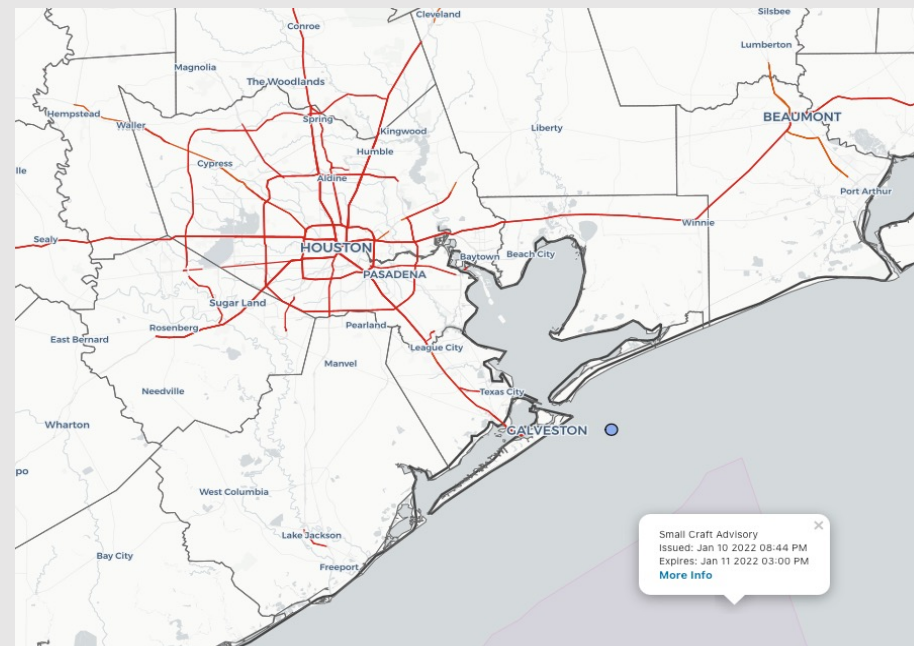

Weather Headlines

- Quiet weather is favored the next few days regarding precipitation with the next shot of precip looking to come Sat AM with a cold front.
- Late week fog chances have lowered some as winds look to sit a bit more northerly compared to what data had a few days ago. Still need to monitor early Sat AM before the front, but guidance is not overly excited at this moment.
- Continue to eye the next front Saturday AM that will bring elevated winds of 15-25+ MPH sustained through Sat and into Sunday AM. Right now the front likely works through in the 8-11 AM window.

