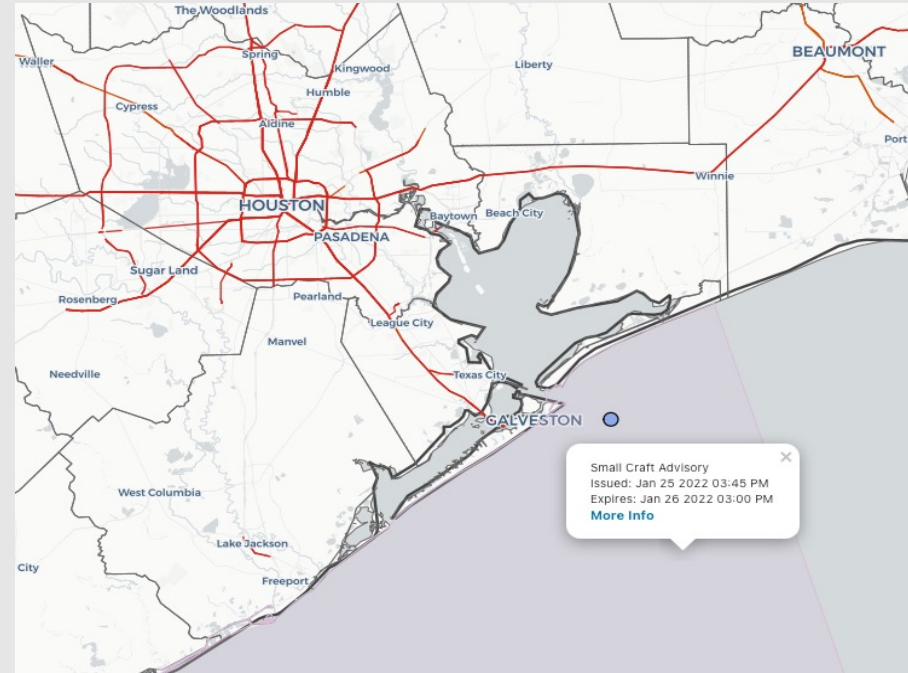

- Signal for fog continues to look weak over the next several days.

