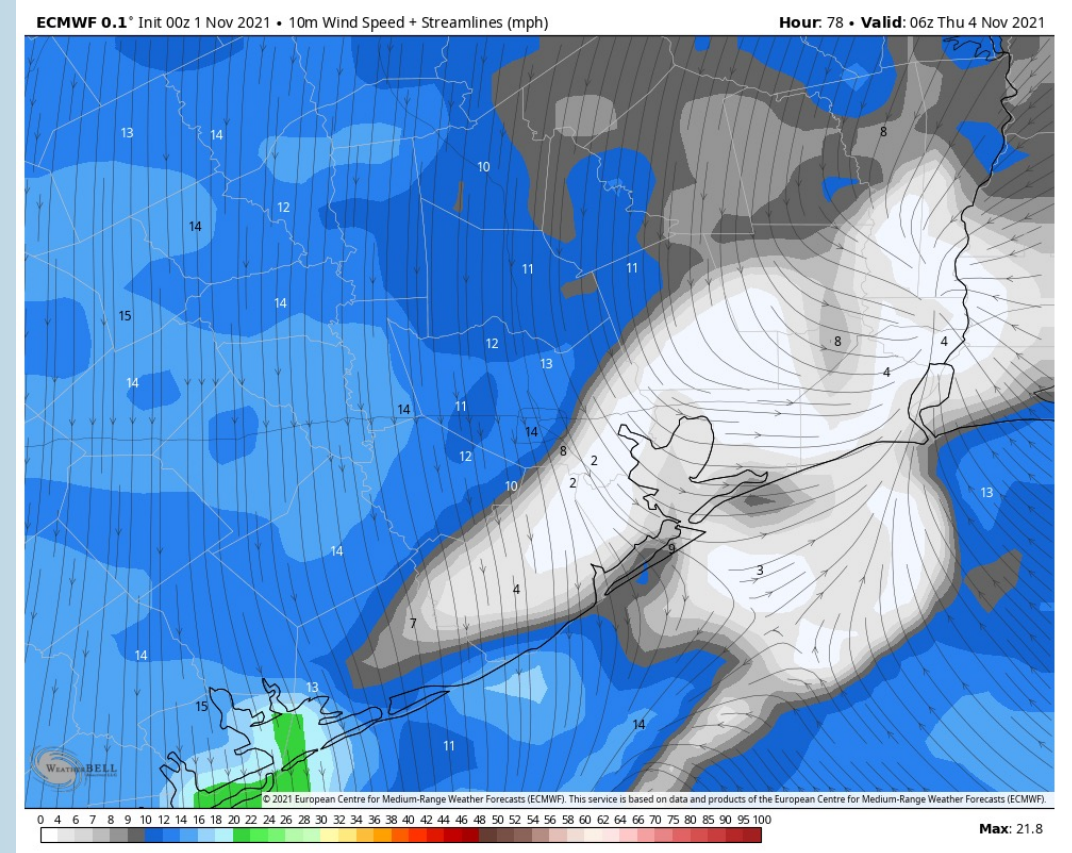
High Temperatures Tuesday



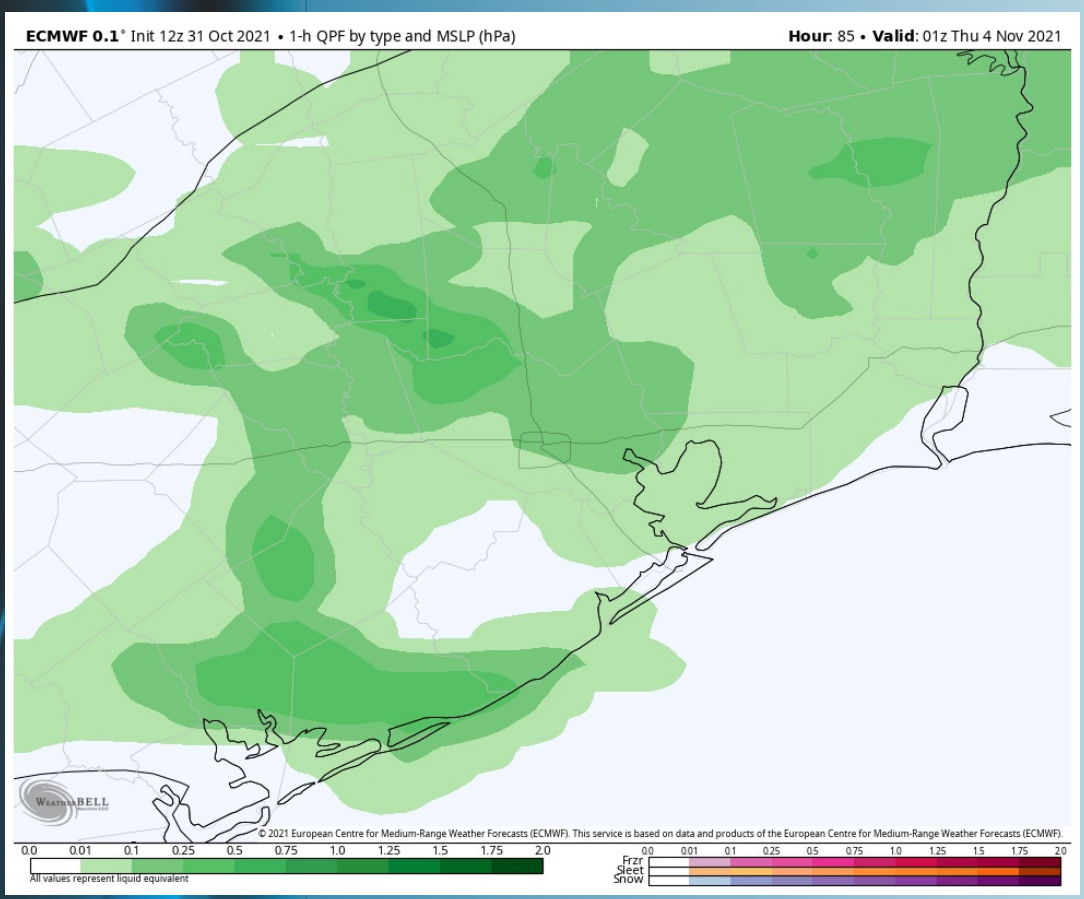
Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Dry conditions are expected for the AM and most of the PM hours on Wed as a cold front brings in showers and thunderstorms to the area beginning in the late evening/ overnight hours, continuing through the overnight. Lightning and a locally heavier downpour will be possible as the front pushes through.
