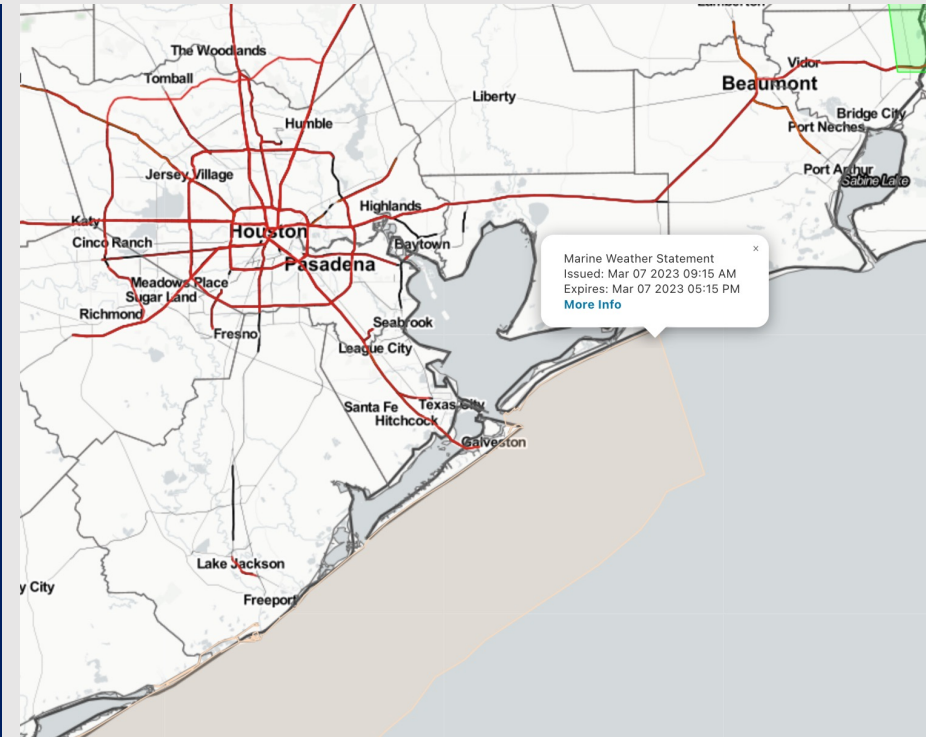

Weather Headlines

- Favoring low-end spotty shower chances across the area the next few days. Majority of areas look to stay dry.
- **Sea fog chances will continue for the majority of this week, extending out to at least the end of the week. Gradually warming water temps may aid in limiting this threat to more patchy vs. widespread.**
- Winds will stay rather light over the next three days with ranges staying within 5 – 15 kts.
- No wave height concerns over the next ~5 days.