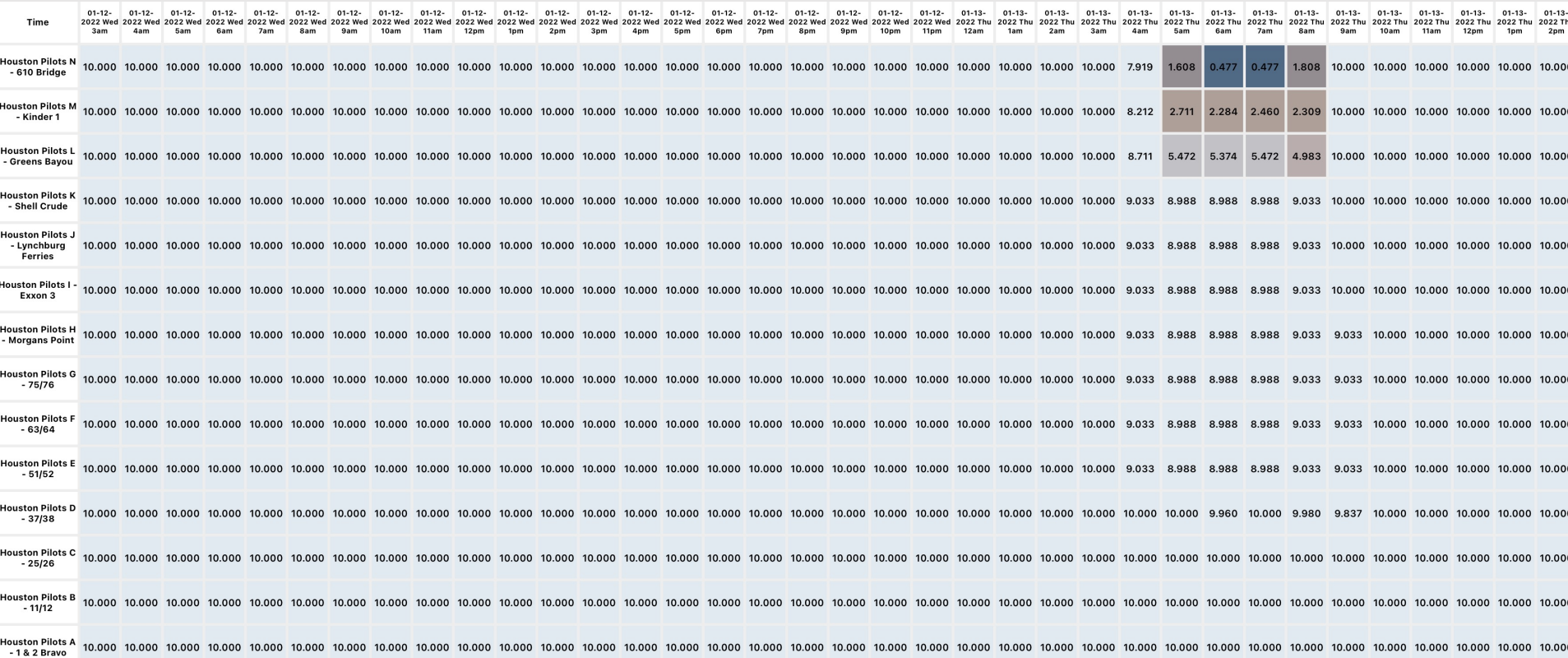

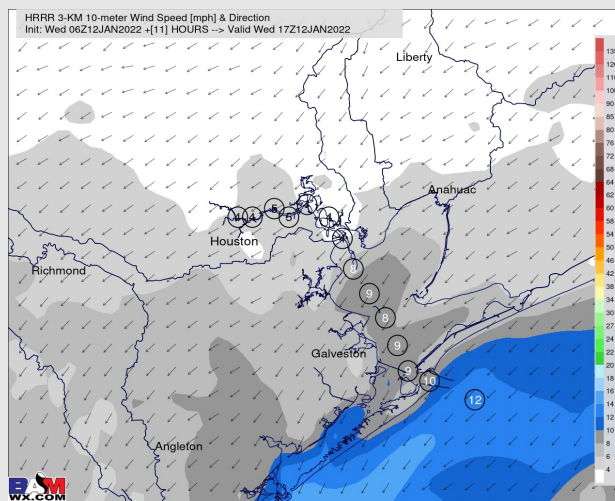
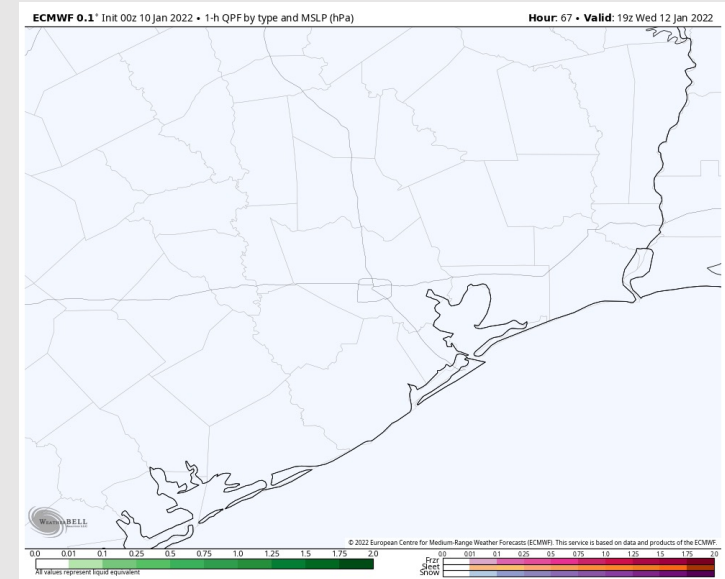
Precip: Precip is moving off to the east and does not look to be a concern the rest of the day.

