Weather Headlines

- Anticipating fog/reduced visibility concerns to be wiped out after a cold front passes between the 11AM 2 PM timeframe. After this anticipating fog free days for Wednesday/Thursday. Earliest fog could return will be Friday PM.
- We do not believe the forecast on the 36-hour visibility chart is 100% accurate, please reference our visibility slides below for official BAM thoughts.
- Wave heights will continue to recede over the next several hours to below 5 feet.
- Winds will be much less of a concern moving forward. Biggest risks for elevated winds come Friday PM, and then again on Monday.






- Pockets of fog/reduced visibility will be possible through the rest of the morning hours for all stations. To this point, coverage of fog has been a bit more patchy than prior AMs, however visibility of 2-4 miles will still be possible given misty conditions + low clouds sticking around.
- The deeper into the AM we work, the lower the fog threat will become and the higher the 2-4 mile visibility threat becomes.
- Currently targeting a cold front to work through the are mid-day and help wipe out the fog threat. this to occur in the 11 AM 2 PM window Tuesday (northern stations near 610 bridge in the earlier portion of that window, southern stations near the boarding station toward the end of the timeframe).
- Post 2 PM, anticipating improvements in visibility as winds will be shifted from the NW.

Forecast Discussion

Precip: Precip continues through the early morning hours until coverage become a bit more increased between 6 – 10 AM. After ~12PM, favoring dry conditions for the rest of the day. A few stronger storms with gusts 20-25+ knots cannot be ruled out.


Wind: Sustained winds out of the SSW at 10 – 15 kts with gusts of 15-20 kts (mainly near boarding station) before front moves through between 11 AM – 1 PM. After 1 PM, winds shift from the NW at 7 – 12 kts and last through the rest of the day.

Temps: High temperatures will be upper 60s F near the Boarding Station and lower 70s F for all other stations.

Forecast Discussion

Precip: Favoring a dry day for Wednesday.

Wind: Light westerly winds in the AM will be more sustained from the NW by 12 PM, and then veer from the north during the late evening (10 PM). Winds will be 7 – 11 kts from 9 AM – 4 PM across all stations. After 4 PM winds will subside to 4 – 7 kts. A few pockets of up to 11 kts will be possible at the Boarding Station and 11/12 from 5 PM – 12 AM. A few wind gusts of up to 18 kts will be possible north of Morgan's Point from 11 AM – 3 PM.


Temps: High temperatures Wednesday will be in the upper 60s F north of Morgan's Point and in the mid to lower 60s F south of Morgan's Point.




Precip: Anticipating a dry day for Thursday.

Wind: Westerly winds in the AM will become more Northwesterly by 5 AM and remain as such for the rest of the day. Winds will be in the 3 – 6 kt range for most of the day, with the exception of the 6 AM – 4 PM timeframe where winds will be slightly elevated at 8 – 12 kts.


Temps: High temperatures Thursday will be in the upper 60s F north of Morgan's Point and in the mid to lower 60s F south of Morgan's Point.



Wind Speed 11 AM CT



























- Rain chances today will give way to a drier end of the week. Eyeing Sunday Tuesday for next shot of more widespread rains. Above average temps favored to continue.