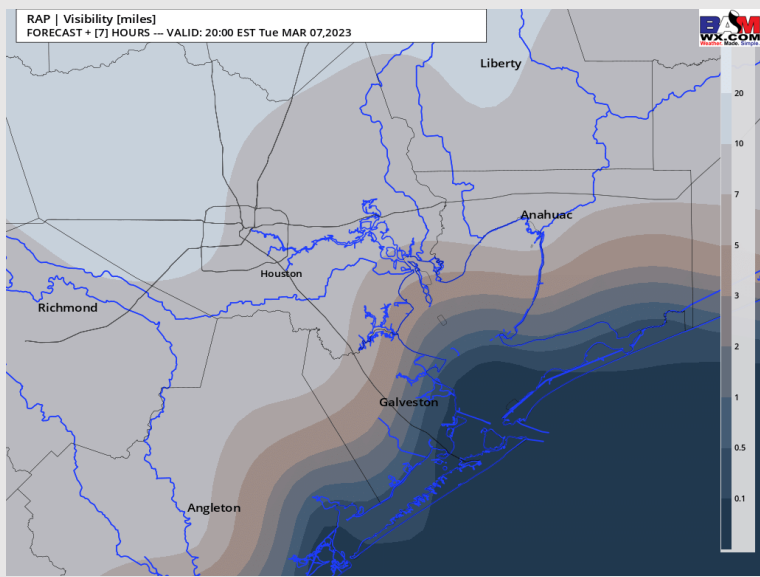

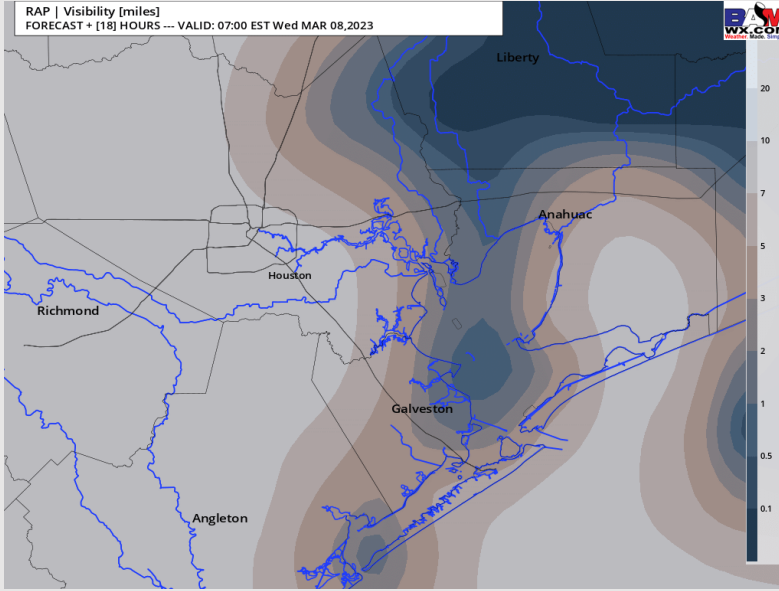

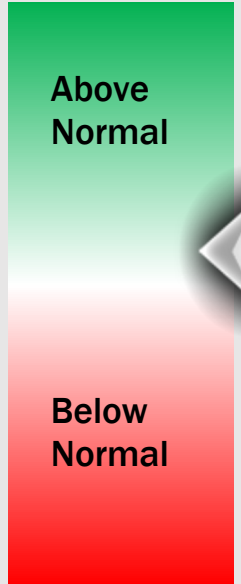
7 PM CT TUE VISIBILITY

TIMEFRAME DISCUSSED	THREAT
CURRENT - 8 AM WED	Low-Medium

- Lowered visibility down to a few miles (2-4 miles) cannot be ruled out at the boarding station.
- As we move closer to sundown, dense fog is not favored, but lowered visibilities down to a couple miles in spots south of Morgan's Point cannot be taken off the table. Model shown TUE evening is likely too widespread, but there is at least this risk to watch.
- As of this report, data (and our forecast) is for any patchy fog after Midnight through Wednesday AM to be isolated. Any location south of Morgan's Point would be at risk, however we think there can be more breaks/ visibility 4+ miles during this window vs. dense fog everywhere.
- Anticipating lowered visibilities to lift around the 6 - 8 AM timeframe Wednesday AM

Houston Pilots Extended Range Visibility Report



Friday 3/10/23

SE winds during the early morning hours look to shift from the SW approaching 10 AM. A weak front will try and work through the area, however latest data suggests it stalls near the coast and keeps fog chances around.



Sunday 3/12/23

S – SW winds throughout the day Sunday, however, low level saturation is expected to struggle to occur at this time.



Saturday 3/11/23

Northerly winds through Saturday AM before shifting to the S by the afternoon making sea fog development possible later Saturday evening.