Wind: Favoring a general ENE wind through most of the day before the winds look to come more out of the ESE after sundown. 8-13 MPH sustained will be possible at the boarding station out through 11 AM before turning closer to 5-10 MPH. Calmer winds expected into the overnight.

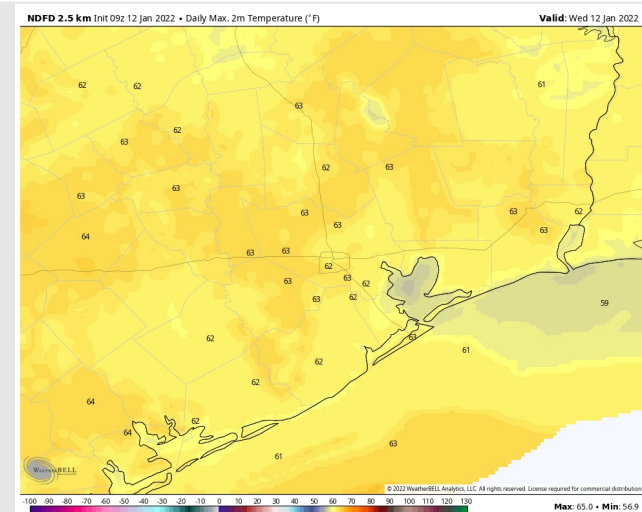
Temps: Highs top out in the low 60s.

Visibility: No fog is favored for today.

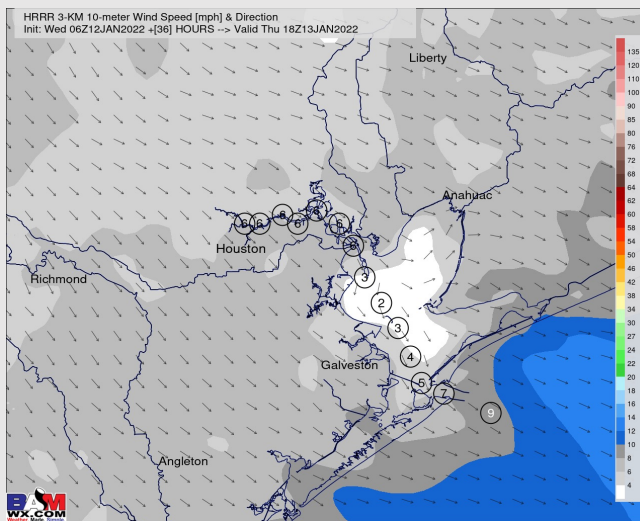
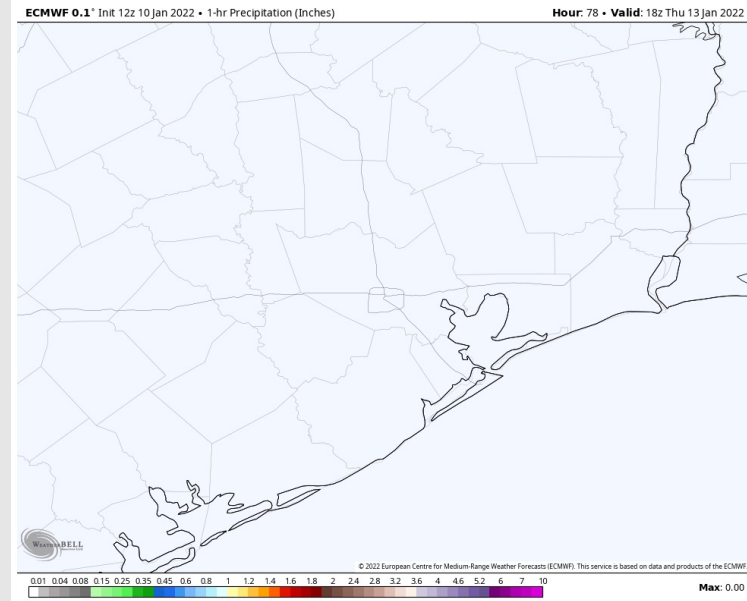
Precip: Dry conditions are anticipated to continue for Thursday.

