



Forecast Discussion


Precip: Anticipating dry conditions for our stations today.

Wind: Sustained winds are 10-15 MPH out of the NNW through 3-4PM when winds decrease to 5 -10 MPH. After sundown winds look to be calm and variable through midnight.


Temps: Low temps tonight look to sit in the high 40s to low 50s.


Visibility: Not anticipating fog for our stations tonight.


Forecast Discussion

Precip: Continuing to favor dry conditions on Monday. Wind: Sustained winds look to continue 5-10 MPH throughout most of the day on Monday. Winds veer from the WSW to the south in the AM and are out of the SSW into the PM, veering again in the evening out of the SSE. Closer to midnight winds look to increase slightly to 8-13 MPH sustained at the boarding station.


Temps: High temps Monday look to be in the mid to upper 60s F.


Visibility: Currently not anticipating fog for our stations on Monday.

Forecast Discussion


Precip: Anticipating dry conditions to continue Tuesday.

Wind: Sustained winds continue 8-13 MPH with gusts 13-18 MPH out of the SE into Tuesday morning increasing slowly as we go further in the AM. Sustained winds are 10-15 MPH by 8-9 AM with gusts 15-20 MPH at the boarding station, continuing through the daytime hours. Around sundown, sustained winds look to increase to 15-20 MPH at the boarding station with gusts to 25 MPH possible into the overnight.


Temps: High temps on Tue look to be in the mid to upper 60s F.


Visibility: Keeping an eye on Tue AM for patchy "in-land" fog, however, data currently keeps it north of our stations. Currently not anticipating fog for our stations Tuesday.

Wind Speed 9 AM CT


























- Anticipating dry conditions for the next few days. Next shot of precip look to be Wed -Thu with the next front. Temps average out slightly below normal this week.
