Houston Pilots Visibility Chart (miles)




Forecast Discussion

Precip: Watching for a south diving cluster of storms near the 4 – 8 PM timeframe tonight, though confidence is much lower now due to Eastward trends on models. Wind gusts of 34 – 52 Knots would not be fully ruled out with a system like this, if it comes to fruition.

Wind: Winds for all Stations will generally be out of the SSW, sustained around **11-15** kts for the remainder of the day. If storms come to fruition in the timeframe mentioned above, winds can shift out of the NE and have the potential of producing gusts of 34-52 kts. However, this remains a very low confidence forecast.


Low Temps: S of Morgan's Point: Low80s F. N of Morgan's Point: Mid to upper 70s F.


Forecast Discussion

Precip: The storm cluster mentioned for Sunday will impact precipitation chances into Monday, once again making Monday a low confidence forecast. Additional "waves" will continue to be possible MON morning from around 6 AM – 10 AM, as well as the afternoon from roughly 3 PM – 7 PM. These storms tomorrow will also have the potential to produce wind gusts of 34 – 52 Knots, mainly the afternoon wave. Isolated chances possible after 7 PM in addition.

Wind: The above storm systems makes for a tricky wind forecast as well, as these storm systems will impact wind direction/ speeds. Any storms that pass can shift the winds more out of the north in their wake. Outside of storm induced wind shifts, SSW winds are expected to weaken into the AM around 3 – 8 knots for stations south of Morgan's Point by 7 AM with lighter winds to the north. Afternoon winds south of Morgan's point generally remain in the 3-8 kt range, with occasional pulses of 5-10 kt winds. Winds likely start to become variable/ light as a cold front approaches towards the midnight timeframe.




Forecast Discussion

Precip: A cold front lingering around the HOU area will keep minor precipitation chances at play into TUE although the exact placement of where this front will be remains somewhat uncertain. Regardless, spotty showers/ storms look possible although not anticipating any severe weather.


Wind: Early TUE morning, a cold front is expected to pass which will usher in NE winds sustained around 3 - 7 knots. Winds are expected to gradually shift back out of the SE into the afternoon/ evening as the cold front drifts back to the northeast. Winds in the afternoon look to be sustained around 3 - 7 knots.





Visibility: No visibility concerns currently.








High Temps Tuesday

- The cold front mentioned on the MON slide will hang around the area providing for sporadic chances next week. Current thinking is the pattern starts to calm down heading into the weekend.
- Generally drier/ warmer than average temperatures are expected into the week 2 timeframe.
- Above normal temperatures and above normal chances for precipitation are favored in the weeks ³/₄ timeframe.