- Sustained winds 8-13 MPH for most of the day with gusts to 20 MPH at the boarding station. As the front pushes through in the evening/night hours sustained winds 13-18 MPH at the boarding station with gusts 25-30 MPH possible. Timing of the front will need refined moving forward.
- High temps Wed look to be in the mid to upper 70s.
 - **Not expecting fog for our stations on Wed.**

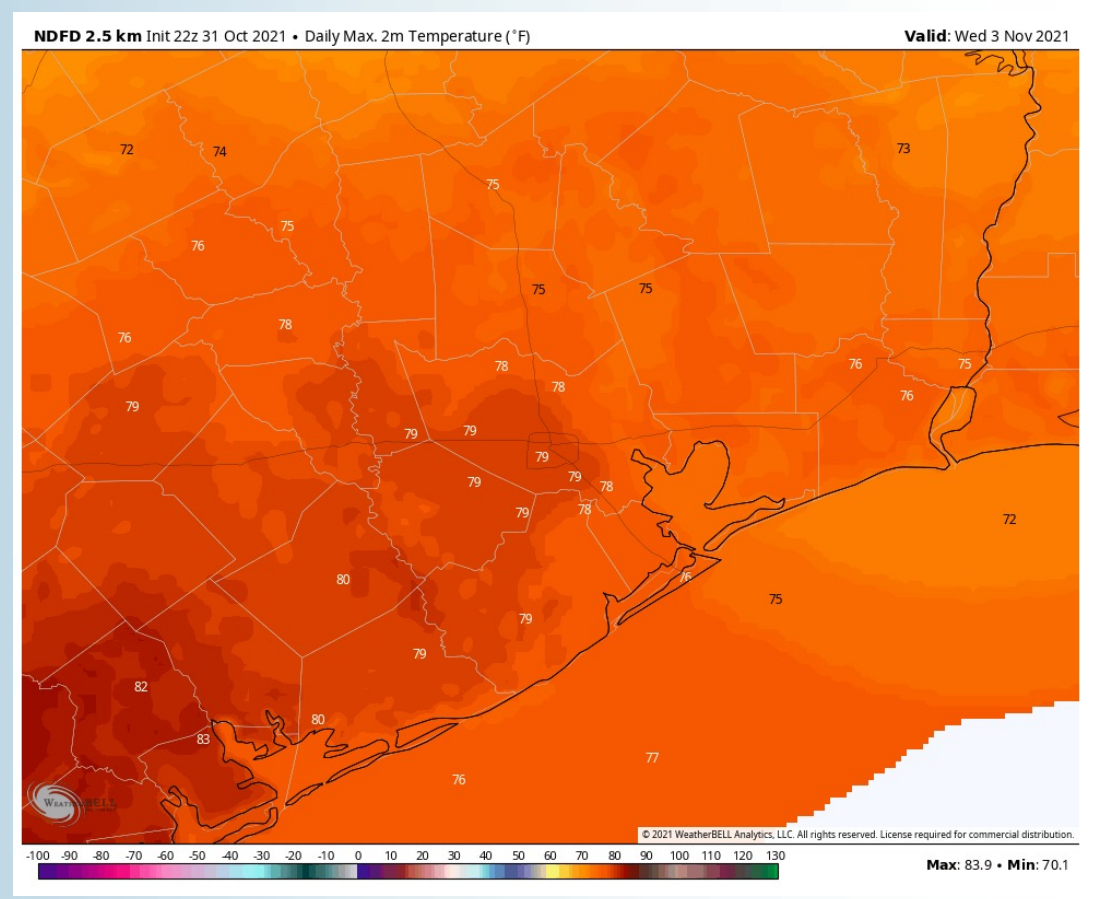