Forecast Discussion

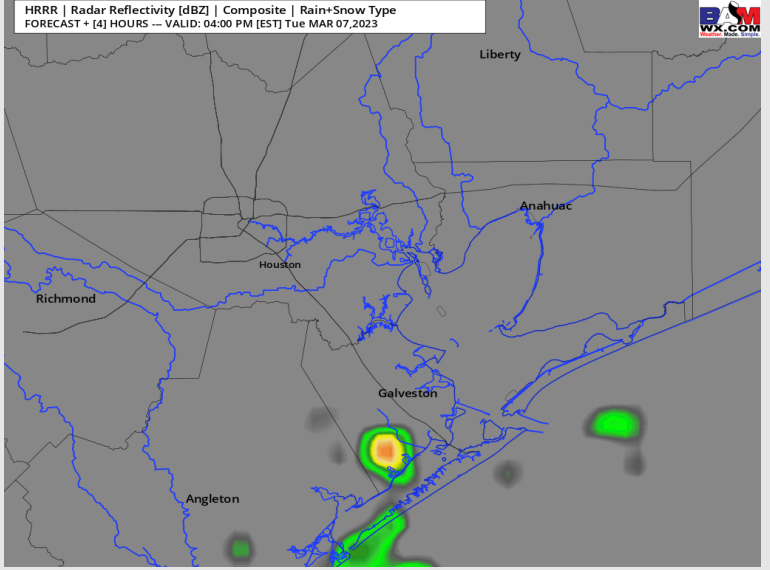
Precip: Very low end shower chances (10%) to linger around until 5 PM. Expect a mainly dry day.

Wind: Sustained winds be from the S to SSE for the entire day Tuesday. Winds at 8 – 13 knots and remain as such for the rest of the day at the boarding station.

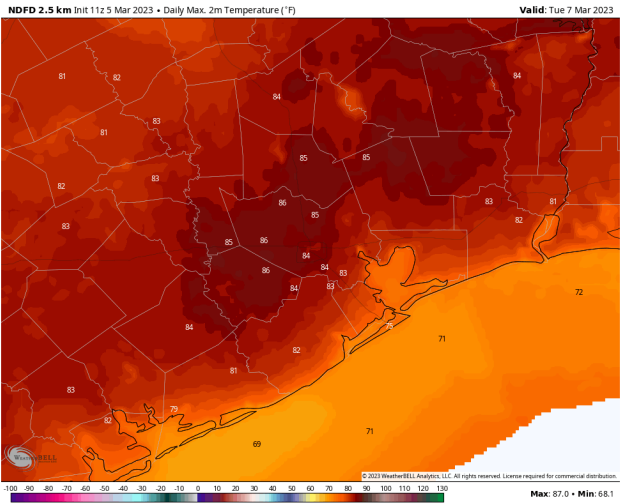
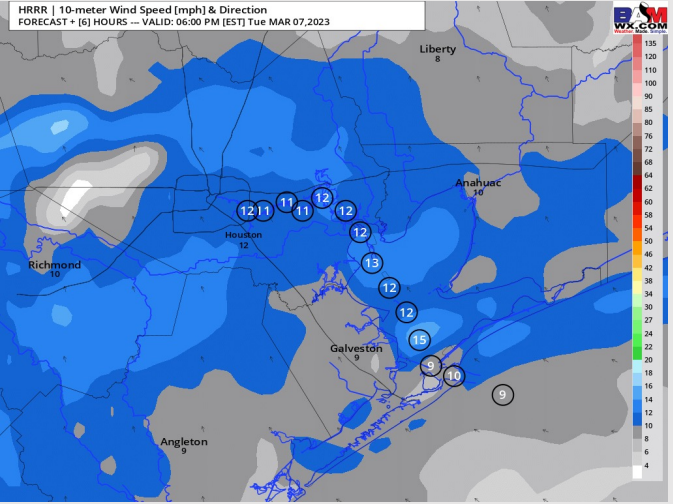
Temps: Low temperatures for Wednesday AM expected to be near 70 F across all stations.