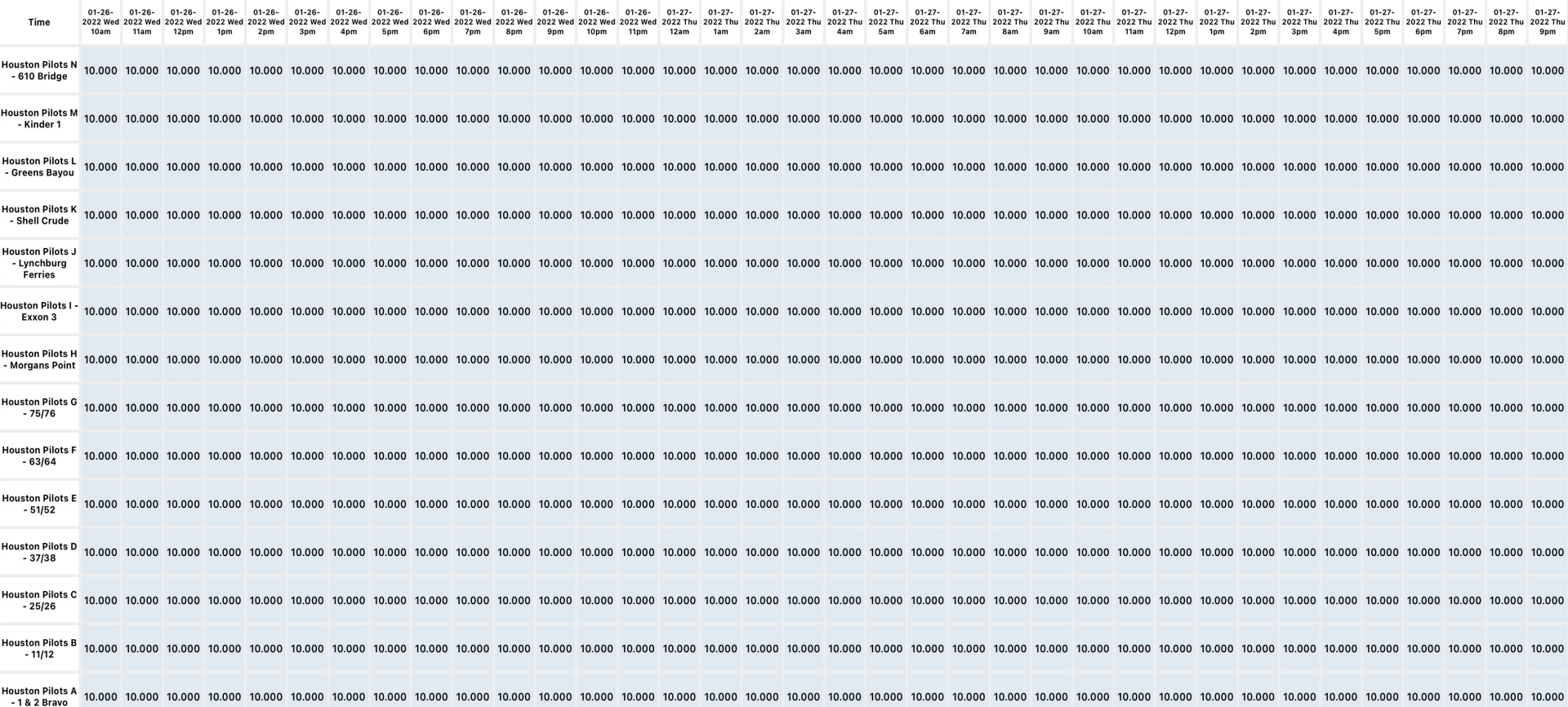

Forecast Discussion

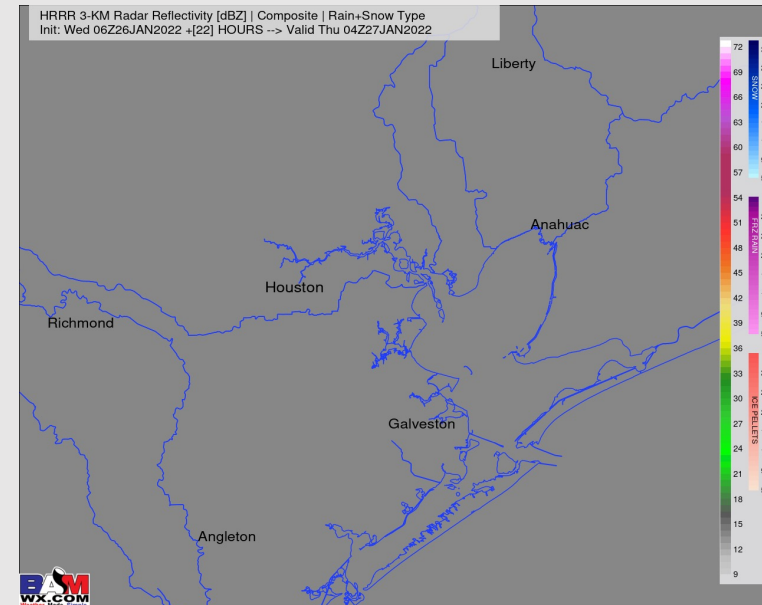
Precip: Favoring a dry rest of the day for our stations.

Wind: Sustained winds the rest of the day continue 10-15 MPH out of the NE with gusts 15-20 MPH at the boarding station.

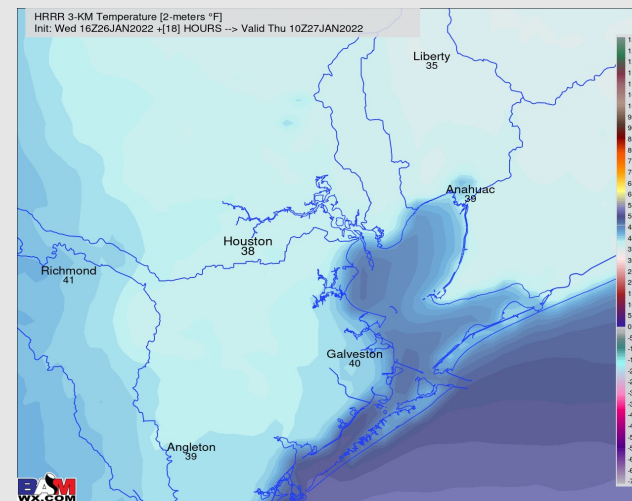
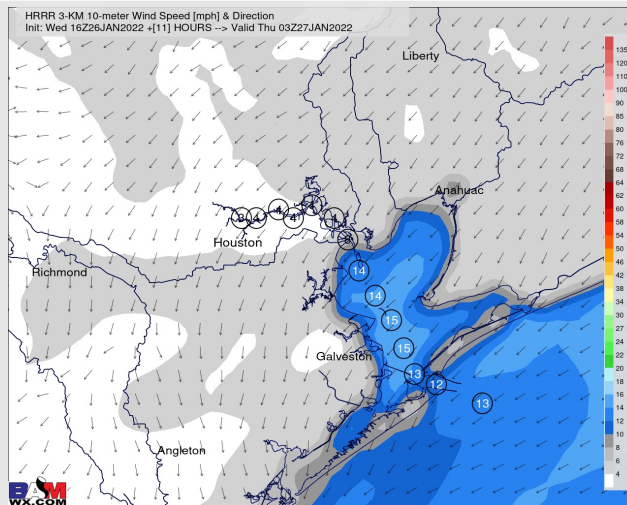
Temps: Lows fall back into the low to mid 40s for most stations, cooler inland.

