

Weather Headlines

- Still eyeing dry weather the next few days before a cold front moves in and produces some light precip. Bigger story will be the strong winds with the boarding station potentially seeing gusts of 45 MPH (more details on Sat slide).
- Low end chance for fog in the short term as discussed below, but fog chances out through at least Monday do not look very high.
- Following shot of precip doesn't look to potentially come until next Wednesday.

Houston Pilots Extended Range Visibility Report



Sunday, 1/16/22

Currently not anticipating fog at our stations for Sun AM with elevated winds still out of the north.



Monday, 1/17/22

Fog is not expected for Monday given a NW wind.



Tuesday, 1/18/22

Winds do turn more onshore for Tuesday AM, but current thinking is that the air will be dry enough from prior NW flow to limit the threat.

Forecast Discussion


Precip: Dry conditions are anticipated to continue today.

Wind: Sustained winds look to be 5-10 MPH generally out of the WNW for much of the day. There may be a period at the boarding station starting around ~3 PM where winds may be briefly be out of the SW through ~8 PM before turning back NW.


Temps: High temps look to sit right around 70 F.

Visibility: Any fog this morning is favored to stay away from the stations.


Precip Forecast: 12 PM CT





Forecast Discussion

- Precip:** Dry weather favored for Friday.
- Wind:** Winds start out the day coming from the NW at 5-10 MPH. Around Noon, winds will flip from the S and allow for some onshore flow the rest of the day.
- Temps:** Highs Friday will be near 70 F.
- Visibility:** Any patchy fog Friday AM looks to again sit away from the stations.

Forecast Discussion



Precip: Saturday AM near daybreak is when the next shot of precip works in with a cold front. Moisture is looking to be possible for a few hour window and be rather light. Once the front passes by mid-late AM, the afternoon looks dry.

Wind: Pre-dawn will start out coming from the SW at 8-13 MPH. Current thinking is for the front to move through in the 5-8 AM window and shift winds to the NW. Sustained winds of 20-30 MPH with gusts 30-40 MPH are possible much of the day. Beyond sundown is when winds of 25-35 MPH and gusts 35-45 MPH are possible. Fully anticipate there to be some sort of marine wind advisory/ Gale alert.


Temps: Saturday temps will only reach the low to mid 60s with thanks to the front passing in the AM.

Visibility: Fog is still not favored, however we will continue to monitor the 1 AM - 7 AM window for the *potential* development of fog out ahead of the front with the onshore flow. Given how dry the air is beforehand will limit potential, but is still a risk to keep an eye on.

Precip Forecast: 6 AM CT









Wind Speed

Houston Pilots: 1/10/22



- Anticipating dry conditions for the next several days, with next front anticipated Fri/Sat. After cooler temps for the first half of the work week, temps rebound to average out above normal.
- The week 2 timeframe is expected to have near normal temperatures with above normal risks for precip.
- Right now, we are favoring above normal risks for temperatures and slightly below normal risks for precip for the weeks 3 and 4 timeframe.
