

- Tropical Storm Harold has made landfall and continues to impact SE Texas coast.
 Maximum wave heights of up to 6' will continue through about 2 PM.
- Scattered showers and storms will continue to be possible as a result of the outer bands associated with Tropical Storm Harold through this evening.
- A few minor precipitation chances exists later into the week with limited wind issues.


- > Data continues to maintain 6' wave height potential associated with Tropical Storm Harold for the boarding station. The nearby buoy has already reported some significant wave heights near 6.2 feet in the past couple hours.
- The timing most at risk to see these increased wave heights would be through 2 PM TUE. The boarding station is at greatest risk to see these wave heights. ALL OTHER STATIONS WILL REMAIN WELL BELOW 6' THRESHOLD WITH HIGH CONFIDENCE.
- Tropical Storm Harold has made landfall in southern Texas, and will continue to advance westward toward the Rio Grande.

Current thinking is the risk of 6' drops off around 2 PM where we will lift the Zulu threshold. As of the latest data, we continue to favor this time range for impacts.

Forecast Discussion


Precip: Scattered Storm Chances of 40% will continue through 5PM, before majority of activity slides more to the south / chances becoming 20% after 5PM for all stations.

Wind: ESE winds continue through the PM hours with sustained winds around 20-24 knots for the boarding station with gusts near 25-30 knots. For stations between Morgan's Point and the boarding Station, sustained winds of 15-20 knots with gusts up to 25 knots. For locations north of Morgan's Point, winds will maintain at 9-12 knots through 9PM. Winds will steadily weaken to 4-8 knots into the late evening as we lose influence from Harold. By 4 PM, winds south of Morgan's Point are expected to be sustained around 15-18 knots with gusts near 20 knots. By 9 PM, sustained winds at the boarding station are expected to be sustained around 12-15 knots with gusts to 18 knots with weaker winds expected north of the boarding station.


High Temps: Low Temps expected to be in the mid 80's F over open waters with low temperatures in the lower 80's / upper 70's for Wednesday AM.


Visibility: Brief Periods of reduced visibility near the Boarding Station associated with heaviest downpours.

Forecast Discussion

Precip: Mostly dry conditions with isolated (20%) chances during the afternoon and evening from 3 PM - 10 PM.


Wind: For the boarding station, winds will be out of the SE WED before shifting to out of the NE by 8 - 9 AM. After 9AM, winds will gradually veer until out of the S/SW for the rest of the day. Winds N of Morgan's Point will be 2-7kts through 4 PM before increasing to 5-10kts the rest of the day. S of Morgan's Point, winds will decrease from 8-13 kts to 2-7kts by 6 AM and remain there until 4 PM. After 4 PM, winds increase to 9-14 knots for the rest of the day.

High Temps: S of Morgan's Point: Low 90s F. N of Morgan's Point: Upper 90s/Near 100 F.

Visibility: Not anticipating any fog issues at this time.

Forecast Discussion


Precip: Dry conditions anticipated on Thursday with only a mention of something isolated in the afternoon (10%)

Wind: Winds will start out of the W/SW in the early morning before veering to out of the NW by 6-7 AM. After 1 PM, winds will gradually shift to being out of the SW by 5 PM and continue there the rest of the evening. Winds North of Morgan's Point will be 3-8 kts the entire day. Winds South of Morgan's Point will be 7-12 kts throughout the entire day outside of a slight decrease to 4-9kts from 11 AM – 3 PM.