Visibility: Not anticipating fog.

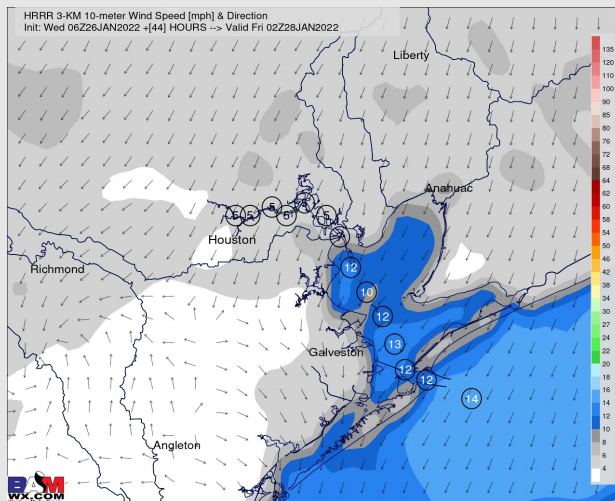
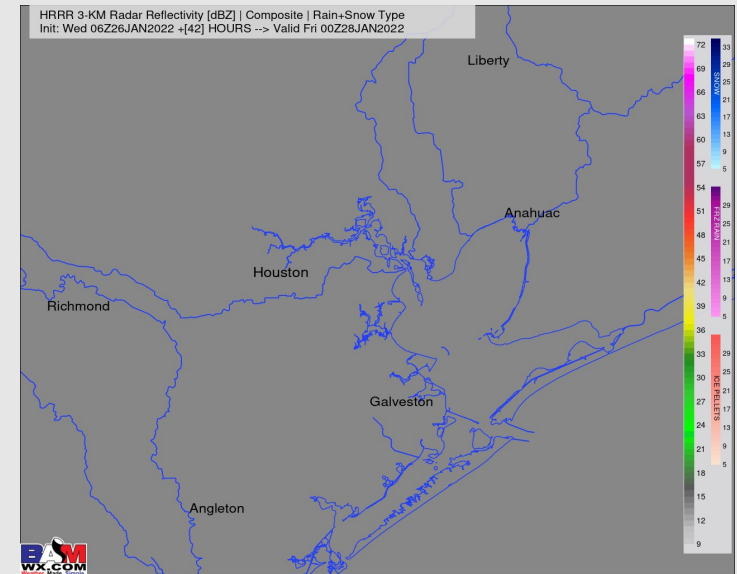
Precip: Anticipating dry conditions on Thursday.

Wind: Sustained winds look to be mostly 8-13 MPH out of the NE with gusts 13-18 MPH at the boarding station through around 8 AM. After 8 AM, sustained winds are 5-10 MPH out of the NE for the rest of the day. Watching the sundown hours for an increase in winds to 10-15 MPH and 13-18 MPH near Midnight.

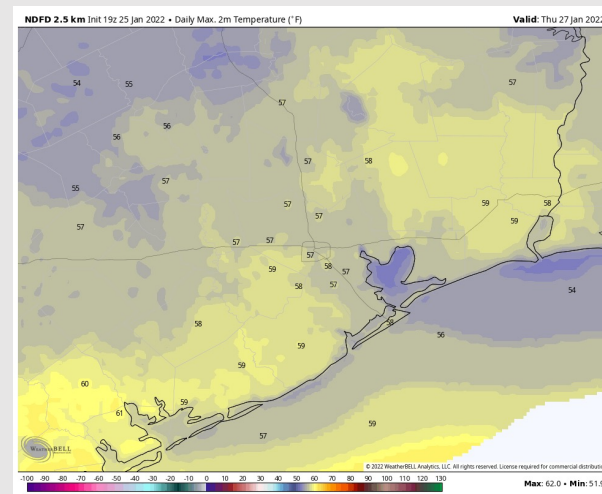
Temps: High temps Thursday look to be in the mid to upper 50s F.