Sustained Winds (10 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (8 PM CT)



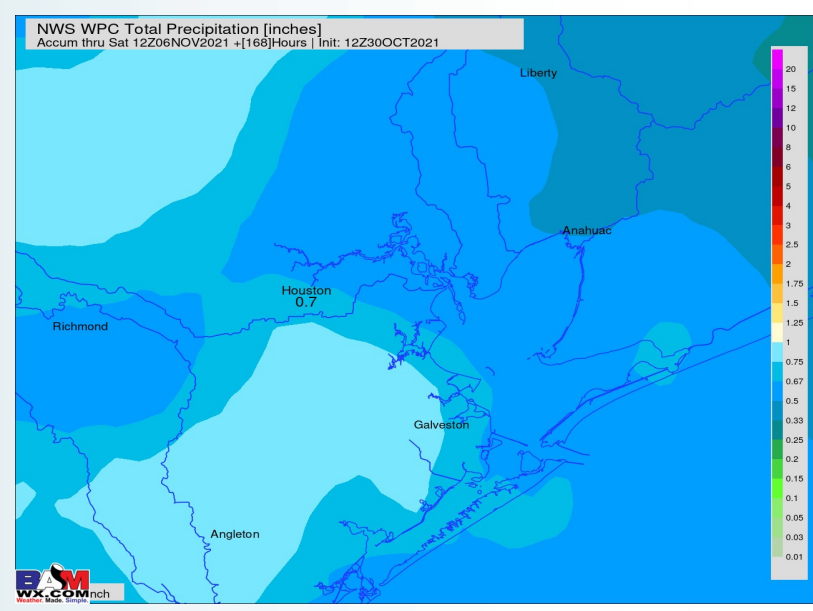
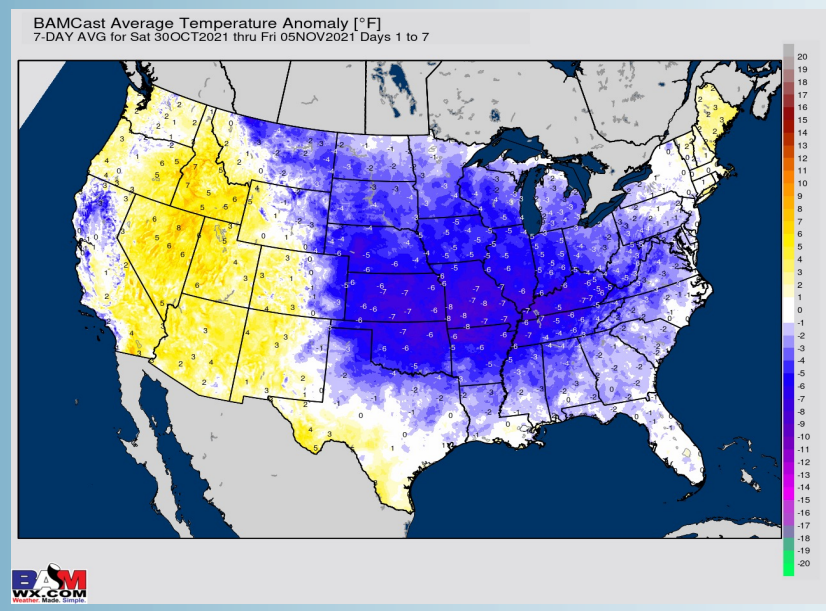
High Temperatures Wednesday



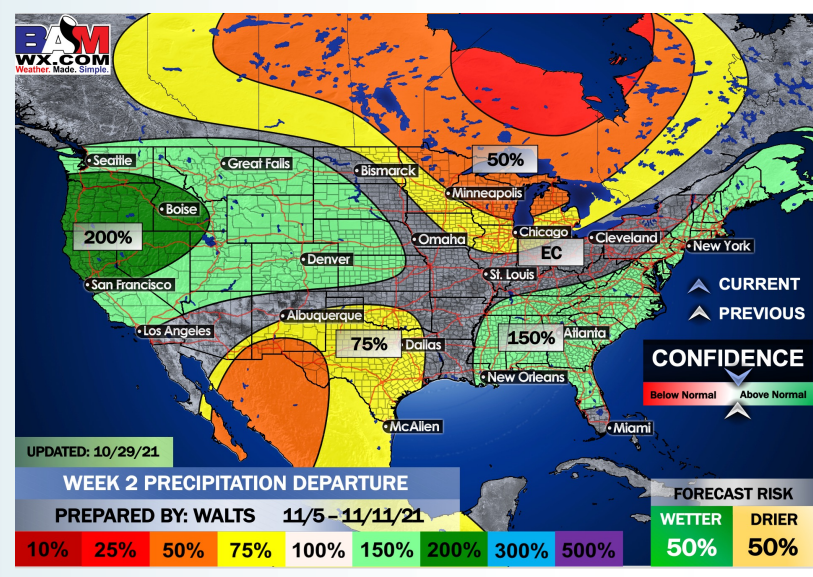
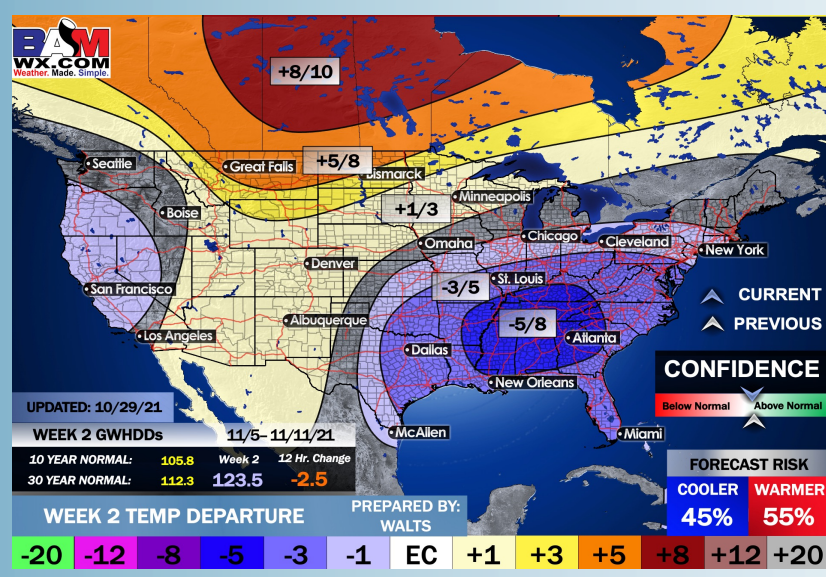
Long-Range Forecast Discussion

- The first half of the next 7 days looks to be rather inactive before the approach of another frontal boundary late WED - SAT. Pockets of heavier rain will be possible with this. Temperatures will average out near normal to slightly below normal.
- The week 2 timeframe is expected to have below normal temps with about average to slightly below average risks for precip. Not eyeing a specific threat for a tropical storm or hurricane at this distance.
- Right now, we have risks for slightly below average temps and about average precip for the first half of November. Tropical risks are on the lower side, but not a threat that should be 100% eliminated.