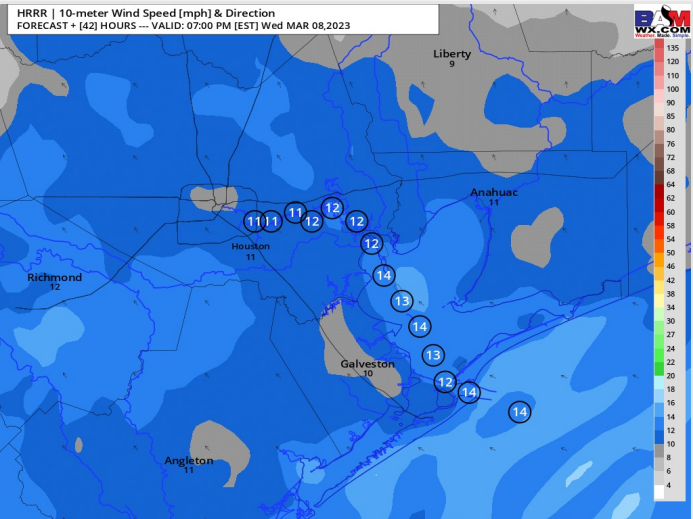
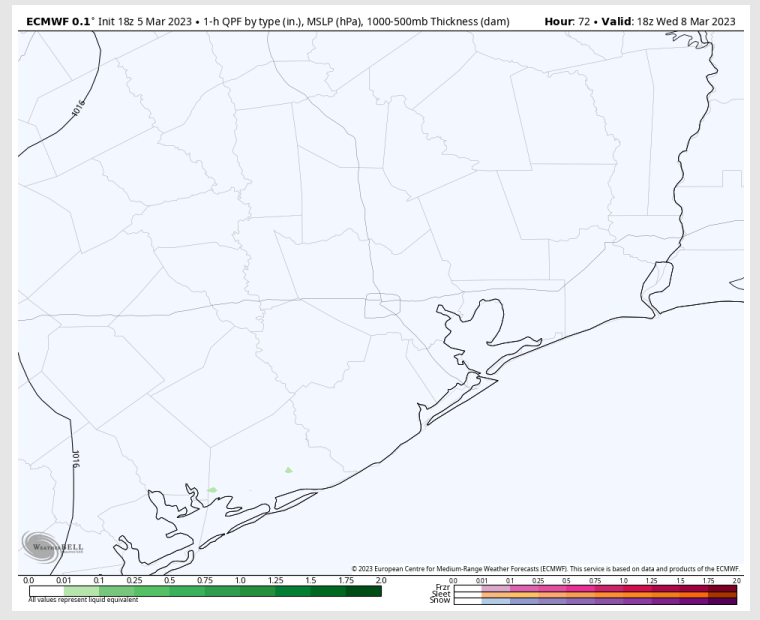

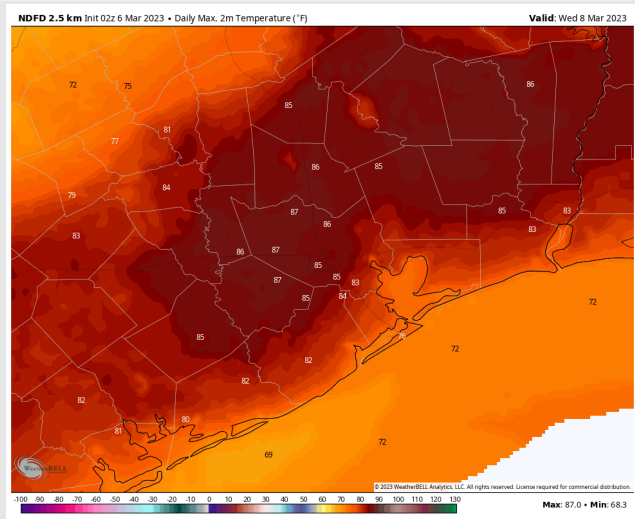
Forecast Discussion

- Precip:** Favoring dry conditions throughout the day Wednesday.
- Wind:** Sustained winds will be out of the SE all day. Winds will be at 5 – 11 kts across all stations through ~5 PM before becoming 8-13 knots sustained.
- Temps:** High temperatures Wednesday will be in the mid to lower 70s F stations south of Morgan’s Point and near 80s F for stations north of Morgan’s Point.
- Visibility:** Sea fog threat continues to remain possible with SE winds. Tuesday night into Wednesday AM will be another window to watch for fog (details in fog slides above).