Wind: Sustained winds on Thu look to be 5-10 MPH generally out of the WNW for much of the day. There may be a period at the boarding station starting around ~4 PM where winds may be briefly be out of the SW through sundown before turning back NW.

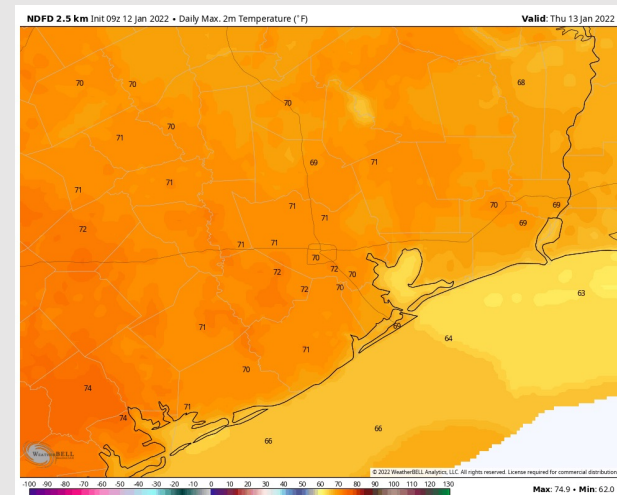
Temps: High temps Thu look to sit right around 70 F.

Visibility: No sea fog is favored Thursday. Some patchy fog north of our stations will be possible, but currently not favoring any impacts.

Forecast Discussion

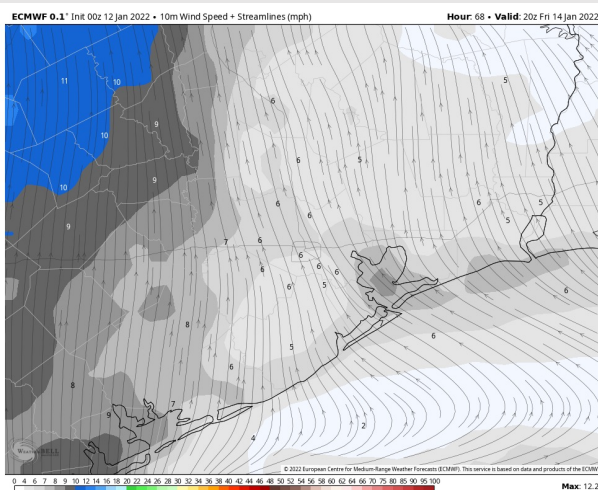
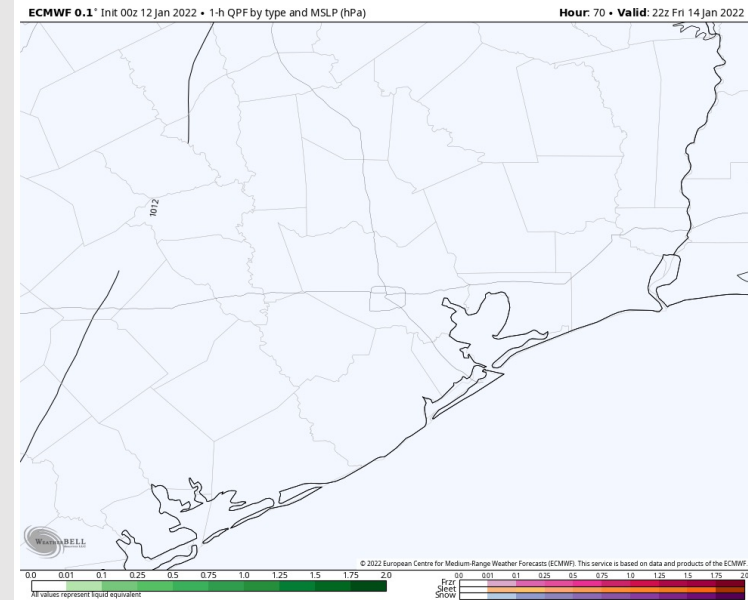
Precip: Dry weather favored for Friday.

