

- Some pesky chances for sea fog will be possible heading into the weekend. Confidence is lower than desired.
- Active weather is anticipated from SAT PM into SUN PM.

Forecast Discussion


Precip: Currently favoring a dry day today. We will need to watch near midnight for minor chances of drizzle, but any rain should hold off until FRI.

Wind: ESE winds continue for the remainder of the day. N of Morgan's Point: Winds are favored to remain at 3 – 8 kts for duration of the day. S of Morgan's Point: Winds will weaken slowly into late afternoon becoming sustained around 8 – 13 knots by 7 PM. Gusts near 15 – 20 knots will be possible in the afternoon for furthest most S Stations and the Boarding station.


High Temps: N of Morgan's Point: Upper 50's F. S of Morgan's Point: 55 - 60 F


Visibility: Confidence is quite low on any potential sea fog for tomorrow. Most data does not show the "low visibilities". However, the set up is very border line. With a similar set up to yesterday and with available model data as of writing this report, would currently favor no fog. The risk is non-zero however, and trends will be monitored closely this PM.

Forecast Discussion


Precip: Spotty rain chances will be possible in the AM (20%). Better threats come after 2 – 3 PM for showers with a few moderate bursts (40%). In a scattered fashion, chances will linger through the evening, although some details on precise timing remain uncertain.

Wind: Sustained winds will be out of the SE throughout the day Friday. N Morgan's Point: 4 - 8 kts throughout much of the day Friday. S of Morgan's Point: Winds will generally be around 8 - 13 knots for much of the day. A few wind gusts of 14 - 17 knots will be possible in the afternoon hours.


High Temps: N of Morgan's Point: High 60s to 70s F S of Morgan's Point: Mid 60s F


Visibility: More discussion about fog FRI night into SAT AM on the following slide. It is worth noting that timing of showers complicate any potential fog as it can help to allow for rain vs straight fog.






TIMEFRAME THREAT DISCUSSED 3 PM FRI - 12 PM SAT

MED

- We need to watch FRI evening into SAT AM for Sea Fog Potential.
- A spotty, nonzero risk after 3 PM FRI for fog for stations between Morgan's Point and the Boarding Station (very low confidence)
- The threat will be on the increase into the evening, especially after 7 PM FRI. After 12 AM SAT through 10 AM will hold the highest threat/ risk for all stations. Patchy Sea Fog can linger thereafter but approaching rain/ storms greatly complicate matters/ reduce sea fog threat.
- The set up into SAT AM is certainly better vs last night and tonight. Confidence is lower on precise details at this distance however.

Forecast Discussion


Precip: Scattered showers will continue to be possible in the AM. However, it is into the afternoon, especially after 5 PM where storms and heavier pockets of rain come into the picture. Once again, confidence is lower than desired on precise details

Wind: Winds will be out of the SE/ESE throughout the day. N of Morgan's Point: Winds will start out at 5 - 10 kts before increasing to 9 - 14 kts by after 7 PM. Stronger winds possible under storms. S of Morgan's Point: Winds will start out around 8 - 13 knots before sustained winds increase to around 13 - 17 knots after 4 PM. Winds gusts of 20 - 25 kts will be possible after 6PM for stations S of Morgan's Point. Stronger wind gusts cannot be ruled out under storms


High Temps: N of Morgan's Point: Low 70's F. S of Morgan's Point: mid 60's F.


Visibility: The set up for sea fog will continue into Saturday, especially in the AM (info on previous slide) and heading into the evening. The large complicating factor to sea fog will be storms around the area. However, where there are breaks in storm, instances of sea fog cannot be ruled out.

Wind Speed: 9 PM CT










- > SAT evening through SUN PM will offer up widespread, and at times heavy, rainfall opportunities.

 Above normal temperatures are expected until colder air fill behind a cold front after Monday.
- Cooler temperatures and above normal moisture chances are at play for the week 2 timeframe.
- > Below normal temperatures and near normal chances for precipitation are favored in the weeks 3/4 timeframe. There is a risk this can trend wetter given an active subtropical jet.