Forecast Discussion

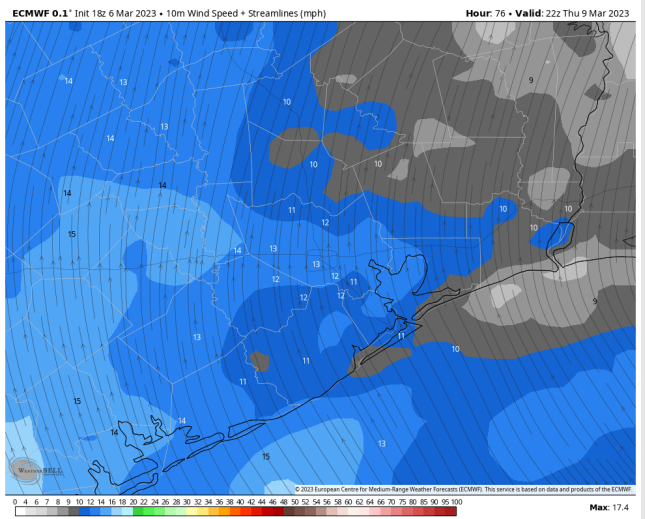
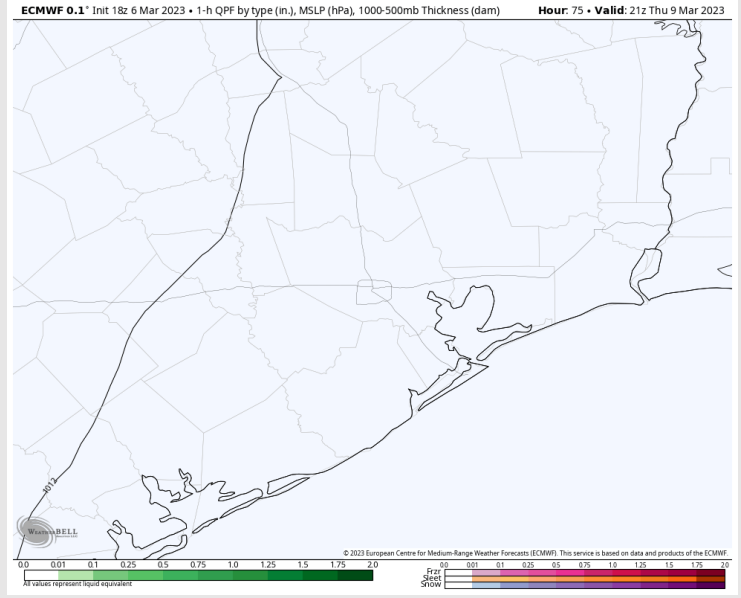
Precip: Anticipating dry conditions throughout the day Thursday.

Wind: Winds will generally be out of the SE - SSE. Winds will primarily stay within 4 – 10 kts for stations north of Morgan’s Point and 8 -13 kts for stations south of Morgan’s Point through out the day Thursday. There will be a brief window of 20 kts gusts for stations north of Morgan’s Point from 12 - 4 PM.

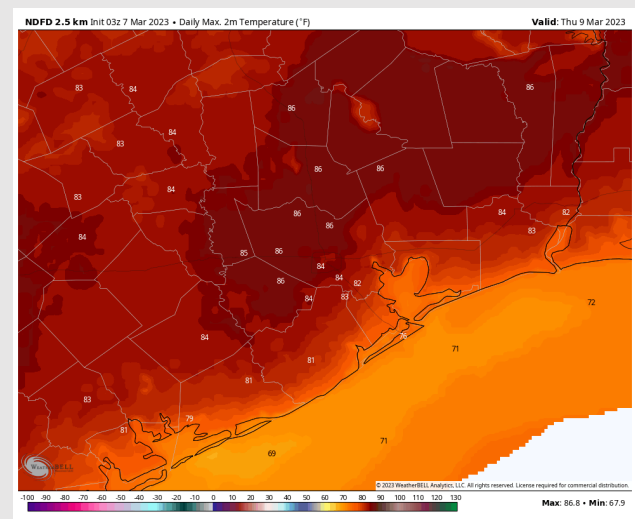
Temps: High temperatures Thursday will be in the mid 80s F north of Morgan’s Point and in the mid to lower 70s F south of Morgan’s Point.

Visibility: Sea fog threat remains possible on Thursday.

Houston Pilots: 3/7/23



- Anticipating drier conditions through the rest of the week, moisture looks to work in towards next Monday. Temperatures are expected to be above normal over the next seven days.
- Expecting above normal precipitation chances and below normal temperatures extending into the week 2 timeframe.
- Anticipating normal temperatures and above normal chances for precipitation favored in the week 3/4 timeframe.