Wind: Winds start out the day coming from the NW at 5-10 MPH. Around Noon, winds will flip from the SE and allow for some weak onshore flow the rest of the day.

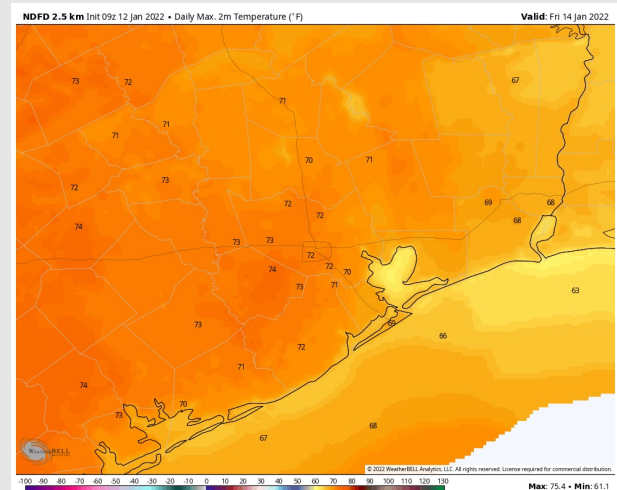
Temps: Highs Friday will be in the upper 60s to lower 70s F.

Visibility: Not anticipating fog Friday with winds coming out of the NW in the AM. May have to watch late Friday night into early Saturday for potential fog out ahead of the next front.