Forecast Discussion

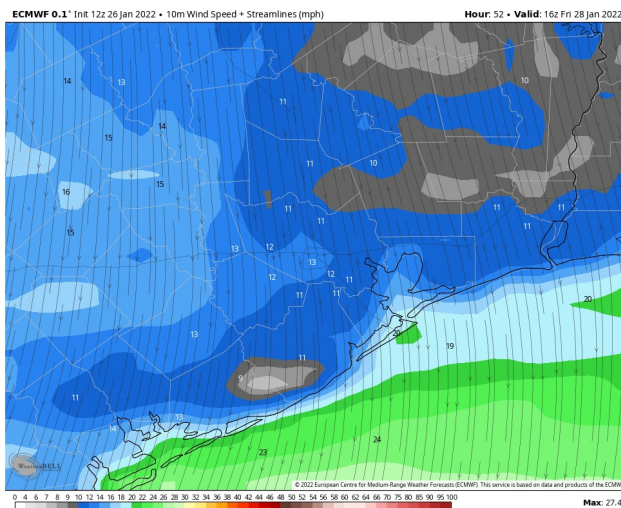
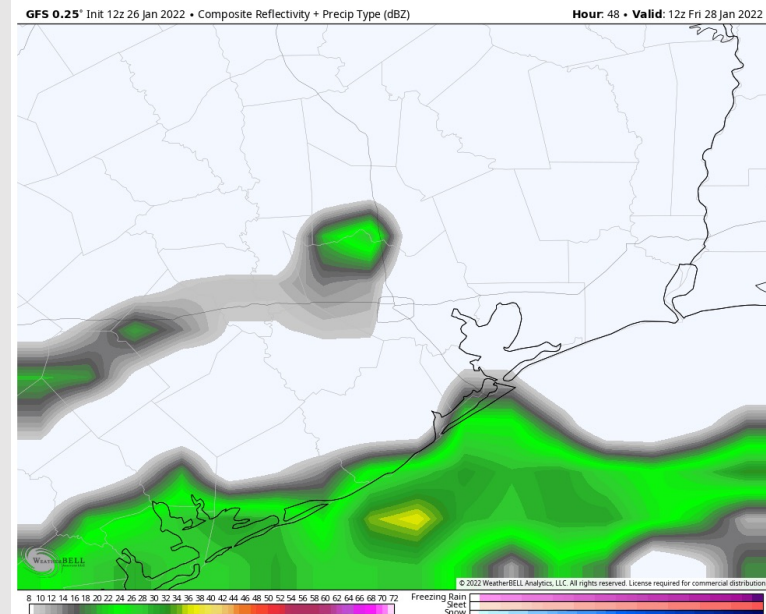
Precip: Friday will be mostly dry day, however the morning hours need watched for a ~20% chance of a few light showers. Much of the moisture is expected to stay south of the area.

Wind: Winds almost all of Friday will be coming out of the N/NNE sustained at 15-20 MPH with gusts 20-25 MPH.

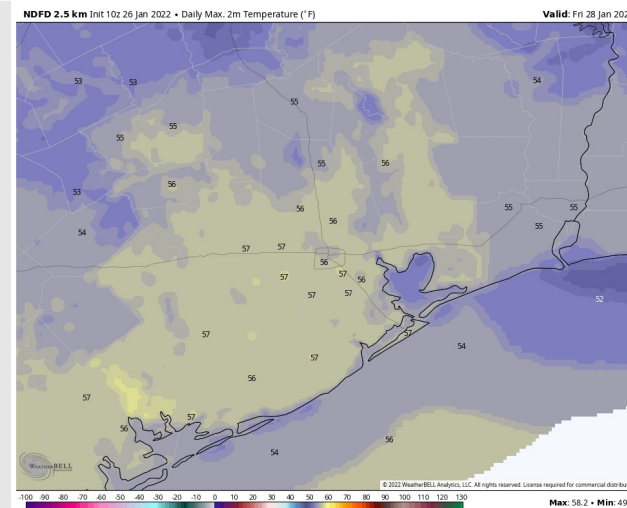
Temps: Looking at highs Friday in the mid 50s.

