

Forecast Discussion

Precip: Isolated chances of a light, pop up shower will exist through the late morning hours, with better potential for pop up storm after 2PM-CT through 10PM-CT. Any cells will be capable of a briefly locally heavy downpour, lightning, and very isolated increase in winds.


Wind: Winds pre-9 AM will be out of the ENE at 4-7 kts for stations north of Morgan's point and for stations south of Morgan's point will be out of the ESE at 8–13 kts. From 9AM–2PM, winds come out of the ENE for stations north of Morgan's point at 5–8 kts while stations south of Morgan's point will have winds out of the SE at 8 – 10 kts. From 2 PM and on, winds are back out of the SE at 6 - 11 kts for most stations. After 3PM stations south of Morgan's point with sustained winds of 9-14kts with gusts to 20 kts. Isolated thunderstorms could produce gusts 25-30 knots *if* caught under one of those cells.


Temps: High temperatures in the low 80s F for stations south of Morgan's Point and in the upper 80s F for stations north of Morgan's Point.

Visibility: Not anticipating visibility concerns at this time.

Forecast Discussion


Precip: A 20% chance for a popup will be possible from 3 -8 PM. Greatest potential expected to remain north of majority of stations. Lightning / brief downpour can't be ruled out if impacted directly.

Wind: Sustained winds will be from the SE for the entire day. Winds sit 3-7 knots in the AM hours. By 4pm stations north of Morgan's point will have winds of 5-10 knots out of the E while stations south of Morgan's points will have winds of 4-8 knots out of the SE. Winds after 8pm CT will pick up south of Morgan's point and be 8-11 knots out of the S.


Temps: High temperatures near 80 F at the Boarding Station and in the upper 80s to near 90 F across all other stations.


Visibility: Not anticipating any visibility concerns at this time.

Forecast Discussion


Precip: A 10% chance of an isolated pop up can't be ruled out from 4PM-7PM, but overall conditions look dry for all stations for Thursday.

Wind: Winds of 3-6kts will be variable as a system exits the region through the AM hours to 4PM-CT. Winds will fully shift out of the south at 4-8kts for the duration of the afternoon into the late evening.


Temps: High temperatures will be in the upper 80s F / lower 90's north of Morgan's Point and in the mid to upper 70s south of Morgan's Point.



Wind Speed: 5 PM CT











Next 7 Day Temperature Departure






8-14 Day Temperature Departure