Precip Forecast: 4 PM CT

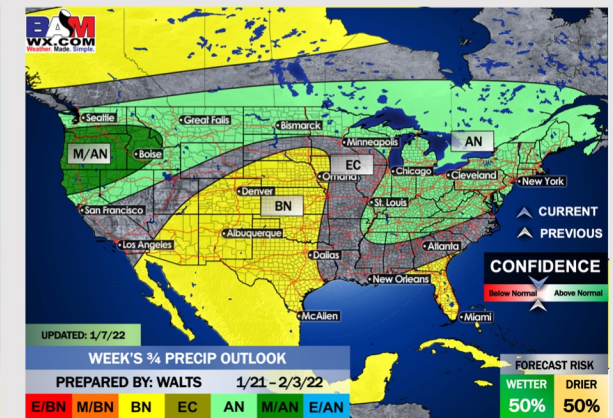
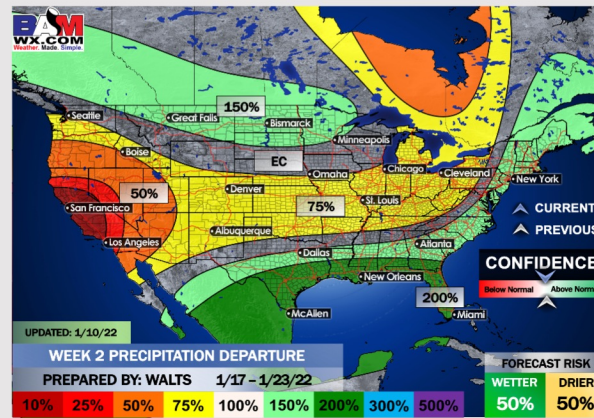
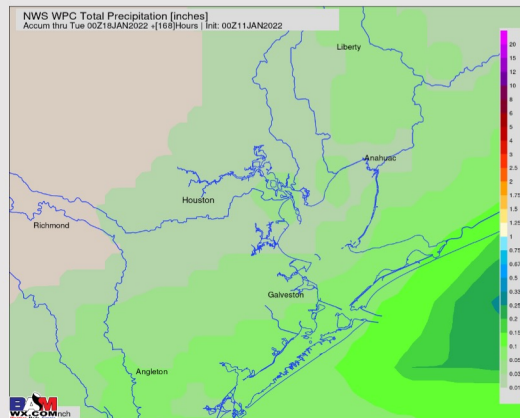
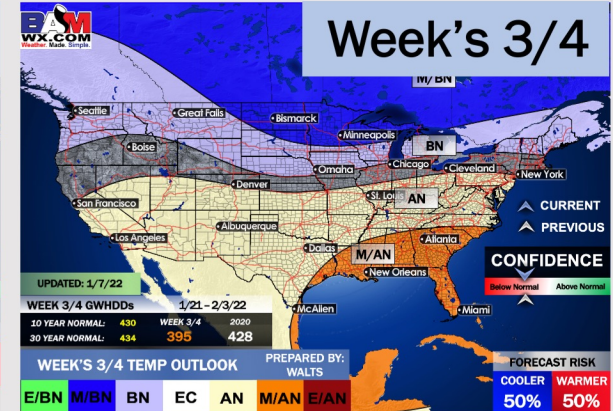
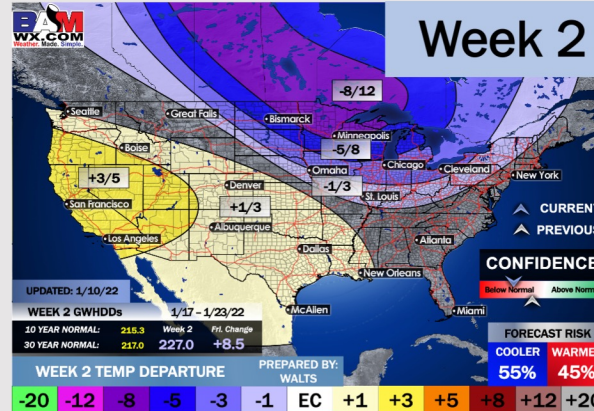
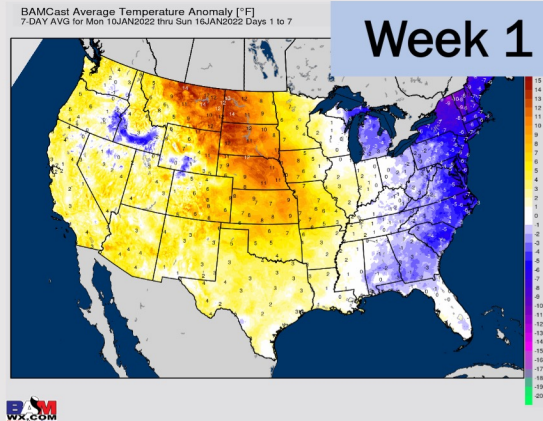


Wind Speed:

Houston Pilots: 1/10/22



- Anticipating dry conditions for the next several days, with next front anticipated Fri/Sat. After cooler temps for the first half of the work week, temps rebound to average out above normal.
- The week 2 timeframe is expected to have near normal temperatures with above normal risks for precip.
- Right now, we are favoring above normal risks for temperatures and slightly below normal risks for precip for the weeks 3 and 4 timeframe.