Precip Forecast: 7 AM CT

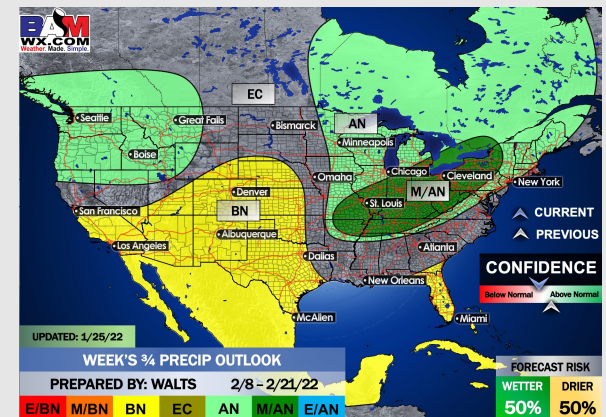
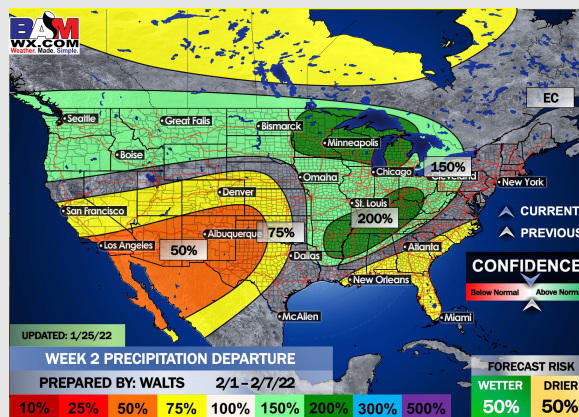
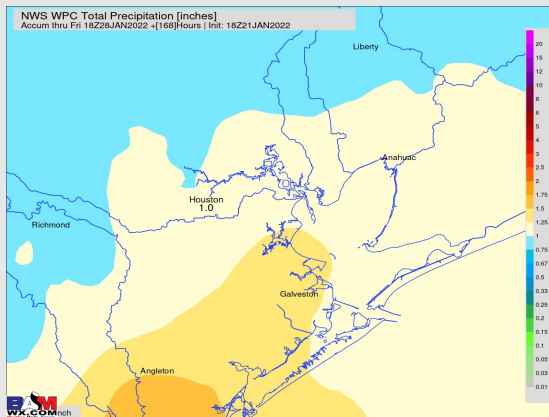
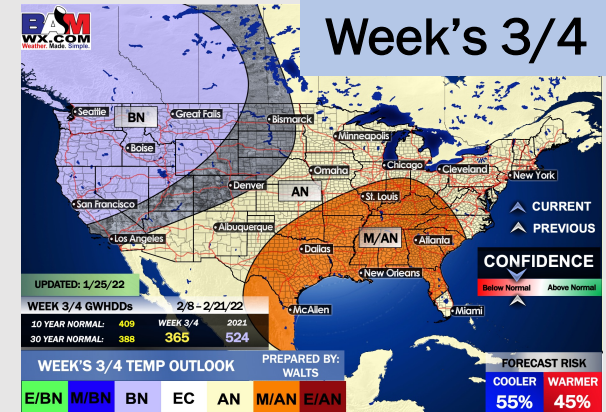
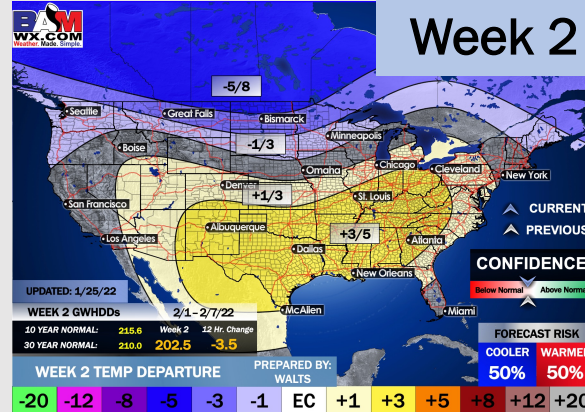
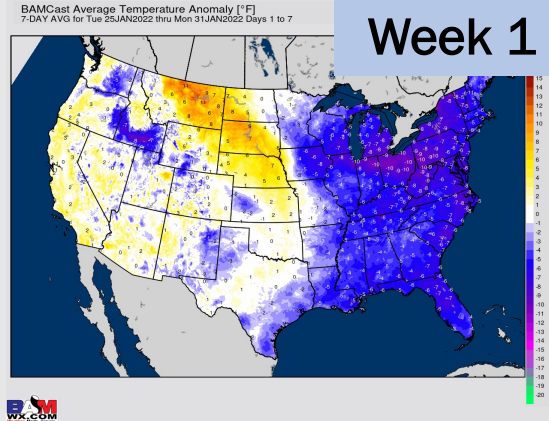

Houston Pilots: 1/26/22



- Overall temperatures are expected to be below normal for the next 7 days . A low-end chance for showers at the end of our work week, however, anticipating overall drier conditions for the next several days.
- The week 2 timeframe is expected to have above normal temperatures with near normal risks for precip.
- Right now, we are favoring above normal risks for temperatures and slightly below normal risks for precip for the weeks 3 and 4 timeframe.
